IT ALWAYS INTERESTED ME to see ow proud persons with a bit of the "ould od" in them were of it. But somehow I don't feel proud of any Irish in me right now. Not the way the Irish are acting at present. It may be stupidity or again it may be just plain pigheadedness, but Ireland is not only cutting its own throat, but trying to slash that of Britain, and of all the Allied nations as well.

NEUTRALITY CAN'T STAND near dictatorship. That has been proved by the little countries in Europe. Even now Quisling, the Nazi Norwegian traitor, is threatening Sweden. Only Switzerland is reasonably safe-because- of the Swiss army, which the Nazis know is prepared to fight to the death from every rock and · crevice in the country.

> WHERE IS THE IRISH fighting spirit? Are they afraid? They have been bombed and will be again. They know that Gerwith pilots don't waste bombs over their country by mistake. Yet they still won't take the only possible source of help-Britain and the Allied nations.

THE ONLY SIGNS OF Irish fight seen in this war are the jokes about the Irish general in Russia-General Tim O'Shenko. and the Irish Marines who held a Wake in the Pacific for two weeks. It's time they upheld their reputation. The Irish in this country are doing their part just as they always have.

THEY'RE TIRED OF SEEING Eire fuss around. The president of the Irish-Americans has sent a cable to Eamon De Valera telling him so. Strong defense of Ireland is necessary for the protection of Britain, which is the point from which Europe will be freed from the Nazis. President De Valera had better get "on the ball" or the United States will be forced to send some Yankee-bred Irish to take over and show Herr Hitler that the Shamrock hasn't turned yellow.
