Pigeon residents moved one step closer to a curbside trash recycling program Monday night when Village Council members voted to change collection companies.

Council agreed to sign a three-year trash collection contract with Waste Management of Michigan - Mideast, of Almont, turning down another year with Cove Sanitation of Bad Axe, which has had Pigeon's trash contract for nearly six years.

Waste Management's trash collection bid was \$7.40 per household per month for the first year, beginning July 1. It rises to \$7.99 in the second year and again to \$8.63 in the third year -- but Project Manager Joseph Campbell said his company will stand by those rates, no matter how trash pickup costs rise.

Like many other communities, Pigeon has seen trash charges double in the past four years as state and national agencies crack down on waste disposal sites, which can drive up costs.

Even though Waste Management's bid was higher than the one-year bid of \$7.25 by incumbent trash company Cove, Pigeon Council member Mike Gehrs said Waste Management has the kind of future plans which Pigeon is looking for.

"They have better equipment and seem to be more dependable," he said of Waste Management, a worldwide company whose stock is listed on the New York Stock Exchange. The company collects trash in Elkton, Caseville, Sebewaing, Cass City and 27 Thumb communities, Campbell says.

Following lengthy discussion, Campbell said his company would offer a \$1 monthly discount for senior citizens 60 or older who have very little collectible trash -plus his bid includes no charge for homes where residents are gone one month or longer.

There are approximately 450 addresses in Pigeon, resulting in about \$3300 in monthly charges, which are billed by the village to each household.

RECYCLING SET AUG. 1: The most intriguing part of the Waste Management plan is a pilot recycling plan, set to start in Pigeon on Aug. 1.

The company will provide recycling containers to 100 sample homes, where residents throw newspapers, glass, aluminum and plastic containers for weekly curbside pickup, Campbell said. Company workers separate the recyclable items as they are collected, and income received from the items sold

"So, we hope to keep costs down for residents by getting back this money," member Cliff Pobanz said.

Pigeon Council plans to negotiate with the company during the next year to establish a curbside recycling plan throughout town. Campbell says the additional expense of such a system will add about \$1 to \$2 per month to trash collection costs per household -- but Gehrs noted "recycling is ahead of us. I feel very good that they can offer what we want in the future."

The final figures are in on assessments in the Laker school district, and as predicted, school officials will be forced to roll back their millage in accordance with the Headlee Tax Limitation Amendment.

Supt. Bob Drury told the Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port Board of Education at its Monday meeting that assessments in the district had risen 6.4% overall, with agriculture rising the most at an average 8.0%

Residential assessments rose an average of 7.97%, according to figures from the **Huron County Equalization**

Because SEVs (State Equalized Valuations) rose faster than the rate of inflation for 1990, the district will have to roll back its millage levy from 29.02 mills to 28.93 mills. That millage rate includes 5 mills that were approved by voters in 1986, 7.5 mills first approved in 1987,

and a 3.77 additional millage request in 1988.

A separate 16.27 mill renewal request on the June 10 annual election is not subject to the Headlee Amendment, Drury said, because it will be voted on after May 31.

Total SEVs for the district total \$170.25 million, which would generate \$4.94 million in revenue if the full 29.02 mills were levied, Drury said.

But with 28.93 mills levied, revenues would fall over \$15,000, to \$4.925 million.

The district will be in a deficit situation for the 1991-92 fiscal year, because expenditures will outstrip revenues, he said. That deficit will be made up from the district's cumulative fund balance of \$790,000, Drury said.

The Laker Board approved a recommendation from the insurance committee to change its property and casualty insurance to a policy through the Michigan Association of School Boards, which would provide replacement coverage for the district's buildings, their contents, and any other structures.

Currently, the district's insurance provides a maximum dollar amount of insurance coverage, but the new policy would pay to replace any destroyed buildings and its contents at replacement cost.


The total value of the district's buildings is over \$14.9 million, according to assessments by MASB appraisers. The new coverage would add an additional \$2,000 to the district's insurance bill of \$22,000 per year. The district will be paying a pro-rated payment of \$921 for coverage until the beginning of the new school year in September.

A request from the Village of Pigeon was approved to build a bandshell on property leased by the village and owned by the district.

Both walleye and perch fishing have been slow during the past week on Saginaw Bay. Some good walleye action was still to be had on the Tittabawassee River and fair perch fishing was reported at Port Austin. Chinook fishing was reported to be good at Harbor Beach.

Anglers fishing in Michigan's Great Lakes are being asked to "be on the lookout" for adipose fin clipped trout and salmon by the Fisheries Division of the DNR. Species with clipped adipose fins include chinook salmon, rainbow trout and lake trout. The adipose fin clip indicates that a microscopic wire tag may have been implanted in the snout of hatchery-raised fish. Anglers who catch these fin-clipped fish are asked to return the head as well as the length, weight, locations and date caught to the DNR. 
