

## INCOME TAX HIT IN CAUCUS FIGHT

Senator Simmons Urges Limit  
or No Exemptions at All  
on Children.

OUTCOME IS DOUBTFUL.

Lewis Submits Duty Amendment  
Proposed by Illinois Manufacturers.

Washington, D. C., June 30.—Democrat of the senate ran against a snag late today when they took up the report of the finance committee majority on the income tax section of the tariff bill, and upon adjournment tonight no progress had been made and no one would predict when or where the apparent differences would end.

The caucus took up the income tax report of the committee paragraph by paragraph. When the exemption clause was reached everybody wanted to talk at once. Some senators argued against the committee amendment reducing the general exemption from \$4,000 to \$3,000, with \$1,000 additional for married men or women with dependents, and \$500 each for dependent children. This opened the way to countless suggestions. INSERT X-O-L

**Senators Hit Discrimination.**  
Some senators declared that there should be no differentiation between married and single persons; others argued that if exemptions were to be made, minor children dependent upon a parent's income and dependent grandchildren should be included; still others argued that the family which would make the maximum exemption \$5,000. When the committee revision of the bill was printed the limit on children's exemptions was omitted.

When this was discovered Senator Simmons informed the caucus that the omission was unintentional and that the committee had intended to limit the amount to \$1,000.

**Simmons Makes Hot Speech.**  
Debate on the income exemption developed into considerable of an emotional scramble. Senator Simmons taking the floor just before the evening recess to declare emphatically that the caucus should either vote to limit the exemptions as far as dependents were concerned to a specific number of dependent minor children or to strike out altogether any exemption for dependent children. To let down the bars for grandchildren or dependent crippled adults, he insisted, would be to enter a never ending realm of discussion and to get into the field of impracticability.

Before taking up the income tax the caucus completed the free list with the exception of the provisions relating to paintings and works of art, which were referred back to the committee for further consideration.

Senator Lewis of Illinois submitted to the finance committee majority tonight an amendment proposing general countervailing duties in lieu of the anti-dumping clause which was stricken from the Underwood bill by the finance committee. The amendment was suggested by the Illinois Manufacturers' association. The committee has not yet considered it.

**Fort Sheridan Deserted.**  
Waukegan, Ill., June 30.—(Special.)—Prisoners of Fort Sheridan are being transferred to Fort Leavenworth, Kas. The fort will be deserted during the summer months. One hundred men will remain in Chicago during the Olympic games. Three other troops have been ordered to Fort Meyer, Va. They will like back on Sept. 1, since the Mexican war score but four troops have been stationed at the post.

## CHINESE DOCTOR, Aged 149, SUSBISTS ON TABLOID FOOD

Aged Manchu, Six Feet High, in Party  
of Prosperous Orientals Bound on  
Canadian Visit.

New York, June 30.—(Special.)—Among a party of seven prosperous Chinamen who arrived in the first cabin of the Ward line steamship Mexico, and were landed at the Battery, bound for Canada, was Dr. Cho-Choy, 149 years old.

According to the Ellis Island officials, the doctor lives on water and some special food that he carries in tablet form around his neck. He appears to be in good health.

Dr. Cho-Choy is a Manchu and speaks pigeon English. He has no pistol nor any hair at all upon his head.

Like most Manchus, Dr. Cho is tall—more than 6 feet in height, notwithstanding a slight stoop. He has been practicing medicine in Cuba for fifty years among the Chinese there.

**HEIR TO BRITISH EARLDOM  
MEMBER OF HARVARD FACULTY.**

Future Lord Russell to Teach Philosophy at the Big Eastern University—Married to American Girl.

Cambridge, Mass., June 30.—(Special.)—When Harvard reopens in the fall the university will have among its faculty a member of the English nobility, the heir presumptive to the earldom of Russell, the Hon. Bertrand Arthur William Russell of Cambridge, England. The new professor comes from Trinity college, Cambridge university, to teach philosophy, with special reference to the mathematical and moral sides of the subject. Mrs. Russell was Miss Alys Smith, daughter of K. Farnall Smith of Philadelphia, Pa.

