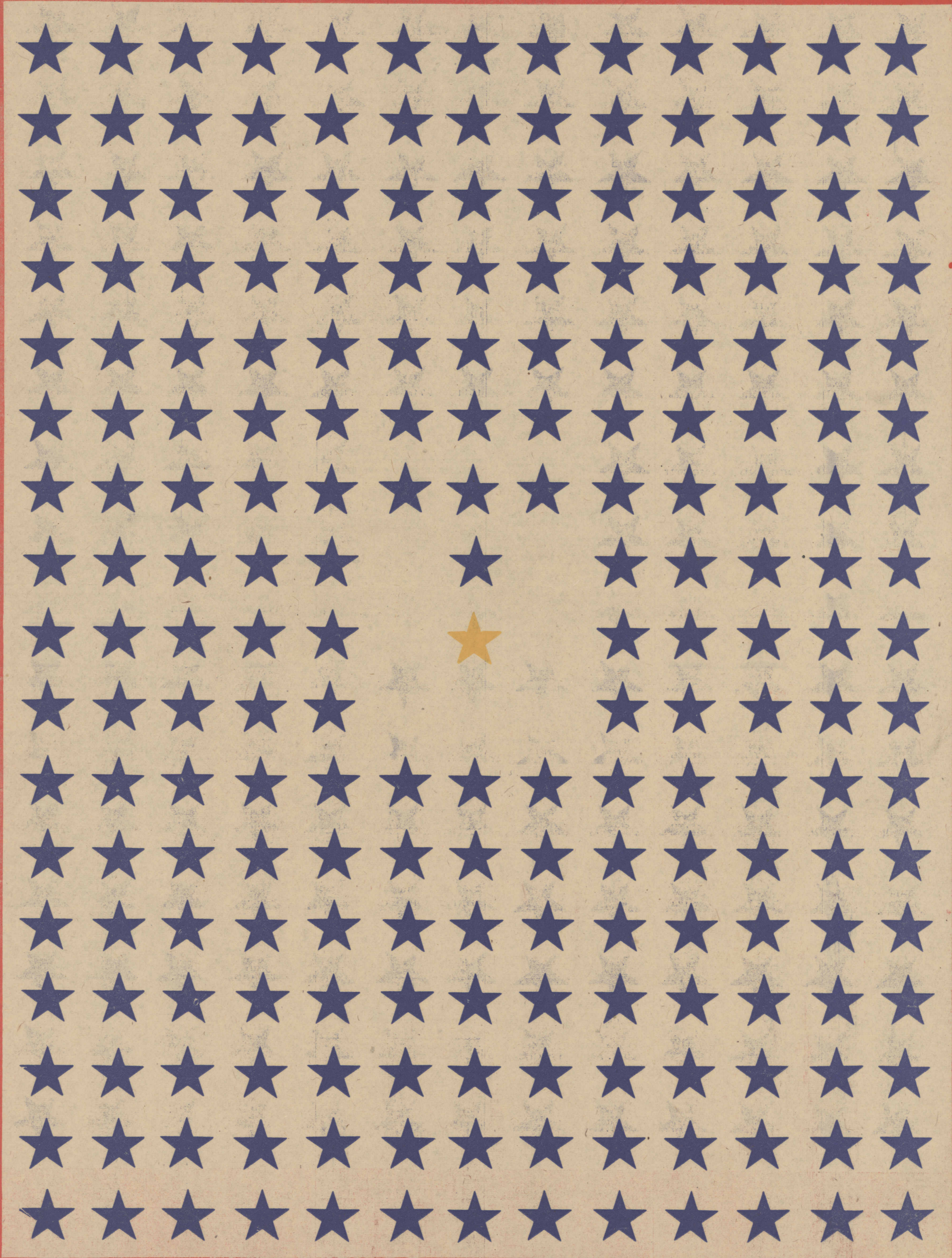


THE TRIBUNE'S SERVICE FLAG



THIS reproduction of the service flag that flies above Michigan avenue from Tribune Tower is a testimonial to the loyalty and patriotism of the employes of The Tribune. Its 213 blue stars represent Tribune employes who are serving in the country's armed forces. They are in the army, the navy, the marines, and the coast guard. The gold star stands for Richard

W. Graff, the first Tribune employe to be killed in action in this war. He met his death while fighting with General MacArthur's forces in the Philippines. In addition to these 214 who are represented by stars in the service flag are approximately 25 Tribune employes who have been sworn into service and now are waiting their orders to report for active duty.
