

CASH IMPENDS BETWEEN BERLIN AND BRUNSWICK?

Victorious Ebert Party Wins 65 Per Cent of Assembly Seats.

AMSTERDAM, Jan. 21.—Karl Radek, a bolshevik emissary from Russia, has taken refuge in the castle at Brunswick, which is closely guarded by artillery and machine guns, according to a dispatch to the Berlin Kreis Zeitung.

From various measures recently taken, the dispatch adds, it seems that the Brunswick government is expecting a collision with the Berlin Kreis Zeitung.

Complete Ebert Victory.

ZURICH, Jan. 21.—Chancellor Ebert has received a national vote of confidence through the German election, according to returns received here today. His party, the Majority Socialists, appeared to have won a complete victory. The former Liberals, now called the German Democrats, were second. The Spartans were snuffed under.

How Parties Line Up.

BERLIN, Jan. 21.—According to the available returns the various parties won the following districts: MAJORITY SOCIALISTS—City of Berlin (result close); Wurttemberg, Lorraine, Mecklenburg, Lubek, northern Schleswig, Hanover, Dresden, Bremen, Hamburg, Nuremberg, Chemnitz.

CENTRISTS (coalition of Catholics and Protestants)—Bavaria (several districts), Freiburg, Waldshut, Sackingen, Constance, East Prussia.

GERMAN DEMOCRATS—Mannheim, Danzig, Barmen, Essen, Dortmund, Cologne, Aachen, Bonn, Frankfurt, Mainz, Wiesbaden, Koblenz, Trier, Saarbrücken, Ludwigshafen, Elberfeld, Magdeburg, Halle, Leipzig, Chemnitz.

PEOPLES' PARTY (pan-Germans)—None.

Winners in Berlin.

In Berlin the Majority Socialists apparently had elected Philipp Scheidemann, Richard Fischer, Wilhelm Pfandl, Robert Schmidt, and Hugo Feldmann, the Independent Socialists, Hugo Haase, Police President Eichhorn, Louis Zehn, and Herr Lautkau, the German Democrats, Gustav Hartmann and Herr Naumann, and the Centrists, Nationalists, and Peoples' party, cooperating, Wilhelm Karl, Herr von Kautzsch, and Herr Ledermann.

The Majority Socialists and the German Democrats, who are the successors of the old Radical party, apparently will go into the constituent assembly on a big lead over the Independent Socialists. Based on incomplete returns, the Majority Socialists will constitute the left of the national assembly in 65 per cent of the seats.

Bad Reds in Stronghold.

Hamburg, which was considered a stronghold of the Spartans and Independent Socialists, the Majority Socialists are reported to have secured nine seats out of eleven.

The returns from the republic of Saxony show this result: Majority Socialists, seventeen seats; German Democrats, six; German National party, six; German People's party, two, and Independent Socialists, three.

In the Magdeburg-Anhalt district the German Democrats got three delegates, the Majority Socialists seven, National People's party one, and Independent Socialists, German People's party, and Centrists none.

Ludwig Haas Apparent Winner.

Baden the National People's party, eight seats, the German Democrats two, the Social Democrats five, Centrists five, one of whom is Otto Pabst, a well-known socialist leader, and the Reichstag, Ludwig Haas, minister of the interior, was successful as a candidate of the German Democratic party.

Complete returns show that the Democrats polled 1,243,043 votes; Majority Socialists, 2,603,422; Independent Socialists, 401,187; Christian People's party, 1,110,137; the German People's party, 286,107; and the Conservatives, 1,367.

Weimar Gets Assembly.

COPENHAGEN, Jan. 21.—The new German national assembly will meet at Weimar, capital of the grand duchy of Saxe-Weimar-Eisenach, according to the Berlin Lokal Anzeiger. This was decided upon in a conference between German government representatives and the Prussian minister after they agreed that the session ought to be held in a non-Prussian town.

