DECISION AND AWARD OF ARBITRATION PANEL

On February 9, 1971, the undersigned, Willis A. Reinke, was appointed by the Chairman of the Employment Relations
Commission, Robert G. Howlett, as impartial chairman of a panel of arbitrators in a dispute involving the Gladwin County
Board of Commissioners and the Deputy Sheriffs of the Gladwin
County Sheriffs Department, represented by Local Union 14148,
District 50, Allied and Technical Workers. The appointment
was pursuant to Act. No 312, Public Acts of 1969. Commissioner
Robert McMahon was designated as panel member by the County
Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the County, and
Deputy Sheriff Lloyd Tyre was designated by the employees
hereinafter referred to as the Union.

A pre-hearing conference was held in Gladwin on February 22, 1971 at the Sheriffs Office in Gladwin. A hearing was held and testimony taken at the Gladwin County Office Building on March 2, 1971. Both parties were afforded full opportunity to present evidence and examine and cross examine witnesses.

DALE PURTELL, INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTIVE A verbatim record of the hearing was made by a reporter for Reliable Reporting Corporation, Midland, Michigan. Transcriptswere not ordered by the parties.

A conference was held by the Panel in Gladwin following the hearing on March 2, 1971. The decision of the Panel is unanimous.

Union Exhibit No. 1, consists of the current collective bargaining agreement between the parties. This dispute arises from a reopener for negotiation of wages and insurance. The parties stipulated that the contract was opened timely pursuant to Article XX of the agreement.

County Exhibit No. 1, consists of the Gladwin County Budget as amended for the calendar and fiscal year 1971.

Joint Exhibits #1 through #6, consist of wage and fringe benefit data for the Sheriff's Departments of Counties of Roscommon, Bay, Ogemaw, Midland, Clare, and the City of Midland Police Department.

The substance of the Union's testimony related to the duties, in general, of deputy sheriffs and to the wage and/or insurance data contained in the exhibits. The County test-imony related primarily to the County budget and in substance it appears that there is between \$2000.00 and \$3000.00 still available in the Contingency Fund.

The parties stipulated the following history of the collective under the current reopener:

The Union originally requested a \$500.00 per annum increase from \$7000.00 to \$7500.00: for the County to pay full cost of Blue Cross and Blue Shield Insurance(at the present time the employee contributes approximately \$20.00 per month.); full life insurance to replace the present policy which is confined to like of duty only.

Following protracted negotiations and finally with the assistance of State Mediator Charles Sanders, the two bargaining committees reached tentative agreement on the following:

- (a) Wages- \$250.00 per annum increase to \$7250.00
- (b) County to pay full cost of Blue Cross-Blue Shield
- (c) County to pay for \$10,000.00 life insurance for deputy sheriffs not restricted to line of duty.

The employees ratified the tentative agreement but the full Board of County Commissioners reversed their bargaining committee and refused to ratify. The proceeding arises as the result of this action.

The parties agreed on the record that they still felt the tentative agreement reached in December 1970 was fair and reasonable and that it was reached as the result of bargaining in complete good faith.

A review of the wage and insurance data for surrounding counties submitted by the parties indicates that a \$7250 salary

is not unreasonable and would place the Gladwin County Deputies roughly in the middle range. It appears to be common practice for the Counties to pay full cost of Hospital-Medical Insurance and to provide some life insurance.

Following discussion the Panel voted unanimously to reaffirm the original tentative agreement as follow:

Salary-\$7250 per annum (\$250 increase)

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Blue-Cross and Blue-Shield- County to pay full cost.

Effective as soon as possible. Deputies to be reimbursed for any payments made by them from Jan. 1, 1971

to the time when the County is able to make arrangements
to assume the full cost.

Life Insurance- \$10,000.00 not limited to line of duty. .
