GENERAL BERNARD C. FREYBERG

GENERAL FREYBERG IS ONE OF THE MOST PICTURESQUE FIGURES TO EMERGE FROM WORLD WAR No. 1. HIS FEATS OF VALOR IN THAT WAR READ ALMOST LIKE FICTION. NOW, AS COMMANDER OF THE NEW ZEALAND FORCES OF GREAT BRITAIN, HE IS ONE OF THE GREAT HEROES OF WORLD WAR No. 2.



Though born in London, on March 21, 1889, Bernard Cyril Freyberg was taken to New Zealand at the early age of 2.

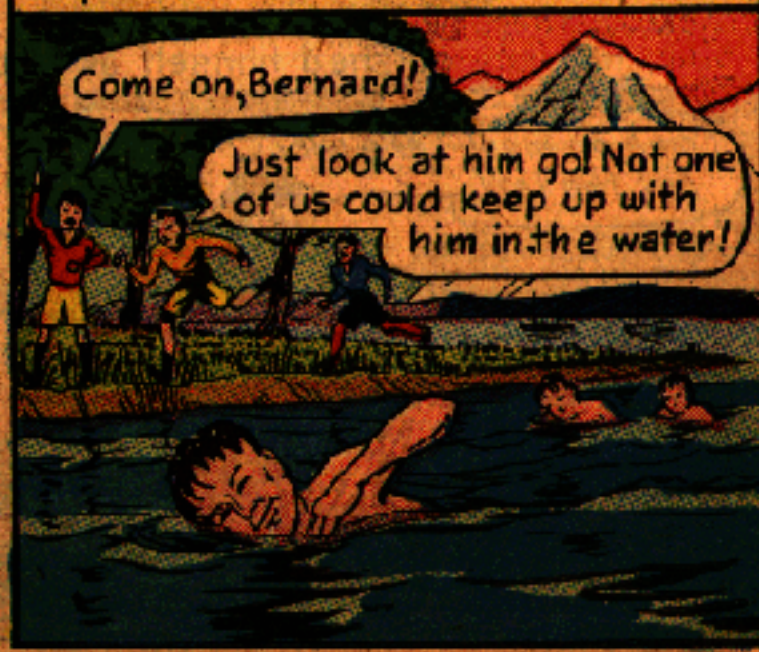
What a marvelous country!



As a child, Bernard developed into a powerful and expert swimmer.

Come on, Bernard!

Just look at him go! Not one of us could keep up with him in the water!



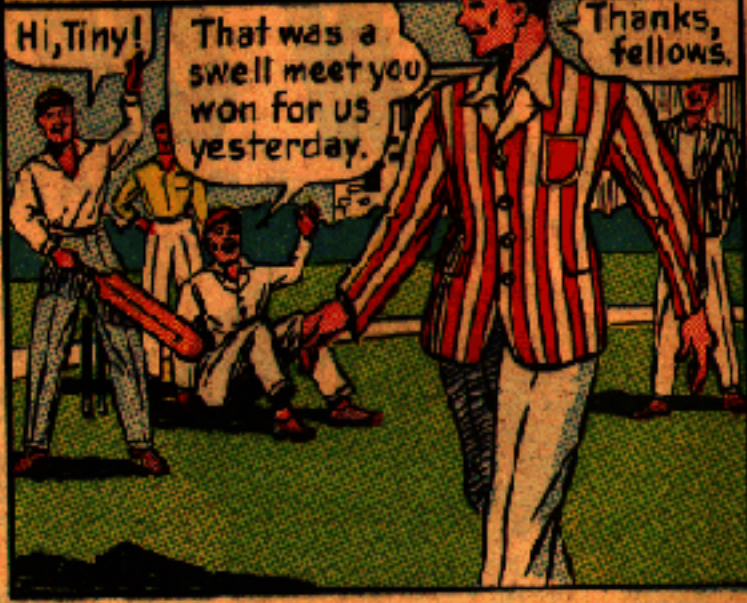
We also became an excellent boxer.

Freyberg attended Wellington College, N.Z. He was named "Tiny" because of his size...

What are you doing after graduation, Tiny?

I'd like a military career. I've applied for admission to the Staff College in England.

Freyberg was accepted and later graduated from the Staff College.



I'm joining the forces in India. What are you going to do, Tiny?

New Zealand for me. I've applied for a position there.

Freyberg did not like the monotony of peacetime training in New Zealand. He went to Mexico, where he joined the rebel army of Pancho Villa. He distinguished himself as a courageous soldier.



Come on, men! Let's wipe out the lot!

The gringo is one good soldier.

