



Holiday Accidents--**A Deadly Tradition**

Each year highway accidents and deaths reach their peak

Ice, sleet and snow, early darkness, drinking, the student's rush home, and carelessness combine to make De-cember the bugaboo month for traffic. In thousands of homes last Christmas, joy was shattered by the tragedy

of a traffic accident.

According to the National Safety Council, the traffic trend is encouraging. During the first nine months of the year, the death toll dropped three percent from the same period for the previous year-a saving of 800 lives.

If this rate of improvement can be maintained the rest of the year, more than 1,000 lives can be saved on the highway for the 1957 period.



However, the year is NOT over. Holiday drivers are warned that glasses have a dangerous effect on vision. That is, if they've been emptied several times. The throttle and the bottle are big factors in the Christmas holiday traffic toll.

Social drinkers, because of the stepped up festivity of the season, present a greater traffic hazard than at any other time of the year,

fatal Christmas holiday ac-

cidents, which killed 609 persons, it was found that drinking drivers were involved in 55 percent of the accidents. At other times of the year they are involved in about 30

Men were driving in 94 percent of the accidents studied, In 90 percent of the accidents only on person was killed, four out of five being men, and these were mostly drivers.

Pedestrians never seem to be more than two feet away from a traffic accident-their own two feet, and because pedestrian deaths are highdest in December, the Council is stressing street crossing safety in its annual Christmas

A special study of 501 Christmas holiday accidents shows that one-third of the pedestrians killed contributed to their own deaths by crossing between intersections, stepping from behind a parked car or walking on a roadway, Vic. tims were principally older persons, four out of 10 victims being 65 years or older.

So December with its holiday spirit may be the jolliest time of the year—but it is also the deadliest.

December deaths never take a holiday—they do just the

reverse. Year after year December comes in with a traffic death toll higher than any other month-17 percent greater than the average for other months last year.

A motorist's best chance for December survival, accordto the safety council, are in these suggestions;

- Drive 10 m.p.h. slower at night than during daylight. Fut your headlights—not your parking lights—on at dusk. Dusk is a deceptive time, say experts. A fourth of all traffic deaths occur during the hours of 4 to 8 p.m.
- Stay off secondary roads. They usually have inadequate signs, poor overhead lights and most dangerous driv-
- If you drive at night, be sure you are rested. Be alert. Many dangerous situations are encountered at night.
- Keep your gas tank at least half full when you drive after dark. If you run out of gas or have a car failure, get all four wheels off the roadway
