

Quarrel Over Dillinger Reward as "Girl in Red" Who Accompanied Desperado to Movie Is Located



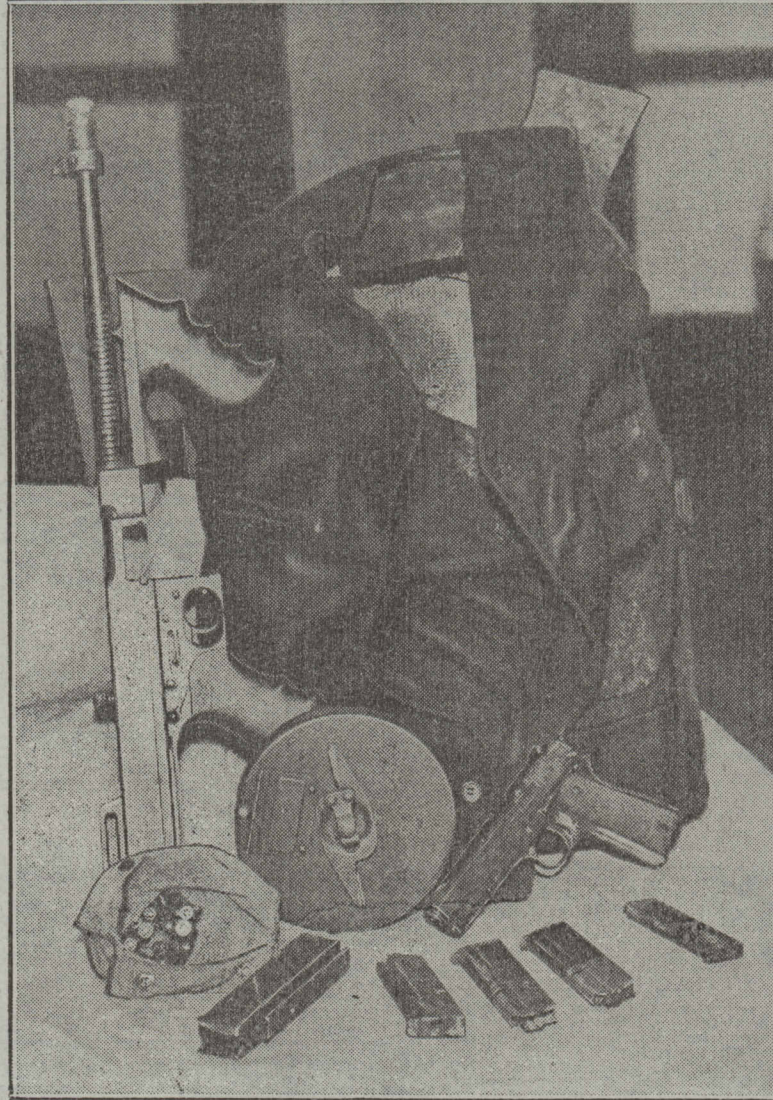

WITH DILLINGER. Mrs. Rita Keele, also known as Polly Hamilton, who is now in Fargo, N. D. (Story on page 1.)



