

Rev. Nathan Bickel ordained at St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Bach

Rev. Nathan Mark Bickel, 43, was ordained Sunday, June 27, and then installed as pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Bach.

He and Mrs. Bickel and daughters, Cara 12 and Alison 10, have moved into the parsonage next door. Rev. Allen Freundt of Cass City was installer, Rev. Scott Johnson of Fairgrove was liturgist and Vicar Timothy Loewe, a native of Port Austin, was crucifer.

Pastor Bickel was born in Omer on Jan. 10, 1950, the son of Doris and the late Rev. Elmer E. Bickel.

He attended parochial school in Tawas City and Bay City, graduated from Bay City Central High and received his BA Degree in communications and history from Western Michigan University in 1972.

He was employed in Kalamazoo, St. Joseph and Glendora and worked as counselor and employment specialist in a federal program in Niles. He and Anne McCarty were married in Elmore, OH, in 1979.

Pastor Bickel attended Concordia Seminary in Fort Wayne, IN, and completed academic requirement in

spring, 1992.

He vicaried at Grace Lutheran Church, Coopersville, until June, 1993. He received his call from St. Peter Church and was ordained and installed in the Sunday afternoon service at Bach.

A reception and supper followed the service. St. Peter's of Bach was organized Feb. 11, 1912, as the third daughter congregation of Immanuel Lutheran Church of Sebewaing.

Pastor C. J. Umbach of Immanuel agreed to serve as pastor of the young congregation until a resident pastor could be called.

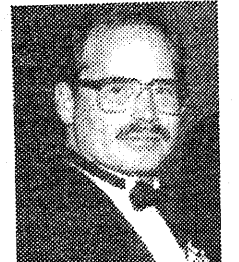
LILLIAN SKONIECZNY 1917 - 1993

Toxic training after 'accident' successful

Tragedy struck about 5 p.m. Thursday on M-46 west of Oak Road in Tuscola County, when a school bus with 12 passengers collided with truck transporting toxic chemicals.

But it was all just a simulation—a training session for Tuscola County Central Dispatch, Caro Community Hospital, Tuscola Emergency Operations Center, Vassar Area Ambulance Service, the Tuscola Sheriff Department, Michigan State Police Post of Caro, the Emergency Management division of the State Police and the state Department of Natural Resources.

"Each year the Federal Emergency Management Agency requires each county exercise their Emergency Operations Plan," said Tuscola Sheriff's Deputy James Jashinske, Tuscola's Emergency Service director. "Once every four years, a full-scale exercise is required."

The accident involved the chemical Hydrogen Sulfide (H2S). Participating company was Total Pipeline Corp., which has several

wells in the county especially in the Akron and Wisner Areas.

The simulation also gave the company a chance to test its emergency response system.

Jashinske noted the simulation could easily become a reality because the Total Pipeline Corporation's tankers carrying H2S frequently travel in the county.

"H2S is a highly toxic, colorless gas that is heavier than air and has the odor of rotten eggs and comes from the production and refining of high sulphur petroleum," said Jashinske.

"It can cause almost instantaneous asphyxia with respiratory paralysis in a few sections and death."

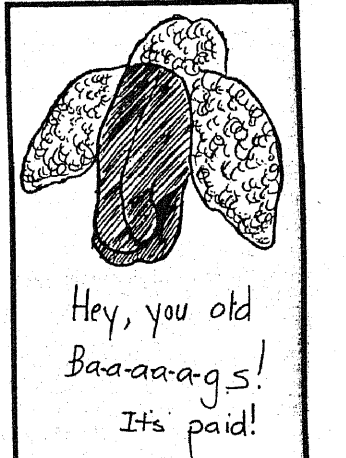
