Caseville Community Christmas Fund seeks gifts

Donations are now being sought for the new Caseville Community Christmas Fund being organized by local churches, according to Coordinator Janice Prill.

"The work of Santa Claus will continue this year, since the churches of our community are compiling and delivering Christmas food baskets for the needy in our community," she says.

In the past, most of Caseville's service clubs and churches made contributions toward this annual project, and deliveries were coordinated by the Ralph Ross family. Since he is unable to do so this year, the new group is being formed.

"We want you to know the work will continue," the group says in a letter to area groups, "and you're invited to continue your faithful contribution to this work."

The Community Christmas Fund notes the system will work much as it has in the past, with minor changes.

This year, persons delivering the food, toy and clothes baskets will not be wearing a Santa suit, plus the deliveries will be divided among several persons in several churches, rather than just by one person. "We felt it was just too much to expect of any one person," organizer Rev. Brent McCumons of Caseville United Methodist Church says.

If you desire to help this project bring a brighter Christmas to many persons in our community, you may contact your minister or Coordinator Janice Prill at 856-2602 for your gift of food and money, organizers say.

The organizing group has opened an account at NewCentury Bank and records will be kept of donations and distributions.

All checks should be made payable to "Caseville Community Christmas Fund," and organizers thank people for their expected assistance.

Donations should be sent to the Christmas Fund in care of P.O. Box 563, Caseville, MI 48725.

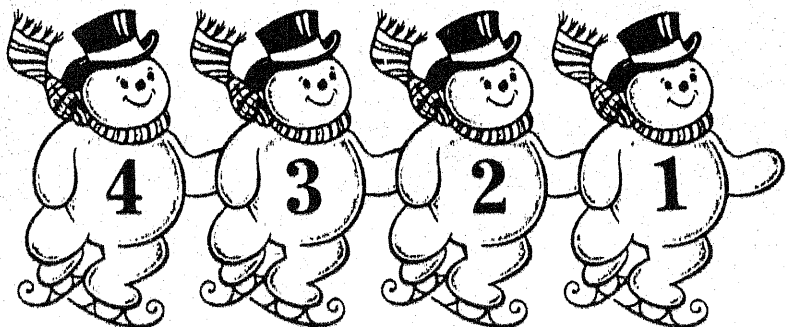
Community Christmas Bazaar Saturday

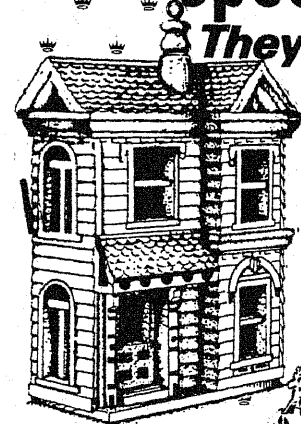
Proceeds from the bazaar will benefit area churches and community projects, according to the sponsoring organization, the First United Methodist Women of Pigeon.

Lakers bounce Hatchets from tourney

Any doubts about the determination of the Laker girls basketball team to claim their district tournament, were laid to rest with an overwhelming 60-47 victory over Bad Axe on Monday night.

opening baskets, Lakers held the Hatchets scoreless for over 5 1/2 minutes at the end of the first quarter and beginning of the second period. The visiting green and white team kept piling up the points, however, to take a 30-9 advantage into the lockerroom at halftime.

The Hatchets refused to toss in the towel in the second half, but couldn't narrow the Laker lead to less than 18 points until the closing minutes of the game. Hatchet Coach John Olsen had an answer to what a

coach tells his team when trailing 30-9 at the midpoint of the game. "We had a talk about showing pride and playing the whole game," he said. "I was really proud of the way our team played in the second half," added the Bad Axe mentor.

An injury to the Shelly Havens, the second leading rebounder on the Hatchet squad, undoubtedly contributed to Laker's control of the boards, but Olsen refused to make excuses and credited Lakers with an outstanding performance.

Laker Coach Paul Beachy also praised the gritty determination of Bad Axe after halftime with an overwhelming task staring the Hatchets in the face. "I'll give them credit for the way they played in the second half," Beachy said. "A balanced scoring attack and outstanding offensive rebounding were cited by the Laker coach as the keys to his team's victory."

McLellan coached Laker teams to a 39-3 record for the past four years, including four consecutive Thumb B championships, three state playoff invitations and a state championship in 1981.