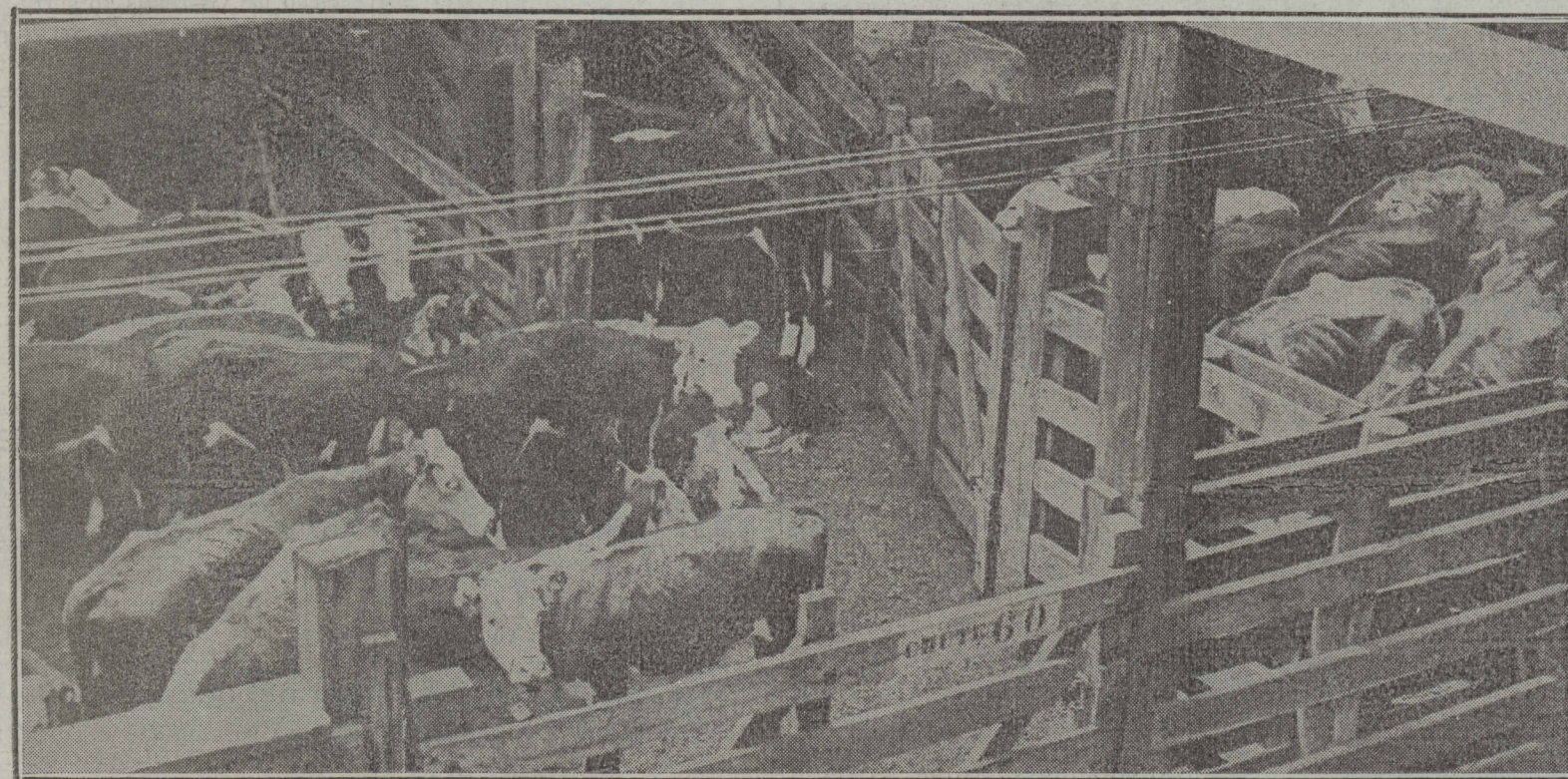

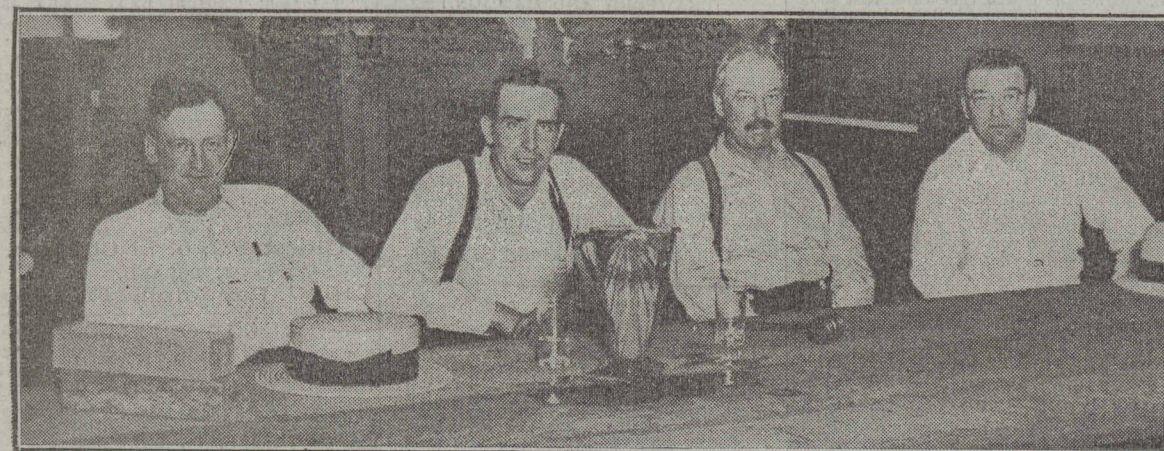