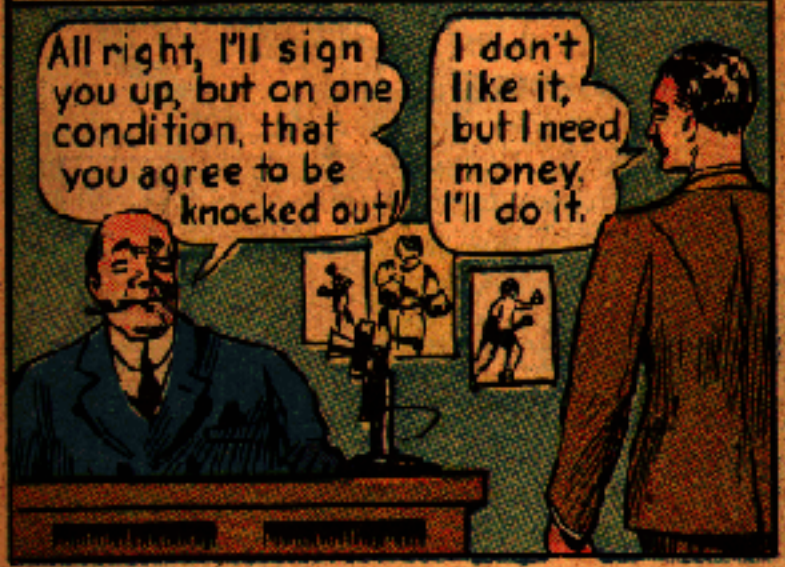
When World War No.1 broke out, Freyberg, who had studied dentistry by mail, was practising in Los Angeles, California.



Just what I've been waiting for! I must get to England!

EXTRA! EXTRA! WAR DECLARED!

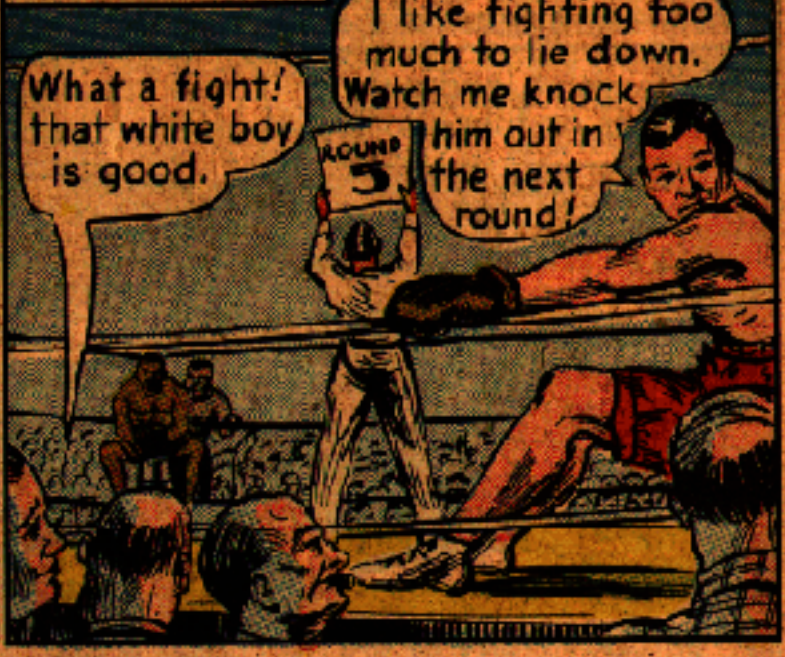
Freyberg had enough money to get to New York, but not enough to reach England. In New York he approached a local boxing promoter for a fight.



All right, I'll sign you up, but on one condition, that you agree to be knocked out!

I don't like it, but I need money. I'll do it.

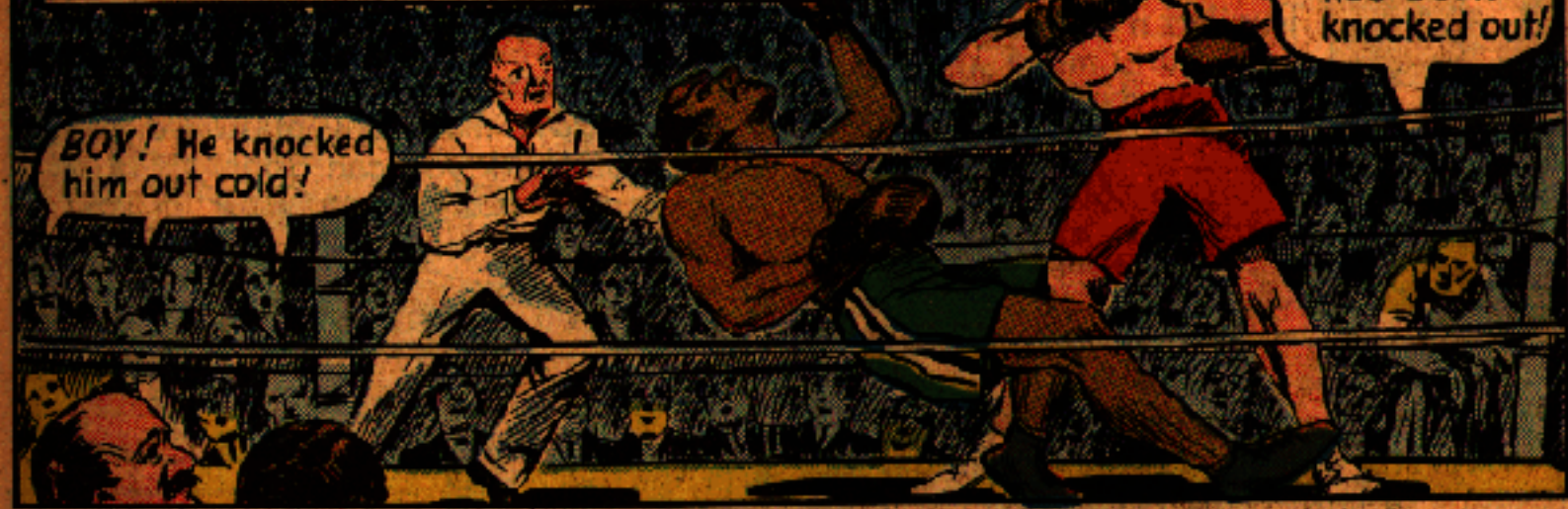
That night, in a local arena in New York...



