The measure, which is understood to have the backing of Lt. Gov. Hugh Cross, would give the commission of five senators and five repre sentatives broad powers in examining the fiscal and revenue policies of the state, the costs of government, possible overlapping of functions, distribution of executive powers, and the system of policy making.

GET RID OF RATS 30,000 POSTERS

Thirty thousand posters will be nailed up in the city's alleys and 600,000 handbills will be distributed during Rat Extermination week starting Monday and ending June 22. Mayor Kennelly announced yes-
