

U. S. TO SURVEY PROFIT SHARING PLANS IN FORCE

Opens Headquarters in
Chicago for Job.

Headquarters of a federal survey of all types of profit sharing plans in the United States has been set up in Chicago, it became known yesterday. The office, established three weeks ago, is now ready for the project, work on which will continue for six months.

Donald Despain of Chicago, a veteran of wide experience in the industrial relations field, is in charge. He was appointed director of the survey by a subcommittee of the United States senate committee on finance. The subcommittee consists of Senator Clyde L. Herring (D., Ia.), chairman; Senator Edwin C. Johnson (D., Colo.), and Senator Arthur H. Vandenberg (R., Mich.).

Appointment Is Quiet.
Despain was appointed approximately a month ago without any of the publicity that ordinarily accompanies such events. He preferred, he said, to start to work quietly, outline his plans, and organize his staff before attention was called to his task. First he obtained offices in the United States courthouse. He now has installed six assistants, including statisticians, analysts, and field men, and is mailing 2,500 copies of his first letter of inquiry to trade, manufacturing, and employers' associations throughout the country.

The survey plan is recognized generally as a Vandenberg idea, as the Michigan senator presented and had passed the resolution directing that the study be made and setting aside \$30,000 for expenses. Because of this sponsorship it is believed the profit sharing subject may be of importance in the next congress and possibly in the next presidential campaign.

What Resolution Provides.
The Vandenberg resolution directed the subcommittee:
"To make a complete study and report to the senate upon all existing profit-sharing systems between employers and employees now operative in the United States with a special view (a) to the preparation of an authentic record of experience which may be consulted by employers who are interested in voluntarily establishing profit-sharing plans; (b) to the consideration of what advisable contribution may be made to the encouragement of profit sharing by the federal government, including the grant of compensatory tax exemptions and tax rewards when profit sharing is voluntarily established; (c) to the consideration of any other recommendations which may prove desirable in the pursuit of these objectives."

Heed Way to Peace.
In advocating the survey, Senator Vandenberg suggested that some method of insuring workers a share of profits in the same way they are now divided among stockholders might do much toward establishing industrial peace. The government, he said, might encourage the plan by exempting from taxation the dividends paid to workers.

Despain's first form letter was not the customary questionnaire, but a request for cooperation in an unprejudiced, fact-finding survey. Public hearings, in which both employers and employees will take part, will be held in Washington early next year.

Ten thousand buyers and merchants from all sections of the United States are expected in Chicago this week and next for the fall markets of women's apparel.

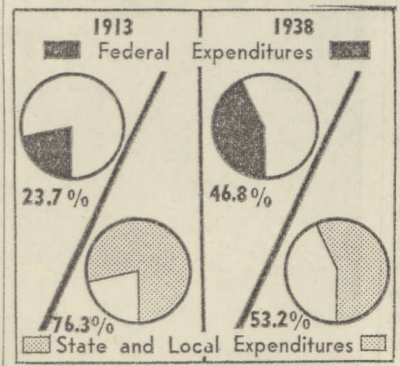
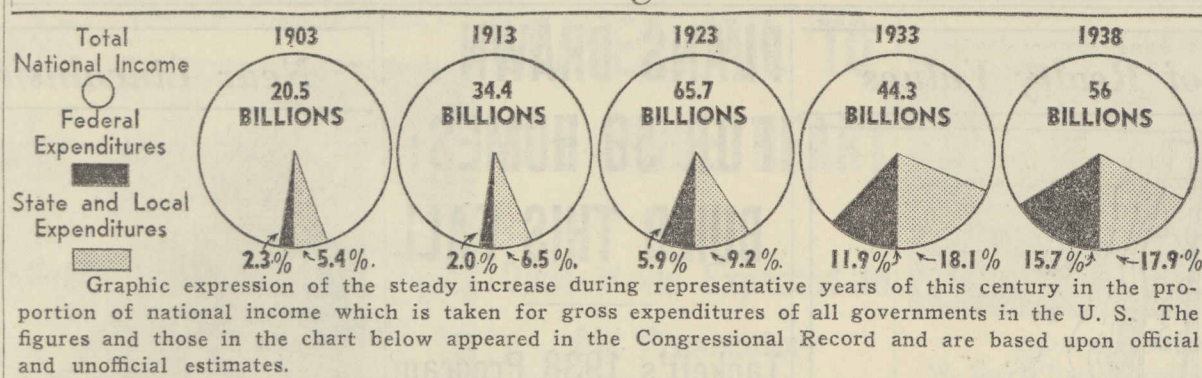

L. J. DRAKE WINS TOP HONORS AT GUERNSEY SHOW

500 Breeders Exhibit at Plano.

L. J. Drake of Chicago was awarded the premier Guernsey breeder exhibitor's honor yesterday at the third annual parish show sponsored by the Northern Illinois Guernsey Breeders' association. Approximately 500 farmers and dairy cattle breeders from Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Wisconsin, and Michigan attended the outdoor competition held on Drake's Rock Creek farm, one mile north of Plano, Kendall county.

The premier exhibitor's score was 103, defeating Dr. N. S. Heaney, owner of Woody Nook farm of Glen Ellyn, by only one point. Drake won with the pick of his herd of about 140 Guernseys.

Dr. Heaney tied Mr. and Mrs. Chauncey McCormick, owners of St. James farm near Naperville, for premier breeder honors, each scoring 77 points. The McCormicks had taken both premier exhibitor and breeder honors at the first two parish shows.

Princess Barbar Champion Female.
St. James Princess Barbar from the St. James herd was declared senior and grand champion female of the show. Drake's Rock Creek Forester's Lady won the junior champion female prize. She also was first in the heifer calf class.

Calves from the Wood Nook farm herd, competing in a class of eight bulls, won the first four awards. In the 2 year old bull class Corium Oliver's Rupert of Woody Nook farm won first. The same farm exhibited the blue ribbon junior yearling bull.

St. James Champion from the McCormick herd was judged to be the best yearling bull. Langwater Pretor, a Rock Creek farm bull, was first in the aged sire class.

Woody Nook Pert from Dr. Heaney's herd was first in the junior yearling heifer class. He also won first in the senior yearling heifer class and the 4 year old cow class.

Rock Creek Takes Two Firsts.
Rock Creek farm took firsts in the 2 year old heifer competition and in the aged cow class.

St. James farm exhibited the best 3 year old cow.

In the junior dairy judging contest the team from the Lake Zurich Future Farmers' club won first place, scoring 372 out of a possible 450 points. The team was made up of Mitchell Kane, Warren Nebmer, and Edward Lucas. Second place went to the Naperville club team—Fred Boehl, Vernon Blum, and Frank Winkler—with a score of 360.

Lucas made the highest individual score, totaling 140 out of 150 points. Philip Swift of the La Salle 4-H club team was second with 130.

Russell Huston, manager of the Franchester farm of South Euclid, O., judged the cattle. The show was supervised by Lewis M. Meyer, manager of the Rock Creek farm, with the cooperation of R. L. Holden, representative of the American Guernsey Cattle club, Petersburg, Vt.