What a fight! That white boy is good.

I like fighting too much to lie down. Watch me knock him out in the next round!

With the sound of the bell, Freyberg started a savage attack — Suddenly, a smashing blow to the chin...



BOY! He knocked him out cold!

It's the first time that boy has been knocked out!

Freyberg made enough money from this fight to get to England. In London he waylaid Winston Churchill, then 1st Lord of the Admiralty.



I'm a trained soldier, sir, and wish to serve my country. I demand that you give me a commission!

Churchill looked at him intently. He liked his appearance, his spirit, and impertinence. Suddenly Churchill smiled.



Very well, young man, you shall have your commission.

Thank you, sir. You shall not regret it!

In 1915, as a lieutenant commander in the Hood Battalion of the Royal Naval Reserves, fighting the Turks in the Dardanelles, Freyberg attended a staff officers' conference.



We must land our troops on this shore.

But the Turks command all the approaches with their guns!

We'll land some troops on the other shore to draw the Turks' fire, while we land our main force where we wish.



But many of our troops will be cut down when the Turks open fire on them!

True, but we will save many more lives on the other shore!

Then Freyberg made an astonishing suggestion!

Let me swim the Straits myself, sir, light flares on the opposite beach with the same effect as the troops would make, and save the lives of all those men.

BY JOVE! A bully plan! Do you think you can do it?

I can try, sir.



Freyberg, his body dark-stained, sat off, towing a waterproof bag containing oil flares, calcium lights, a knife and revolver.



You're on your own now, good luck!

Thank you, sir, cheerio!

Freyberg reached shore and lit his first flare.



Now to swim up 300 yards and light another!

The Turks, fearing a British attack, opened a terrific bombardment.



That's that! Are you going to be surprised, Johnny Turk!

Meanwhile on the opposite shore...



He did it! An astounding feat of courage! Order the troops to land as arranged!

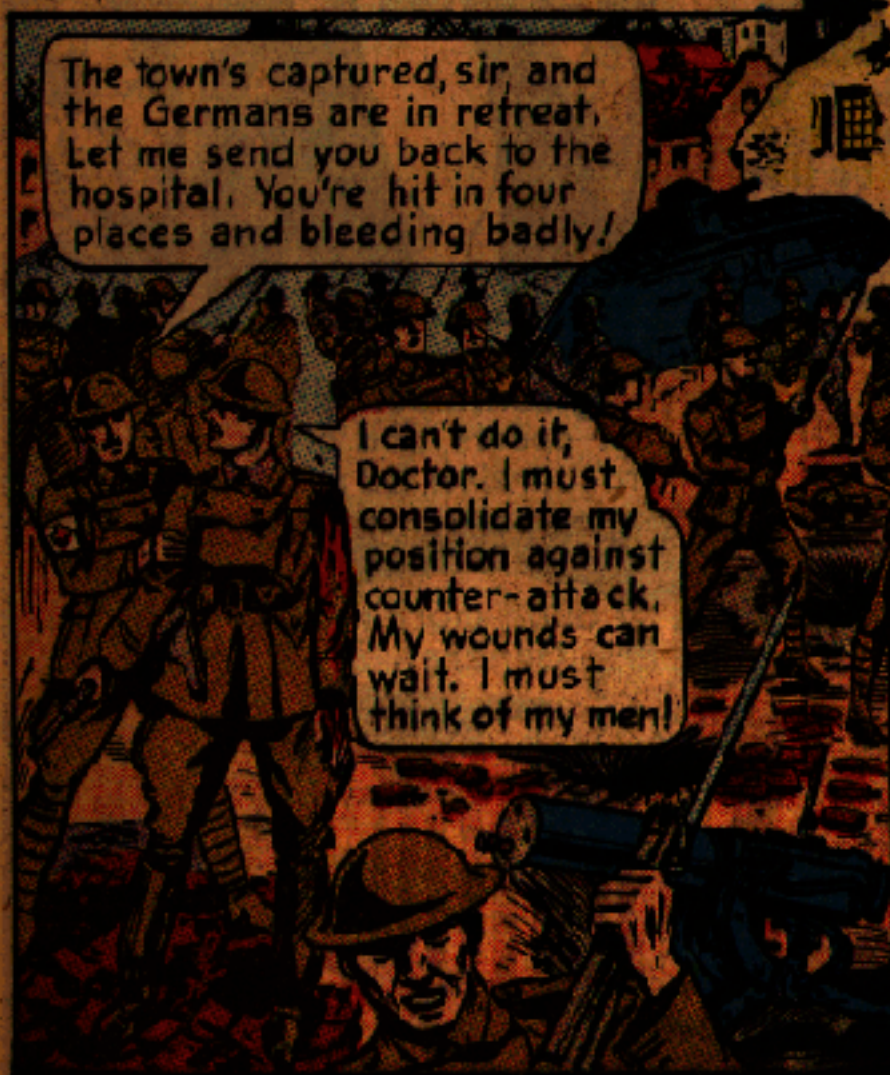
Freyberg was transferred to France, where he rose steadily in rank. In November, 1916, near the town of Beaucourt...