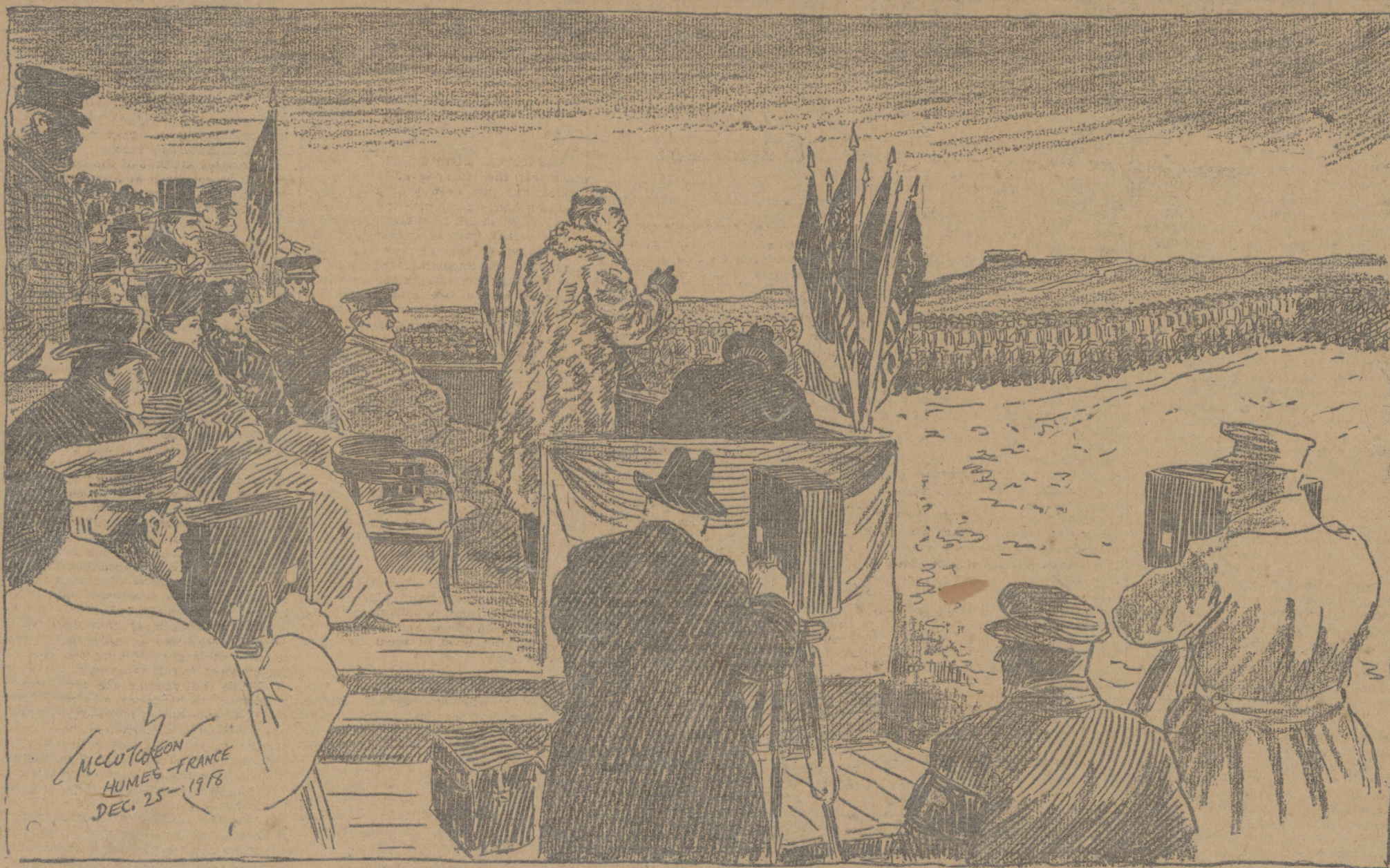

FIGURE UP WHAT YOUR INCOME TAX WILL AMOUNT TO

Conferees in Congress Have Finished Section of Bill.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 21.—[Special.]—Conferees on the new two year war revenue bill have completed their work on the income tax section of the measure. The last revision of that important feature of the bill has been concluded. The last word has been said, except perhaps a few ineffectual protests when the conference report comes up for ratification in both houses.

It may therefore be stated what the income tax will be that the American people must pay for the year 1918 and also for the year 1919, and thereafter unless a Republican congress should come into being should amend the pending law.

How It Will Work Out.

Under the present provisions the tax to be paid by a married person or head of a family with no dependents, not including exemption for bonds or taxable dividends, would be as follows for the calendar year 1918 and for the year 1919:

Exemptions and Credits.

Exemptions or credits under the law as affecting individuals shall be as follows: "The amount received as dividends from a corporation which is taxable under this title upon its net income; "The amount received as interest upon obligations of the United States and bonds issued by the war finance corporation which is included in gross income under section 218;

"In the case of a single person, a personal exemption of \$1,000, or in the case of the head of a family or a married person living with husband or wife, a personal exemption of \$2,000. (Two hundred dollars for each person (other than husband or wife) dependent upon and receiving his chief support from the tax payer, if such dependent person is under 18 years of age or is incapable of self-support because mentally or physically defective.)

Chicagoans to Direct Jewish Relief in Poland

Two Chicagoans, Judge Harry Fisher of the Municipal court and E. Horvath, west side manufacturer, will soon go to Europe to aid in organizing the relief supplies forwarded to the Jews in Poland and Roumania, for which a fund of \$1,000,000 is now being collected.

DOMINIONS OF BRITAIN WANT NATION'S RIGHTS

Demand They Be Given Full Recognition at Paris.

PARIS, Jan. 21.—[By the Associated Press.]—Canada, Australia, and the other self-governing dominions of Great Britain have begun an effort for individual representation in the projected league of nations. They claim the right to enter the league with the same status as other nations.

The question is now being discussed by the British and dominion officials, and it will be for the British government to say whether it shall ask the peace conference to accord the dominions individual membership in the league.

Borden Claims the Honor.

Sir Robert L. Borden, premier of Canada, gave to the Associated Press tonight the following statement: "In the imperial war council in 1917 I had the honor of moving in behalf of Canada a resolution, which was accepted by the United Kingdom and the other dominions and which declared that the readjustment of the constitutional relations of the component parts of the British empire should be based on the full recognition of the dominions as autonomous nations of the imperial commonwealth."

Hughes Gives Stand.

Premier Hughes of Australia, discussing the claims of the dominions with the Associated Press, said: "We have earned the right by our sacrifices and efforts in this great war to a place in the family of nations. We expect to come in with the same status as any other nation."

325 Argentine Ships to Fly Uruguay Flag in Labor Row

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 21.—Reports from Montevideo state that Nicolas von Mihanevich, who controls the Argentine Navigation company, which owns 325 steamers and maintains service between Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay and southern Brazilian ports, has decided to place his company's vessels under the Uruguayan flag because of labor troubles in Argentina.

A street car strike has been declared here, beginning at midnight, but the companies expect to operate a few cars.

Advices received here indicate several large South American cities will forbid the carnivals usually held in February because of the Bolshevik propaganda.