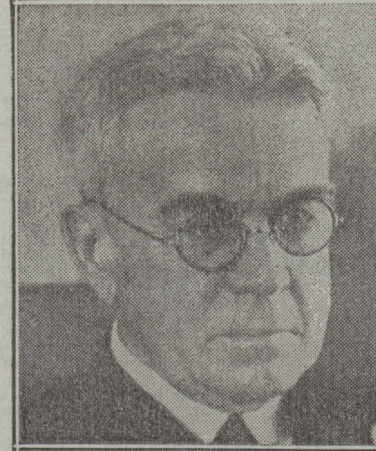

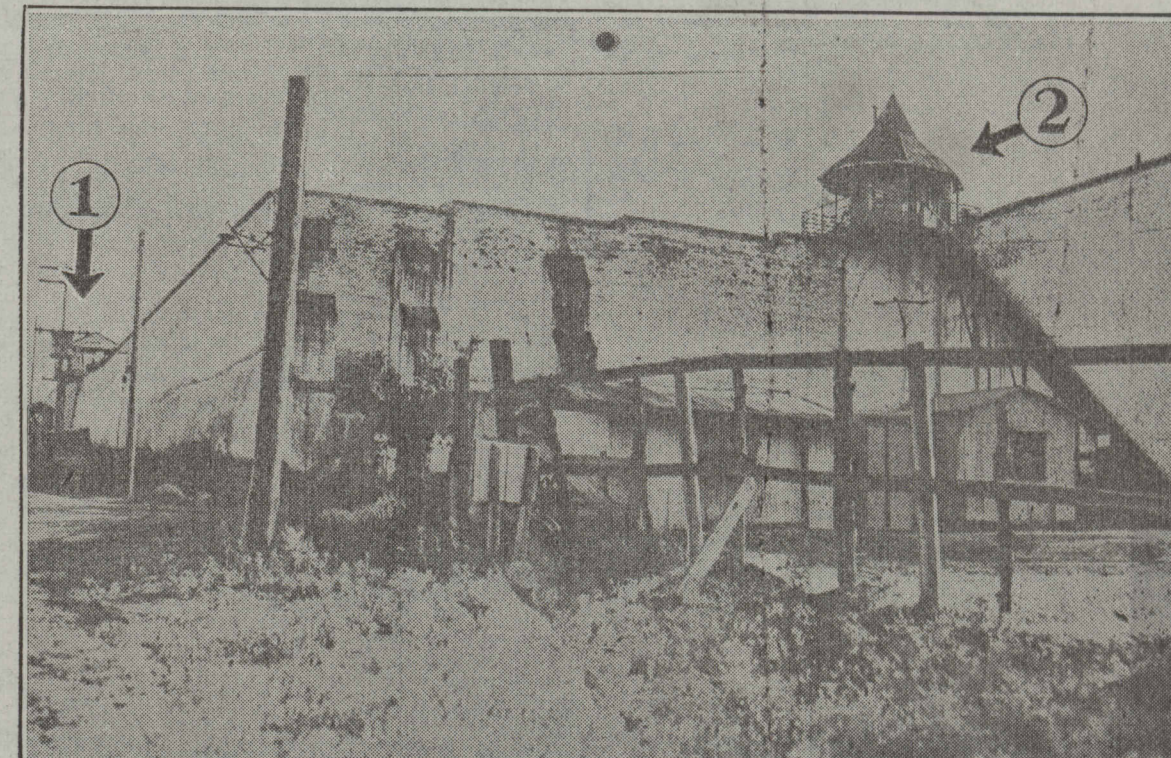