Take the town with your Marine Force. We need it to protect our line. I depend on you, Freyberg!

It shall be done, sir.

The town's captured, sir, and the Germans are in retreat. Let me send you back to the hospital. You're hit in four places and bleeding badly!



I can't do it, Doctor. I must consolidate my position against counter-attack. My wounds can wait. I must think of my men!

Freyberg swam back in pitch darkness, and was not picked up until 3 a.m.



Well done, old man, are you all right?

Yes, how did it go off?

Excellent. Our troops landed without a casualty. You'll get the Distinguished Service Order for this!

As a result of his ruse, the Turks were kept guessing, while the real landing took place elsewhere.

In one of the most savage hand-to-hand attacks of the entire war, the village was captured, and 500 German prisoners taken.



For his bravery and courage in the attack, Freyberg received the Victoria Cross.

If anyone ever deserved this highest honor for bravery, you did, Freyberg. My heartiest congratulations.



Freyberg continued to rise steadily in rank, and in June, 1917, at the age of 28, was promoted to Brigadier General. One day...



I must investigate the Brigade's left flank, something seems to be wrong.

But, sir, there is only one road leading there, and the enemy is shelling it!

Undaunted, Freyberg mounted a bicycle, and pedaled down the road, under heavy fire.



Well I'll be...! Here comes the General on a bicycle!

What a man!

He reorganized the position of his troops and pedaled back.



There he goes back again on the bicycle, as cool as a cucumber!

I'd follow him anywhere, because I know he'd be there to set everything straight.

By the end of the war, Freyberg had been wounded 9 times, mentioned in dispatches to the King 6 times, won three decorations, and a knighthood. In 1921, he was given a year's leave to recuperate from his wounds.



Where to now General?

I've decided to take a trip around the world.

Returning to London, in 1922, he married Barbara daughter of Col. Sir Herbert Jekyll.



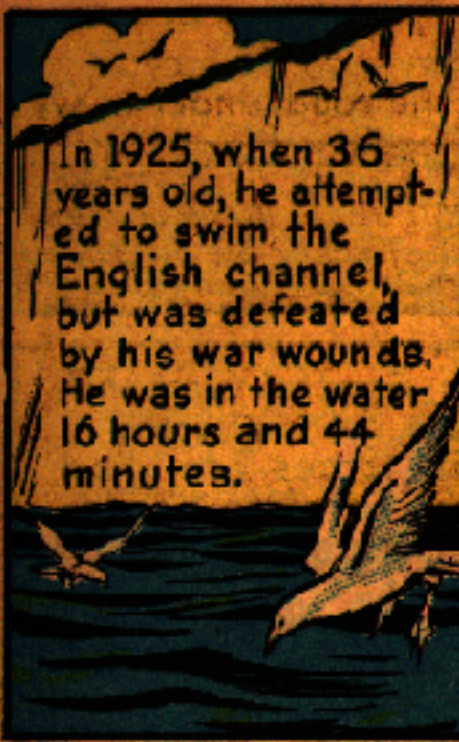
what a handsome couple!

Freyberg continued all his active outdoor sports, and often used to walk to London, 22 miles away.



Good morning, General.

In 1925, when 36 years old, he attempted to swim the English channel, but was defeated by his war wounds. He was in the water 16 hours and 44 minutes.



Come on, Tiny, only 500 yards to go!

Everything is going black. [...].

He's collapsed, Pull him out quickly!



When World War No. 2 started, General Freyberg was called out of retirement to command the New Zealand Expeditionary Force.



General Freyberg is the man we need to lead our troops. Send for him immediately.



General Freyberg's appointment as commander of the New Zealand Empire troops was enthusiastically approved by the men.



Freyberg organized the New Zealand expeditionary forces, and brought them safely to Suez, in Egypt.

Egypt at last! Now to see some action!

Meanwhile, General Graziani's Italian forces, outnumbering the Imperial forces 7 to 1, had crossed the Egyptian border, menacing Suez and the Empire's "lifeline" itself.



New Zealand troops, with other Imperial and British units, fought in the brilliant Libyan campaign, rolling back the Italian army in the first British "Blitz" of the war.



New Zealand troops were sent from Egypt, to help the heroic Greek Army. After a terrific rear guard battle, the Allies evacuated to Crete.



When the British retreated to Crete, after the battle for Greece, Freyberg was placed in command on the island.



With General Freyberg leading us we'll give the Jerries a warm reception!



The Germans attacked Crete by air. Thousands of parachute troops rained down on the island and fierce hand-to-hand fighting took place. General Freyberg was everywhere, encouraging the troops to stand firm.



We must hold Crete at all costs!

Finally, German air supremacy won out, and the British were forced to leave the island.

We must leave now, but we'll be back! This is the beginning of a new story, and not the end of an old one!

This is the man who is leading the New Zealand forces in the Near East today. Watch him, for he is a man of action!

