FOR Thanksgiving Dinner—this delectable menu of tasty, flavorful, healthful dishes—each food cooked in its own rich juices—without water. And so much easier to prepare in *The Waterless Cooker*. The whole meal cooks at one time—without any watching—no danger of anything drying or scorching



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- Puritan Cream of Potato Soup**
Made in *The Waterless Cooker* the day previous; reheated, served in bouillon cup with spoon of whipped cream, dash of paprika and minced parsley garnish.
- Roast Turkey**
Use jointed turkey and fry or sear on bottom of *The Waterless Cooker* in butter until browned, then cook on bottom of *The Waterless Cooker* until tender.
- Smothered Sweet Potatoes**
Cooked in pan 1. Pare and slice; arrange in buttered pan alternately with sprinkling of maple syrup and melted butter seasoned with cinnamon.
- Brussel Sprouts**
Cook in pan 2. Add melted butter, salt and pepper, and steam, or make special drawn sauce.

- Cranberry Sherbet** *The BEST COOKS use Aluminum*
Made like any water ice, using strained cranberry pulp, sugar and water, with seasoning of clove, cinnamon and a few grains of allspice. Freeze. Serve in small sherbet cups, with turkey.
 - Pumpkin Custard**
Cooked in pan 3. Eaten cold or hot; with vanilla ice cream or sweetened whipped cream.
- RECIPE:
- 1 cup hot mashed pumpkin, 1/4 teaspoon salt,
 - 1 tablespoon butter, 2 cups rich milk,
 - 1 tablespoon flour, 1 teaspoon cinnamon,
 - Yolks 3 eggs, 1/2 teaspoon ginger or clove,
 - 4 tablespoons sugar, 3 egg whites,
 - 3 tablespoons powdered sugar.
- Mix pumpkin with butter and flour. Beat yolks with sugar, add salt, seasonings and milk, and stir into pumpkin. Whip whites very stiff and fold into first mixture. Pour into well buttered fancy tube mold and set in upper (No. 3) pan of cooker. Serve unmolded, with sweet whipped cream, fancy jelly garnish or portion of vanilla ice cream.

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
