

WASHINGTON, May 11 (TP)-A fifth Japanese warship was reported by the navy late today as one of four vessels bagged by American sub-marines knifing across enemy Far Eastern supply lines.

A navy communique said units of the American fleet also had sunk two cargo ships and a destroyer. One of the cargo ships was identified as an enemy naval auxiliary.