**DAVIES DENIES TAKING DESKS.**

Former State Factory Inspector Asserts  
He Has Not Appropriated Equip-  
ment He Is Sued For.

**FIRE AT INDIANA HARBOR; 4 HURT**  
Starts on Second Floor, Where Men Were  
Preparing Supper, and Spreads  
to Nearby Buildings.

Indiana Harbor, Ind., June 30.—(Special.)—Four men were hurt early this morning in a fire in Block Avenue, a short distance from the central part of town. The blaze started on the second floor of a three story building where some Greeks are supposed to have been cooking a late meal. It spread to the buildings on each side, sweeping both away. At 1 o'clock the fire appeared under control, after causing about \$25,000 loss.

## TAX ASSESSMENT NEARING FINISH

Completion of West Chicago  
List Boosts City's Personal-  
ty Value to \$603,499,531.

ONLY JEFFERSON LEFT.

Board of Review Will Hold First  
Session Today to Go Over  
Figures.

Value of personal property owned by Chicagoans reached a total of \$603,499,531 yesterday when the assessors' figures for the town of West Chicago became public. With the completion of the town of Jefferson, which never lists a large amount, the assessors' record for the city will be complete.

West Chicago showed an increase of \$11,601,220, assessed value, over the estimate of the board of review in 1912. The increase over the assessors' figures for the town in 1912 is \$5,088,132. This year 27,850 persons were assessed, as against 22,573 last year.

The assessors have asked the board of review to send them duplicates of every complaint against assessments and penalties.

**Board of Review to Sit Today.**  
Coincident with the completion of the assessors' books, the board of review has begun work. At a meeting called for 10 o'clock this morning, the members of the board will make out a list of corporations whose assessments of this year are inconsistent with previous valuations. If enough inconsistencies are found, summonses will be issued for a hearing next Monday.

"We will be cautious about lowering the assessments of those who have been penalized," said Roy O. West, chairman. "We are essentially a board for lowering, not raising taxation."

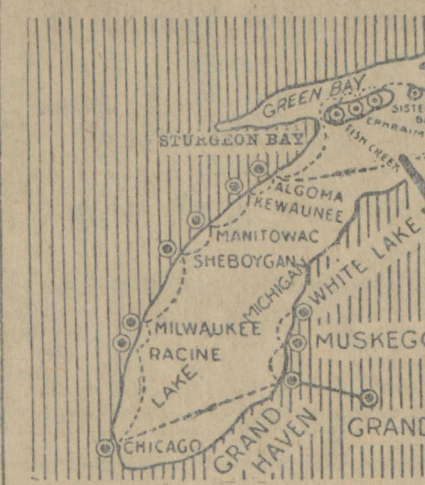
**Foreign Stocks Question.**  
Recent supreme court decisions bearing on the subject of taxing certain stocks and bonds of foreign corporations may mean a speedy hearing of the mandamus suit directed against the board of review in 1900 to compel the members to assess such securities. Maxwell Edgar, secretary of the Illinois Tax Reform association, asked Chief Justice Baldwin of the Circuit court in a letter yesterday that the suit be brought to a hearing.

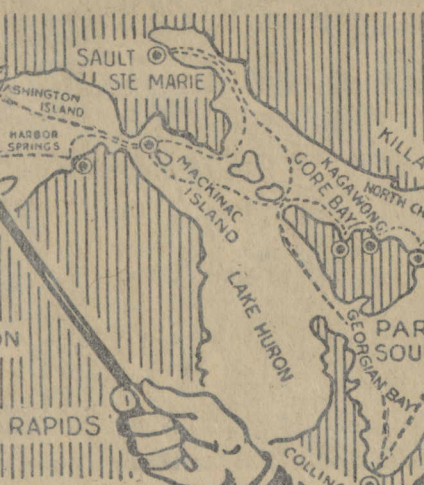
