Following several executive sessions of the panel of the delegates and the panel chairman, the following award is made and will appear in the record — in the official record. I have given the Reporter a copy of the document — this document reflecting resolution of the open issues. It will appear in full in the record which will be furnished by the Reporter.

MR. WHITE: I would like the record to reflect that the delegate for Teamsters Local 214 has specifically reviewed what will appear in the record and has indicated his assent with respect to that. Is that correct, Mr. Bennett?

MR. BENNETT: Yes.

MR. WHITE: You are in agreement?

MR. BENNETT: Yes.

MR. WHITE: I will stop using those, fancy words: and in addition to that, I would like the record to reflect that the two stewards for this particular bargaining unit are also aware of the terms of the stipulated award and are in agreement with that as well. I would like you to indicate that on the record, first stating your name.

MR. PROW: Yes. My name is Mike Prow. I'm the chief steward; and yes.

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MR. JURKAS: John J. Jurkas,

steward; and yes.

MR. WHITE: Do you have anything to

add. Mr. Williams?

MR. WILLIAMS: No. I don't think

there's any questions. We also agree.

THE ARBITRATOR: OK. We can

consider the hearing closed?

#### STIPULATED AWARD

All previous TA's in the record are incorporated into the contract with the Muskegon County Sheriff

Deputy Unit along with the following issues determined as a stipulated award:

SECTION 18.1 CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATES
APPENDIX A

Effective the first full pay period following January 1, 1997 - increase the hourly rate for each step by 3%.

Effective the first full pay period following

January 1. 1998 - increase the hourly rate for each step

by 2.75%.

Effective the first full pay period following

January 1, 1999 - the hourly rate for each step will be increased based upon the change in the September, 1998 index as compared to the September, 1997 index from the official Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers - United States City Average - "all items", published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

U.S. Department of Labor (1982=100), such increase shall not be less than 2.5% nor more than 4.0%.

Effective the first full pay period following

January 1. 2000 - the hourly rate for each step will be increased based upon the change in the September. 1999 index as compared to the September. 1998 index from the official Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers - United States City Average - "all items", published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

U.S. Department of Labor (1982=100), such increase shall not be less than 2.5% nor more than 4.0%.

# SECTON 21.14 RETIREMENT PLAN

During the term of this Agreement, the Employer shall provide to all permanent employees and at no cost to the employees, the State of Michigan Municipal Employees Retirement System Plan known as Benefit Program B-3 with Benefit Program identified as F55 (25)

as described in the Michigan Municipal Employees
Retirement Act.

Effective January 1. 1998, the retirement plan shall be changed to Benefit Program B-4 with Benefit Program identified as F55 (25) with a 2.18% employee contribution with such contribution deducted from the employees wage through payroll deduction, such deduction being hereby authorized by this agreement.

An employee shall be eligible to earn credit for retirement benefits effective with their date of hire provided that they are in a position scheduled to work at least ten (10) six hour days per month.

### SECTION 18.3 LONGEVITY

A. Compensation for continuous service with the County shall be provided on the basis of the following schedule:

Longevity payments shall be paid where applicable in July and December. Employees must be in pay status as of July 1 and December 1 in order to be eligible for

longevity payments.

B. Effective 1998, compensation for continuous service with the County shall be provided on the basis of the following schedule:

Years of Continuous Service As Of December 1 <u>Of Each Year</u>

Amount of Payment

5 years

\$250.00

For each completed year after 5 years

\$50.00 additional

Longevity payment shall be paid where applicable in December. Employees must be in pay status as of December 1 in order to be eligible for longevity payments.

C. An employee on leave of absence without pay during the period who retires under MERS during the period or who dies during the period. Will be paid a pro-rata payment based on hours worked during the period. An employee who separates from County service during the period for any other reason, shall receive no payment.

### SECTION 19.3 RETIREE'S INSURANCE

The Employer shall provide hospitalization and medical insurance for individual retirees hired prior to January 1. 1994. who go from County employment immediately into retirement under the MERS Plan. In

addition. active retirees' dependents will be allowed to participate in the Employer's group health insurance program. but cost for coverage for any retiree's dependents shall be paid by the retiree.

The County will pay for individual retiree's coverage based on the following schedule for all bargaining unit employees hired on or after January 1, 1994.