Do you, Annie Oakley, take this man...



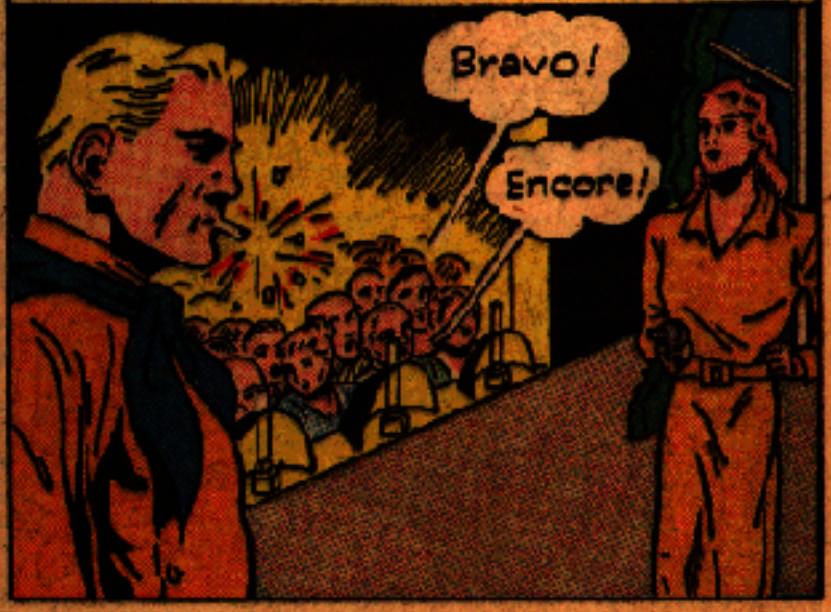

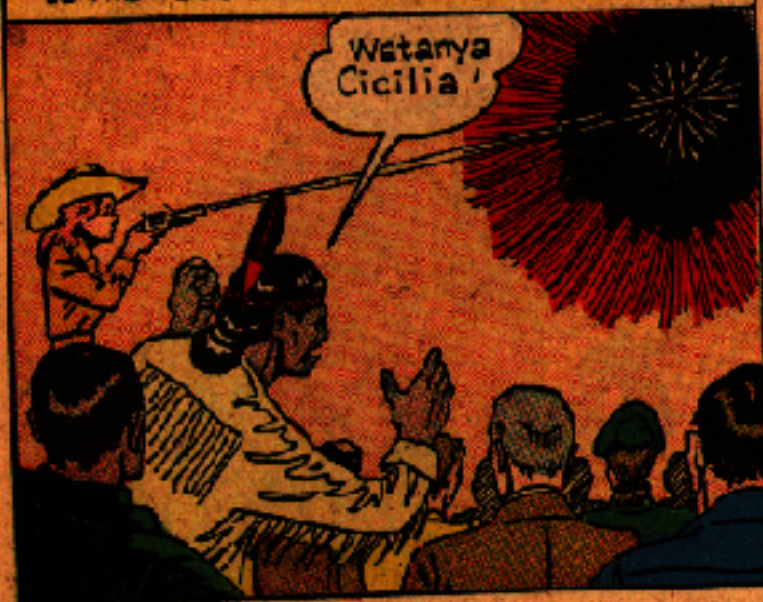


ANOTHER was to split a playing card edgewise, at thirty paces!

SHE could hit a dime tossed in the air. One night in St. Paul, an Indian rose to his feet and shouted in admiration.



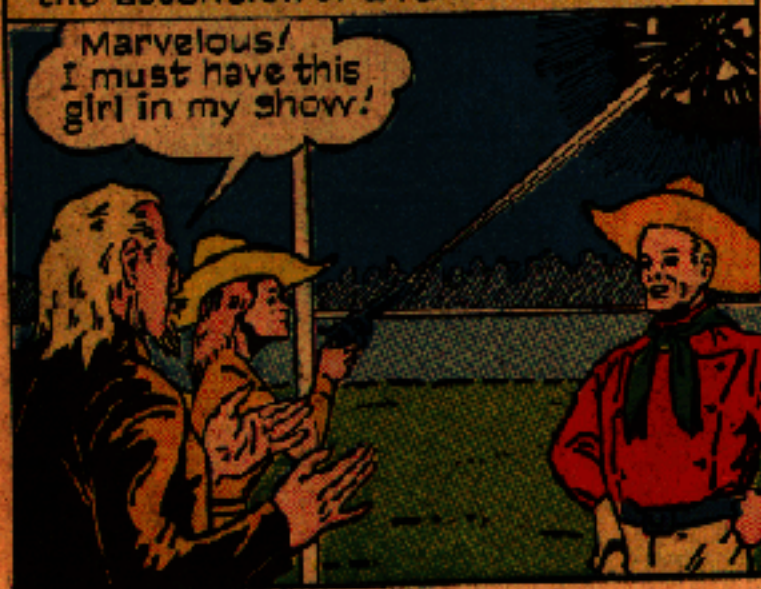
THE Indian came backstage to meet Annie. He was famous, too!

AFTER the show Annie was presented to Queen Victoria.

