Prior to the hearing Mr. Lange requested the Commission for a unit clarification hearing as related to the correction officers and secretaries. The parties agreed to proceed without waiting for the results of such a request.

At the outset of the hearing, the parties agreed on those contractual issues on

which there was agreement. They were incorporated in Joint Exhibit No. 2.

The parties exchanged their proposed lists of comparable communities prior to the

hearing. Exhibits on all the remaining outstanding issues were exchanged at the

hearing.

The exchange of last best offers at the outset of the hearing resulted in extensive

off-the-record discussion by the parties. As a result, the hearing was closed after

the exchange of exhibits.

The panel was convened immediately thereafter. All decision criteria specified in

the Act were carefully considered with particular emphasis on (c) the Employer's

ability to pay and (h) traditional considerations in collective bargaining.

The panel's deliberations resulted in the following decisions:

Duration of Agreement

Decision: The parties stipulated to a one-year agreement.

Wages

Decision: The Union's proposal for a 3% wage increase effective June 1, 1989 for all classifications including Clerk Typist, Correctional Dispatcher, Correctional Officer, Deputy and Detective is accepted. This also applies to the Correctional Corporal.
