

Equalization Reports push Huron higher; Tuscola is stable

 Equalization reports were presented to Huron and County Commissioners last week — and rates are rising still higher in Huron particularly.

Although the rates for Huron County assessments were reported earlier this year, six townships will have to add over \$5 million to their assessments.

Huron Equalization Director Sandra Drews recommended adding \$5.02 million to assessments because "assessors were deficient in their assessments" — and county commissioners approved her recommendations.

"I have no reason to believe that the State Tax Commission will either add value or subtract from the county equalization value that I am advocating," said Drews.

"I am certain that the county equalized value recommended by the State Tax Commission will be adopted by the State Tax Commission on May 24."

Townships to see increases are: Fair Haven, Gore, Huron, Meade, Pointe Aux Barques and Port Austin.

Fair Haven Township will see additions of \$530,082 to ag and \$330,141 to residential.

Gore Township's additions are \$57,922 to ag and \$457,223 to residential. Huron Township's additions are \$379,127 to ag. Meade Township's addition is \$672,482 to residential.

Pointe Aux Barques Township's addition is \$877,645 to residential.

Previously, Port Austin Township's average residential assessment increase was estimated at 21.1%; Fair Haven Township's residential was increased was 13.8% and ag was raised 22.8%. Pointe Aux Barques Township's residential increase was estimated at 84%.

Huron County's proposed SEV increased by \$94.14 million of real and personal property from last year. This year's SEV is \$659.9 million, which is up from last year's of \$765.7 million because of new construction and in-

creased values, noted Drews. However, the June 2 Proposal A statewide ballot issue on revamping property taxes, could change the impact of assessments and taxes.

In Tuscola County, there were no assessment rate changes to what had been reported in the preliminary assessment estimates.

Those first numbers showed a 7.43% increase over last year. "This actually represents a three-year increase because of assessments being frozen," said Tuscola Equalization Director Ed Karr.

Tuscola's total SEV is \$725.3 million, up from \$675.01 million the previous year. "The increase is due to new construction and increased values," said Karr. "There was about \$11 million in new construction during the last year."