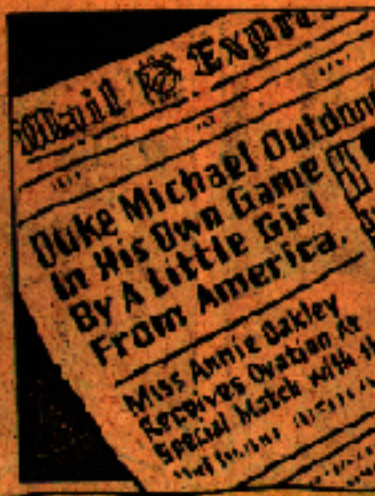
You are a very, very clever little girl!

Bring the girl to me!



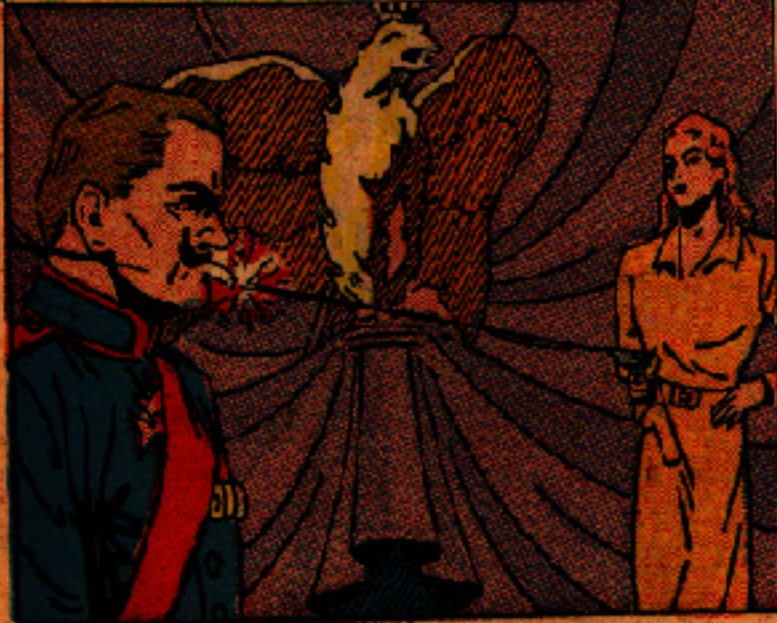
Can you shoot a cigarette from my mouth?

Your name will live after you, Miss Oakley.

