Knock, knock . . . It's your Census taker!

By AMY HEIDEN

By now, everyone knows the U.S. Census is well underway, as the government attempts to count every person in the United States.

The Census Bureau doesn't ask questions about income, number of rooms in a home, or the number and relation of persons living in a home just to be nosy, census officials say. The Constitution requires a census every ten years -- and a lot rides on the

Congressional districts are realigned because of population increases or decreases, and federal money is often doled out on the basis of the number of people living in

ABOVE AVERAGE: The population in many areas will be counted using only the short census form since five of six homes nationally can get by with the short form.

But in Huron County, every other home will be questioned using the long form, even if they got a short form in the mail. Čensus workers say that's because Huron has been singled out as one of a handful statewide to provide greater detail.

And no matter the length of the form, every home will be visited by an enumerator, crew leader Eva Bannick.




