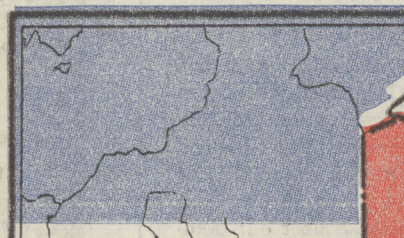

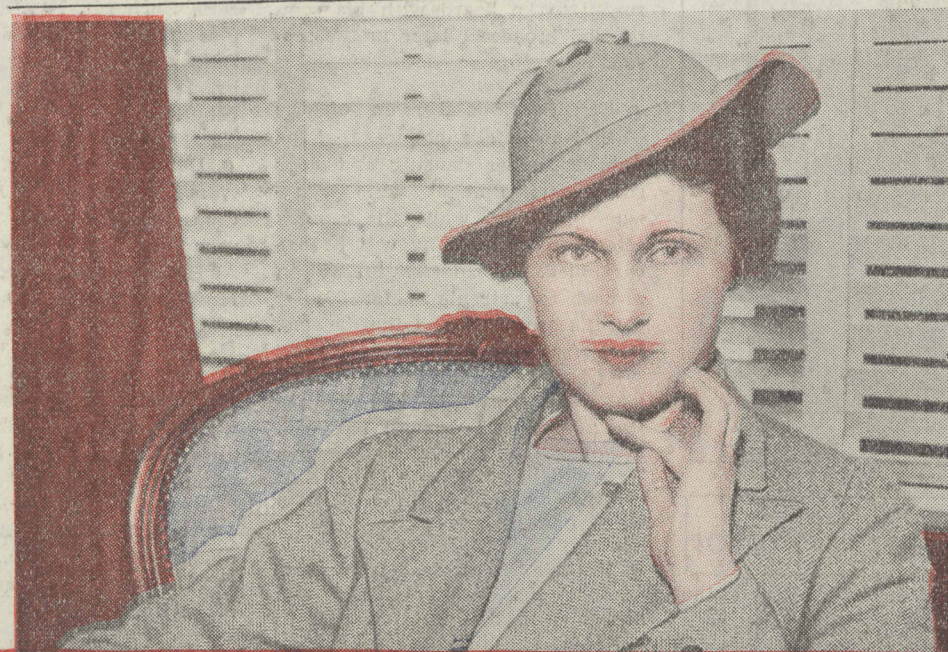

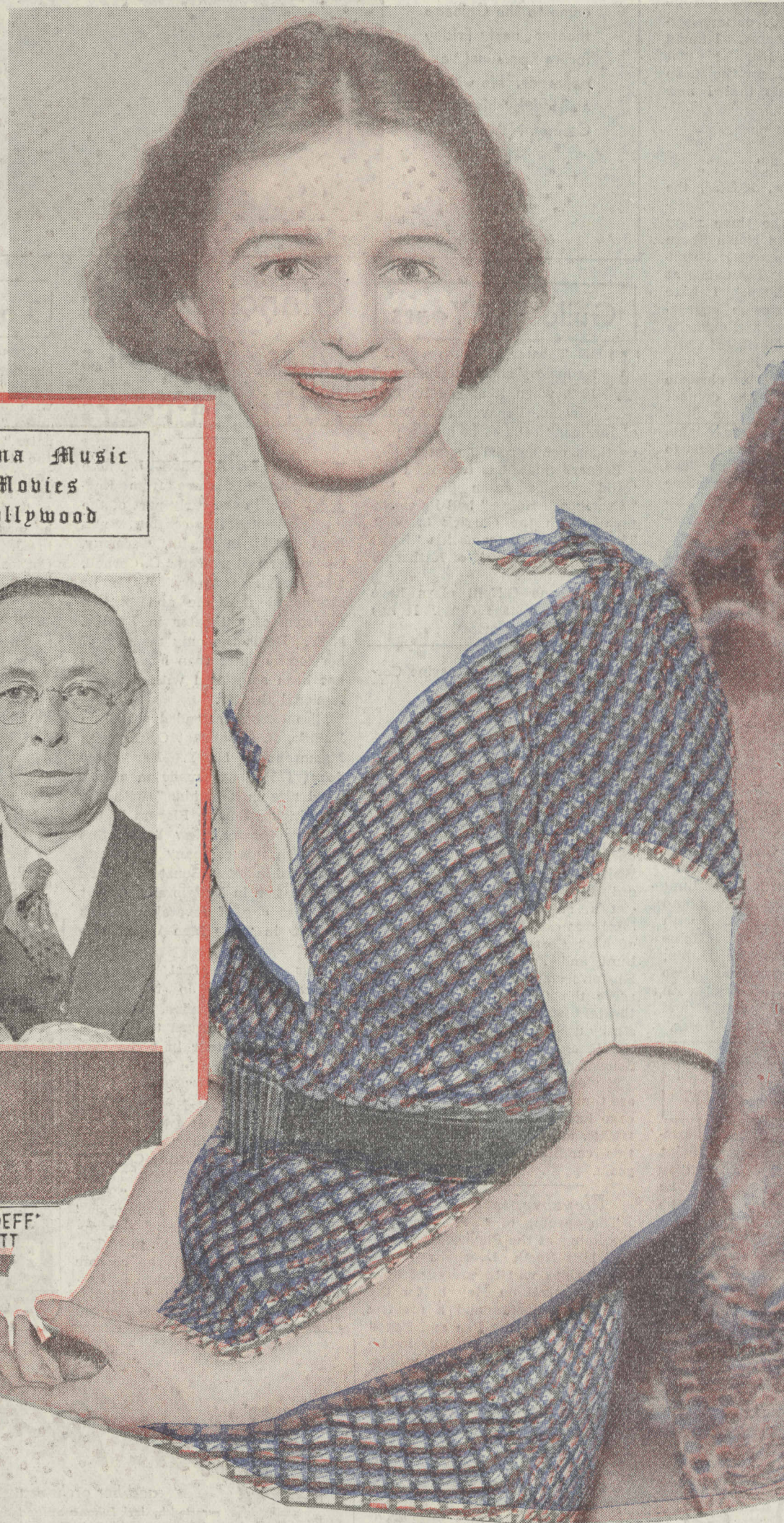

The Chicago Sunday Tribune was born on May 26, 1861—seventy-five years ago. The first Sunday Tribune, presented to the nation during the critical days of the Civil war, was little different from the regular weekday issues of the newspaper. It bore but faint resemblance to The Sunday Tribune of today, the last named with its attractive pages in color, its complete world coverage of news, and its scores of special features. For the more than seven decades represented in the title lines on this page The Chicago Sunday Tribune has been THE newspaper of progress.
