Recommendations made by various members of the 18 nation human rights commission at a meeting in March are incorporated in the secretariat's draft, which is the only suggested text so far received by the subcommittee, except for a

No U. S. Draft Submitted Mrs. Roosevelt said the United States had decided not to submit a draft of its own because of the secretariat's action

The secretariat's draft gives lip service to some fundamental American constitutional liberties but ties rights of individuals up with "duties" to the state and the international organization in a totalitarian pattern.

For example, there is a provision that no one shall be deprived of liberty without due process of law, but the same article states that "detention by purely executive order shall be unlawful except in time of national emergency," and puts no restriction on the right of the executive to proclaim national emer-

Another provision prohibits censorship but the next article states "there exists a duty toward society to present information and news in a fair and impartial manner."

"Duties" Limit Freedom Presence of this article in the bill recalled that the Dutch member of the U. N. subcommission on freedom of information said at a recent meeting that any attempt to define freedom of the press in terms of "duties" would limit freedom.

The bill's preamble asserts that man does not have rights only, but owes duties to society and proclaims he is a citizen of his country and of the world. There can be no peace unless human rights and freedom




