FRENCH FRONT. BRITISH.

LONDON, May 12 .-- Further details, which now are available concerning last night's attacks on the battle front, confirm the success of our operation. Yesterday evening considerable bodies of the enemy were observed massing for a counter attack in the neighborhood of Bullecourt. They were effectively dealt with by our artillery, and the hostile attack did not develop.

Later in the night our troops attacked, and, after heavy fighting, lasting throughout the night, sion of a portion of the village. have today established themselves in the village of Bullecourt, where fighting still continues.

This afternoon an enemy attack on the positions gained was scattered by our artillery.

Astride the Arras-Cambrai road we have captured some 1,200 yards of a German trench, including a strong point known as the Cavalry farm. North of the Scarpe our troops last night stormed Roeux cemetery and the chemical works to the north. Today they have continued their advance and have carried enemy positions in this neighborhood on a front of about one and a half miles.

n the course of these operations we have captured more than 700 prisoners, including eleven officers, and a number of trench mortars and machine guns.
