Time Changes Everything-Even War By Tom Greene

AS TIME GOES ON the human race n't seem to learn how to get away from war, but it is learning how to really do a gold job of producing for war. In the old days it was simple. The king or someone Just collected an army and went out and fought.

THEN THE PEOPLE began to object to spending all their money for wars they didn't approve and they began to demand more rights in return for the money to support the king's wars. In that way wars have brought about much of what de-veloped into our democracy.

EVEN IN THE WORLD WAR I things were still relatively simple. There were meatless, wheatless, sugarless days-almost ccalless days even—but all of our economic system didn't feel the full effects of war. The dictators changed that. They marshalled every corner of their nations for the business of killing and to answer them in the only language they understood the democracies are doing the same.

WAR IS NOW going on on more fronts than those you read about in the headlines. Basically, the battle in America is taking three parts:

1) Handling of really essential civilian

2) Concentration of everything else on war production. (3) Controlling prices, inflation, and sec-

ing that everyone gets a square deal,

TODAY things that America thought were essential, aren't. That fact will come harder and more often in the days to come as we do without cars, tires, typewriters, and a host of things that are "on the list" to be done away with. We are using our machines to produce the guns, the planes, the tanks, and the shells, just as fast as they can be changed over.

BUT THE IMPORTANT thing, the con cept that has never before come fully out of a war is the concept of caring for the little man. Seeing that profiteers don't take the last cent taxes leave him. Seeing that he can get the essentials of life. Seeing that he is cared for while his plant is in the process of change-over.

THIS IS ONE front where immediate and effective action is vital and where more can be done to win the war than mankind has yet dreamed


