SIREN—She was born Phyllis Langhorne, one of the five famously beautiful daughters of C. D. Langhorne of Greenwoods, Va. She was married to Reginald Brooks, a New York millionaire. Granted a divorce from him in 1915, she sailed for England to take up Red Cross work. There she captured the hearts of Capt, the Hon, William Reginald Wyndham, brother of Lord Leconfield, and of Capt. the Hon. George Douglas-Pennant, brother of Lord Penrhyn. Both of these officers were killed in France and both of them left her large fortunes at an interval of several months. Now she has married Capt. Robert Brand, a member of a house that owns probably the most ancient peerage in England. Capt. Brand's brother is Viscount Hampden, twenty-fifth Lord Dacre. The baronetcy of Dacre has existed since the Norman conquest. Capt. Brand and his brother are descendants of John Hampden, who championed the rights of the people in the reign of Charles I. Capt. Brand, formerly of the Royal Scots regiment, is a partner in the famous banking house of Lazard Brothers, London. His bride's sisters are Mrs. Waldorf Astor, Mrs. Charles Dana Gibson, and Mrs. Paul Phipps.
