MAY BUCKLEY went on the stage as a child in a company which had Edwin Booth and Lawrence Barrett as co-stars. She became a star in New York in 1897, in "The First Born," under the management of David Belasco.



ADA REHAN was one of the most famous actresses on the American stage from 1880 until her retirement in 1905. During her career she acted more than 200 roles, including many of Shakespeare's heroines. She died in 1916.



VESTA VICTORIA was an English music hall singer, of the comic type, who made many American vaudeville tours. In 1905 she popularized the ditty, "Waiting at the Church."



DAVID MONTGOMERY AND FRED STONE became famous as eccentric comedians in 1902 when "The Wizard of Oz" was staged in Chicago. This picture, from "The Lady of the Slipper," shows Stone (right) in his "Wizard of Oz" character. Montgomery died in 1917. Stone is now in Hollywood.
