U. S. DESTROYER SUNK; 21 OF CREW BELIEVED LOST

Collision in the War Zone Sends Old Type Boat to Bottom, Sims Says.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 20.—Sinking of the American destroyer Chauncey in collision in the war zone early yesterday morning with a probable loss of twenty-one lives was announced today by the navy department.

No further details were given in a brief report to the department from Vice Admiral Sims. The Chauncey was a small, old type boat of only 420 tons.

On Patrol Duty. Secretary Daniels made this statement: "The Chauncey, a small American destroyer on patrol duty in foreign waters, was sunk in a collision early Monday morning.

For several years before the war the Chauncey was used only in coast defense work and was classified as a coast torpedo vessel. It was built at Philadelphia.

English May Get Rations if They Don't Hooverize
