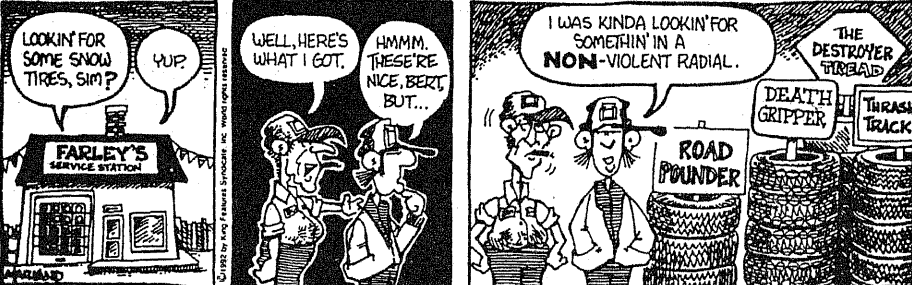

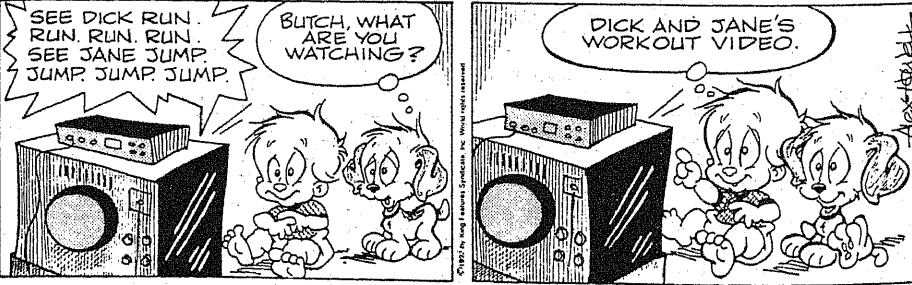

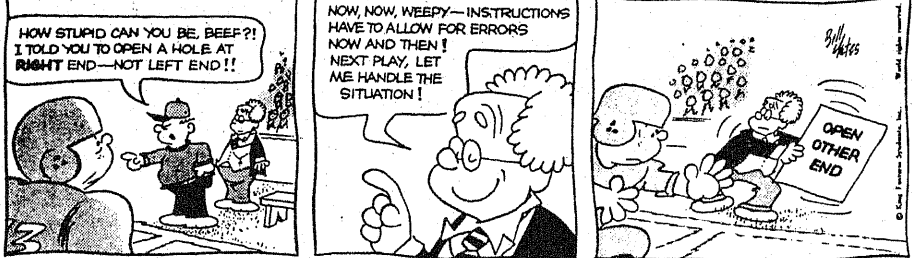

That's Unionville's Bill Eremia Making friends... in 2 languages!

At first glance, Unionville seems an unlikely place to need the use of a foreign language, but it is — especially as American's melting pot.

Thousands of migrant workers travel to Michigan each summer to work in fields and orchards. Not all of these migrant workers speak English fluently.

William R. Eremia, 22 of Unionville, has had plenty of opportunities to use his foreign language skills at the former American Home Bank, where he worked as a teller this past summer.

Eremia took two years of French before graduating from USA High School in 1989, and he continued taking French at Alma College. During his studies, he has learned Spanish and is working on learning German, too.

Bank officials and co-workers said they feel Eremia's language skills are an asset. "His knowing Spanish has been a big help," said Eremia's supervisor Carol Heidt, assistant bank vice president.

"If they have questions or if we have to explain something to them, he has been a big help in conversing with them."

"By knowing Spanish, I've gotten to know them personally and they are really wonderful people. When you are talking to them in their own language, they are more comfortable and you can really see the person they are."

Although Eremia was fluent in French, he said he wanted to learn another language. "I picked Spanish because

I wanted to learn another foreign language because I made up my mind I want to go into international business," said Eremia. "I don't think I will go into banking, but I'm majoring in international business."

While he was living in Spain, he helped from French travelers who were lost by translating from Spanish to French.

Eremia hasn't had any opportunities to use French in Unionville, but he has used some German to greet a few customers.

"My German isn't good enough yet to do much with, but I have conversed some with the older Germans who are customers and with some people who moved to the area from Europe," Eremia said, noting he would recommend that everyone study another language and visit a foreign country.

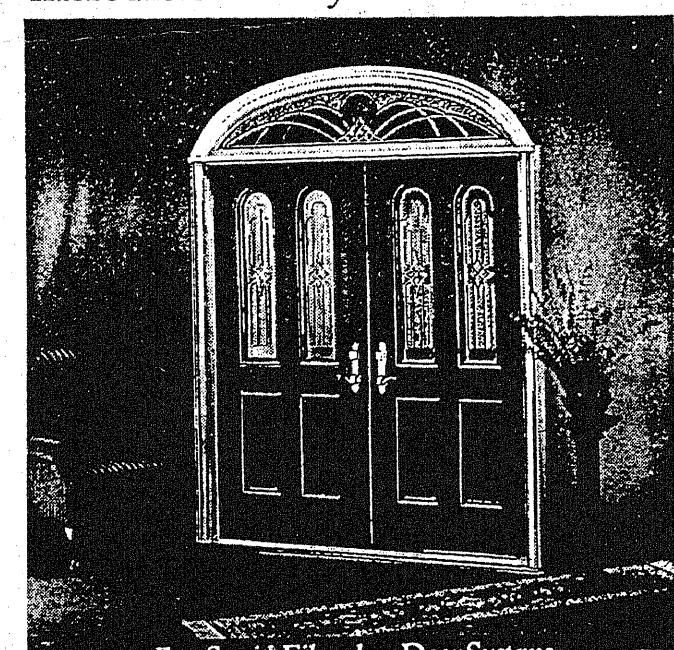
