Ten Steps to Avoid Drug Residues

- 1. Practice healthy herd management.
- 2. Establish a valid veterinarian/client/patient relationship.
- 3. Use only FDA-approved over-the-counter or prescription drugs with veterinarian's guidance.
 - 4. Be sure all drug labels comply with labeling requirements.
 - 5. Store all drugs correctly.
 - Administer all drugs according to label directions, and identify all treated animals.
 - 7. Keep a written record of all treatments.
 - 8. Use drug residue screening kits for milk and meat.
 - Implement employee/family training on proper drug use.
- Complete the Milk and Dairy Beef Quality Assurance Checklist every year.