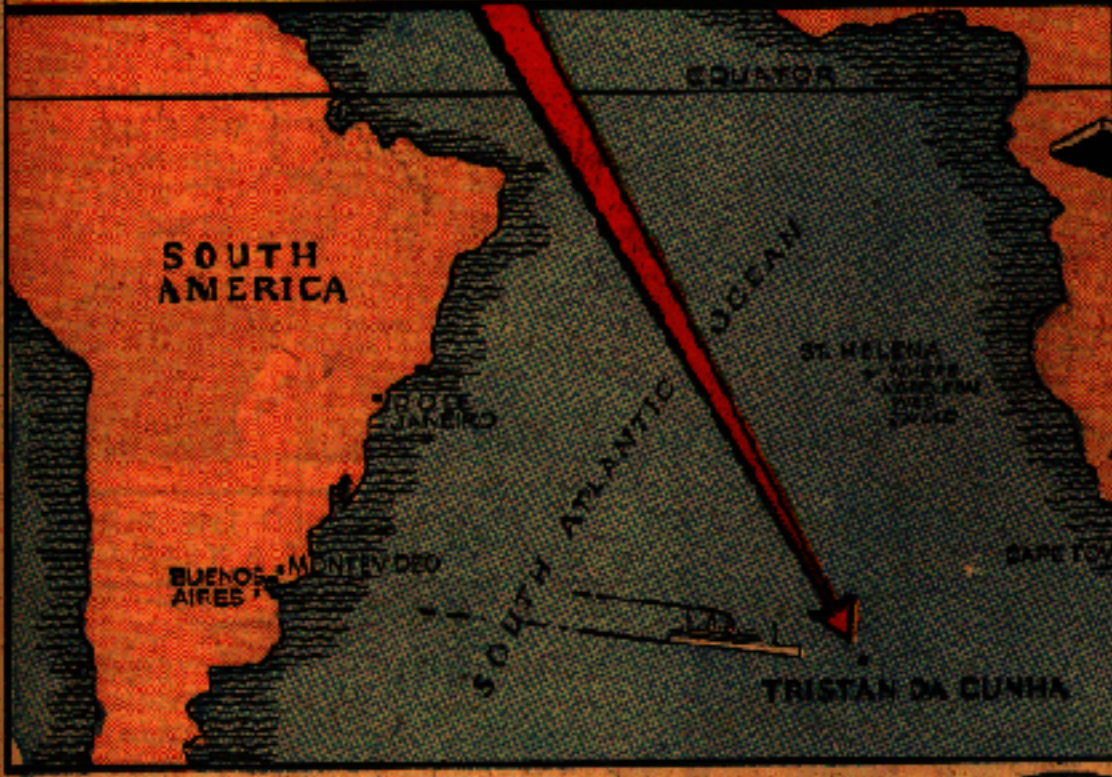

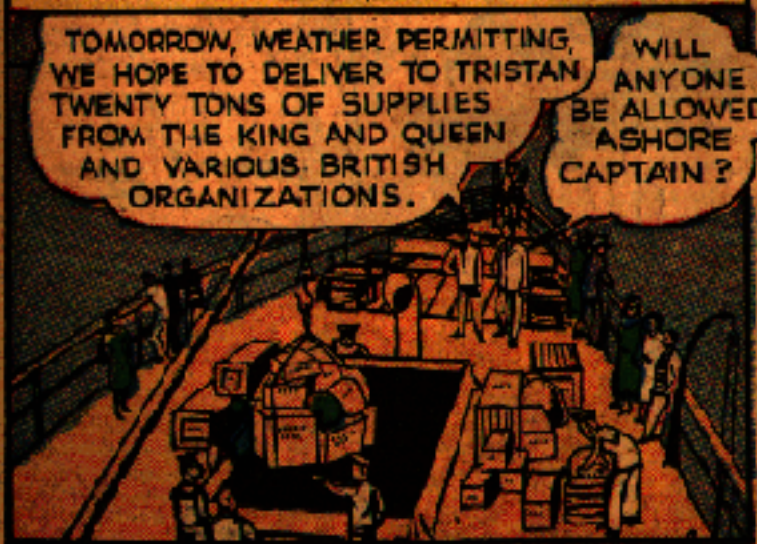

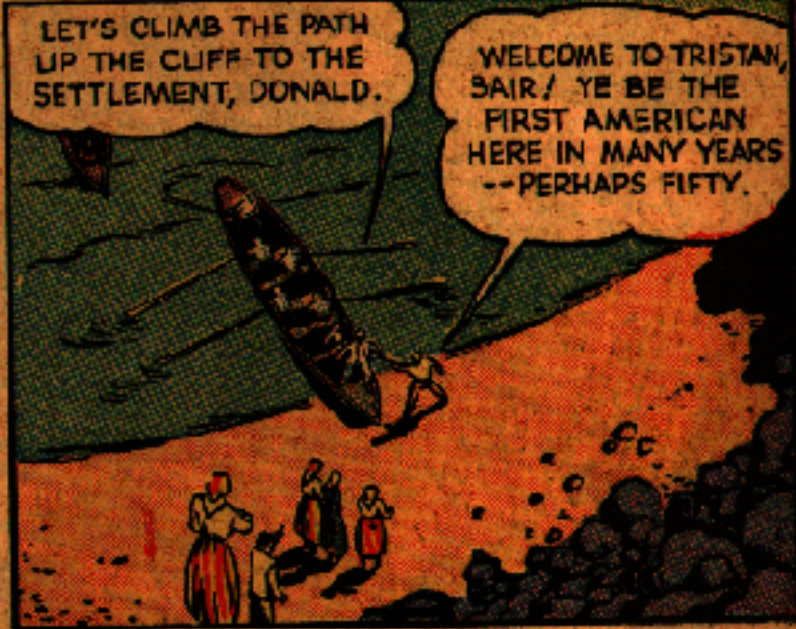

NOTES FROM DONALD'S STORY OF TRISTAN DA CUNHA:



1816 - First settlement - Corporal Glas came from England with an artillery platoon to prevent possible French landing on route to rescue Napoleon from exile on St. Helena Island.

1821 - After Napoleon's death, garrison was allowed to return home, but Glas with his wife and two soldiers, got permission to remain.

Short time later - wrecked sailors drifted ashore and joined settlement.

300 years later - Mutineers marooned on Tristan, were welcomed by settlers.

1857 - Island bachelors asked a passing captain to bring them wives. The captain jokingly agreed, brought several women and married them to the lonely settlers. Thus the Tristan population increased, a mixture of English, Scotch, Irish, Italian, American and African ancestry.

1853 - Glas died. Peter Green, famous for having in shipwreck rescue, was leader until 1902.

1885 - All but two of 20 grown men were drowned in an attempt to reach a ship in a severe storm.

Since 1900 - Annual visits of Admiralty supply ships have been stopped. Fewer whalers and sealers call.

Tristan had become more and more isolated -- The struggle for food and the fight for mere existence, had increased. Very little live-stock -- because of scarcity of vegetation.

Fish and potatoes are sometimes the only food -- in small quantity.

Occasional sea-lions, sharks, and whales are killed for meat and skins.

Yearly boat trips are made to the uninhabited NIGHTINGALE and INACCESSIBLE Islands to collect eggs from penguins, noddies, stormy petrels and albatross nesting there in thousands.

Driftwood is the only available lumber. Houses for the thirty families are built of loose stones and thatch.

In spite of hardships, the people of Tristan love their island home and refuse opportunities to leave.

What You Can Do to Aid in the NATIONAL DEFENSE

America will be strong only if every individual helps to make it so.
Here are twelve important ways you can do your important part

AMERICA is in greater danger today than at any time during its splendid history. The Nazi plan for world domination threatens our very existence as a nation and our survival as a free people. The utmost effort of everyone is required if we are to build up the strongest possible national defense.

National defense is not a matter to be left to the President and Congress. Everyone can do his or her part. Hundreds of thousands of young men are now serving in the Army and the Navy. Others are working long hours in defense industries. And there are many, many things, which adults and boys and girls can do at home to help in the national defense.

