Helsinki Paper Has Centennial Across Europe the reproduction appeared in the Helsinki Uusi Suomi, which is celebrating its own 100th anniversary this year, and in Le Panama City—The Panama Star and Pays of Paris, which began publication after the liberation of France in 1945. Luxemburgers saw the picture in the Wort, which is the oldest and biggest newspaper in the duchy, with twice the circulation of its nearest rival.

Of interest to Americans is the fact that the Tribune de Geneve, which carried the facsimile, was founded by an American, James T. Bates, born in Philadelphia. It was started as an English language newspaper but switched to French and became one of the leading news

Among Latin-American newspapers sharing in the triumph of news transmission is one somewhat older than THE TRIBUNE. El Comercio of Lima, Peru, founded in 1839. With both an afternoon and morning circulation, it ranks as one of the most important newspapers in South
