

AFTER A SIX-HUNDRED FOOT PLUNGE

Wreckage of the Budapest-Vienna-Cologne express which fell from the viaduct near Biatorbagy, Hungary, Sept. 3, 1931. The wreck, in which twenty died, was caused by bombs exploded on the viaduct. A note found near the scene of the catastrophe indicated that the train was wrecked as a blow against capitalism.