If our Army and Navy are to be effective, they must have healthy, well-organized communities behind them. Community strength, therefore, must be built in every city and town and village in the land. Communities can be strong only if their men and women, boys and girls help to make them so.

Here are some of the many ways you can help to make your community strong and aid in the national defense.

(1) *Help at home.* During these times everyone is so extraordinarily busy that you may consider everyday chores unimportant. But they are a real contribution. When you give a hand in such things as making beds, washing dishes, cleaning, caring for small children, you give others in your household more time for additional duties. Repairing home

equipment is not only a service, but a way of maintaining a safe home. It is also a means of saving money—particularly important at a time when prices and taxes are rising.

(2) *Help in the community.* There are many things you can do in helping to meet local needs and thereby strengthen the entire nation. Making and repairing toys for children who otherwise would have none; collecting books to be sent to hospitals or to Army camps; taking part in community entertainments; developing community gardens, or even just a small plot in your backyard; working for the Community Chest—each of these things is a very real part of the general defense. Possibly you will find you can do them more efficiently; and get more fun out of them (they can be fun as well as service!) if you do them through a community organization. Such organizations as the Boy Scouts and the 4-H Clubs have extensive programs for community activities that offer many opportunities for service and enjoyment. Find out from its local representatives how you can most effectively cooperate in projects of the Office of Civilian Defense.

(3) *Learn to give first aid.* It is important for everyone to know what to do in case of accident, and how to do it. The American Red Cross gives such training as well as training in home nursing, life saving, and nutrition.

(4) *Keep healthy.* The nation's strength depends on the health of all the people. We

have only recently realized in how large a part the ability "to take it" depends on adequate nutrition. Learn why you need to eat certain foods—and eat them! See, too, that you get plenty of outdoor fun and all kinds of physical activity so necessary for building sturdy bodies and good spirits.

(5) *Prepare for your future work.* Take stock of your abilities and interests and give careful consideration to what you want most to do for your life work. Talk the matter over with others, then look into the business you choose and find out what training and skills are necessary, and how you may obtain them.

(6) *Save and collect old aluminum.* Help in saving used and cast-off aluminum in your home and help community groups in aluminum collections. Even though the main drive for aluminum has been held by the time you read this, the need for aluminum still exists. More and more aluminum articles will be ready for discarding.

(7) *Give contributions.* Give more than usual—as much as you possibly can—to local organized charities and to war relief funds. Don't hesitate to give only a few cents; every penny helps to increase the totals of your local Community Chest, the American Red Cross, the United Service Organizations for National Defense, Inc., the British War Relief, and other worthwhile organizations. There are many ways of raising money for these purposes. With your club or a group of friends—or even as an individual—

give a party for which you charge admission or charge for food and games and so raise money for such a purpose. Conduct a circus or an entertainment or a dance for the fund in which you are most interested.

(8) *Buy Defense Stamps.* The cost of America's defense program is almost beyond comprehension. You can pay your part by buying Defense Stamps. In doing so you are not making a contribution, for you are not giving away your money; Defense Stamps pay interest. You can buy one for as little as ten cents from any post office.

(9) *Be a good neighbor.* Help

the other fellow—the newcomer to your community as well as the one you've known a long time. Help refugee boys and girls—and those whose parents were born in other countries—feel at home. Don't listen to propaganda that seeks to weaken America by promoting discord and intolerance among the different racial and religious groups. America is strong because of the variety of its peoples which results in a richness of background. Study your South American neighbors and learn to appreciate their cultures. All of us in the Western Hemisphere need each other, and future cooperation will be

easier and more effective if we understand our neighbors' special problems.

(10) *Appreciate the democracy you live in.* You enjoy a real privilege in living in a democracy. In Germany young people are regimented in their schools. They are required to work in labor camps. They are limited as to what books they read, what radio programs they listen to. There is no free speech, no freedom of assembly. You are indeed fortunate that you are not trapped in one of the European countries either at war or already under the domination of Hitler. You are fortunate to live in a free country. Read the Bill of Rights in the Constitution. And remember that your freedom is something so precious that it is worth spending every effort to preserve.

(11) *Be ready to sacrifice.* Part of your job is to make some sacrifices. Putting all possible resources to work on defense products means production of other articles is curtailed. You may not be able to buy some of the things you want. You may have to limit the amount of gasoline you use. Money may be scarcer in your home because taxes are going up and the cost of living, too. But don't forget that it is well worth giving up something to preserve the democracy under which you live.

(12) *Remain calm.* It is sometimes difficult not to be upset, when the newspapers, the radio, the conversation around you are so full of exciting and disturbing war news. Remember that hysteria is one of the obstacles to effective defense efforts. If you are doing something—no matter how little—to make America strong, you'll find it easier to avoid worry.

You have been wanting to help. Now you can! Check the list above and decide what you can do best. You will probably think of other things along the same lines that will be useful. America's defense program can be effective only if every individual is willing to do his part!

BRIGADIER GENERAL FREDERICK FUNSTON



GENERAL FREDERICK FUNSTON PUT AN END TO THE FILIPINO REBELLION AND BROUGHT PEACE TO THE PHILIPPINE ISLANDS BY CAPTURING THE LEADER OF THE REVOLT, EMILIO AGUINALDO, IN ONE OF THE MOST DARING EXPLOITS OF OUR HISTORY.
