It is sending out enormous runners with rank growth of leaves. Will the plants bear another year? Should the bed be fertilized and when? Are the runners new plants and can they be transplanted?-Dr. J. R. L. Ans.-1. The time to cut the seed stalks

s when they are killed by frost, burning the cuttings. After the first freeze mulch the bed with four inches of mano salt. Nitrate of soda may be applied once each in June and July, at the rate of 2.41 pounds per square rod (16% feet each way), or 400 pounds per acre, half the allowance at each application. 2. As the plants are still vigorous, they will bear satisfactorily. Cut off all runners. Cover the bed with a two inch mulch of manure after the first freeze. If additional plants are required elsewhere let the runners strike root and transplant them in August.

ning method is the destructive effect of high temperature." Processing, sterilizing, cooking

in closed cans, means the same thing. The jar itself, the food in it, the liquid in it, the air in it, are rendered sterile by heat. If sterilized products in cans are exposed to unsterile air for

even a fraction of a second they must be resterilized. For instance, if rubbers are forgotten before the product is cooked, they may be put on afterward, and if the can is still hot ten minutes more of cooking will resterilize the whole.