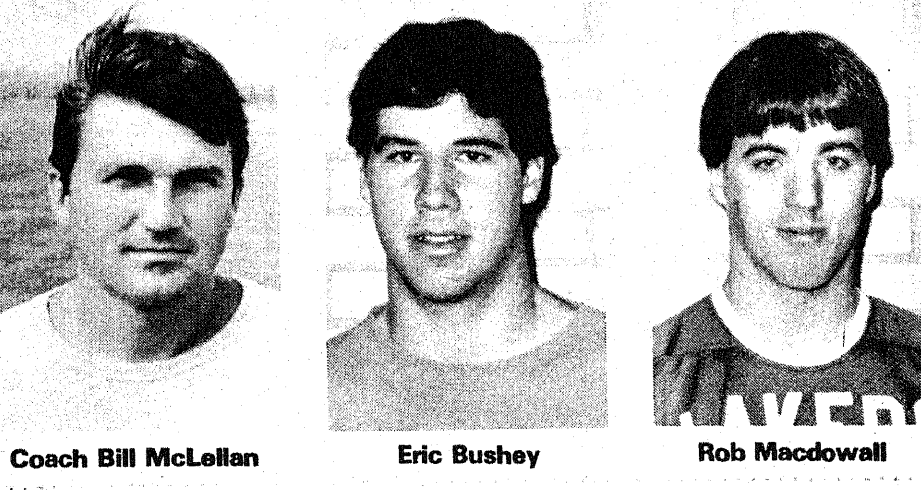

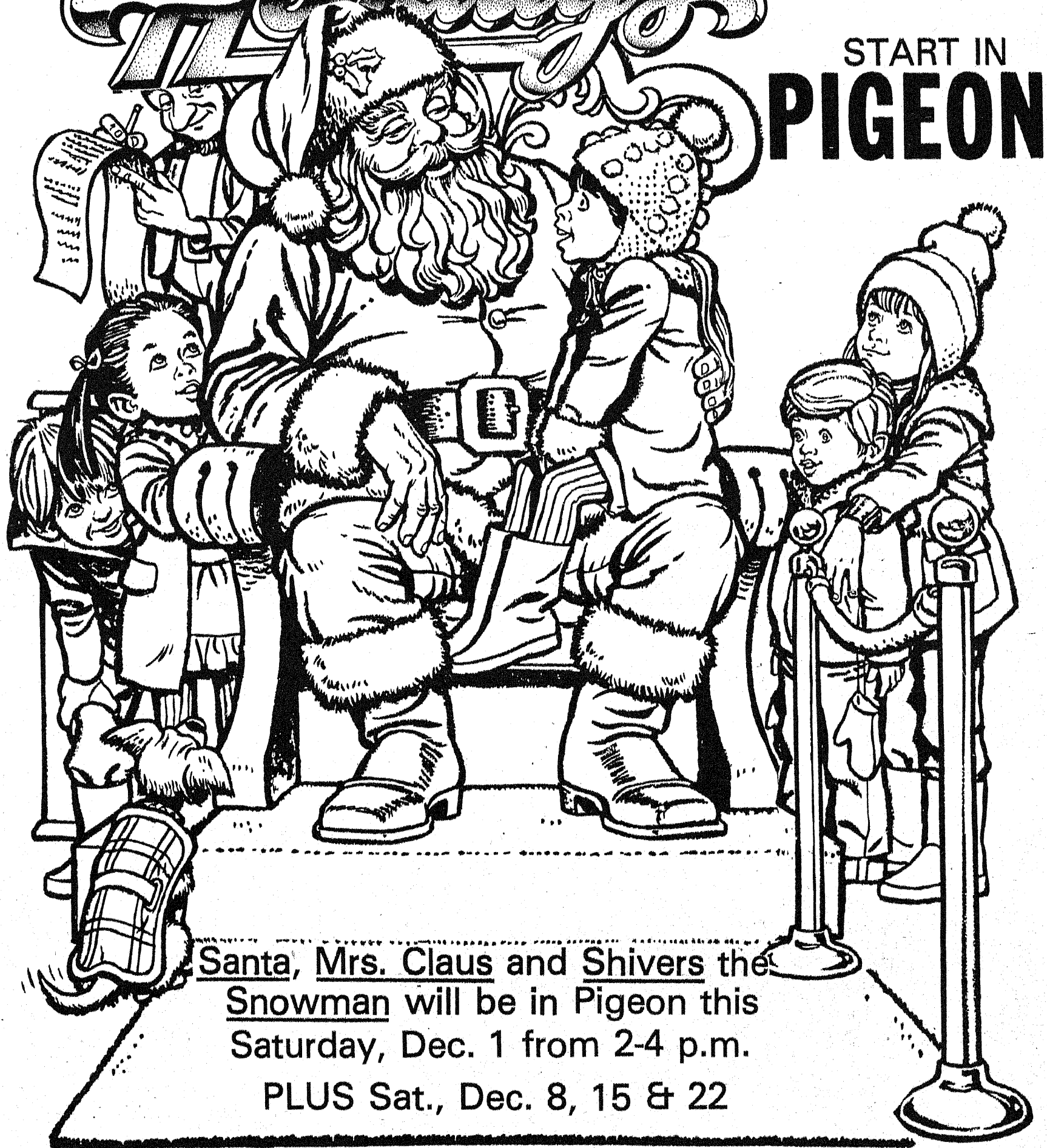
