




THE BEGINNING OF THE END—With all the fervor of a David attacking a Goliath,




ONE THAT HURT HIM—Carnera sways backward, while Louis poises for another blow.





HAMMER AND TONGS—The Italian man-mountain, in the foreground, blocks a long left, and counters with a left to Louis' chest.


