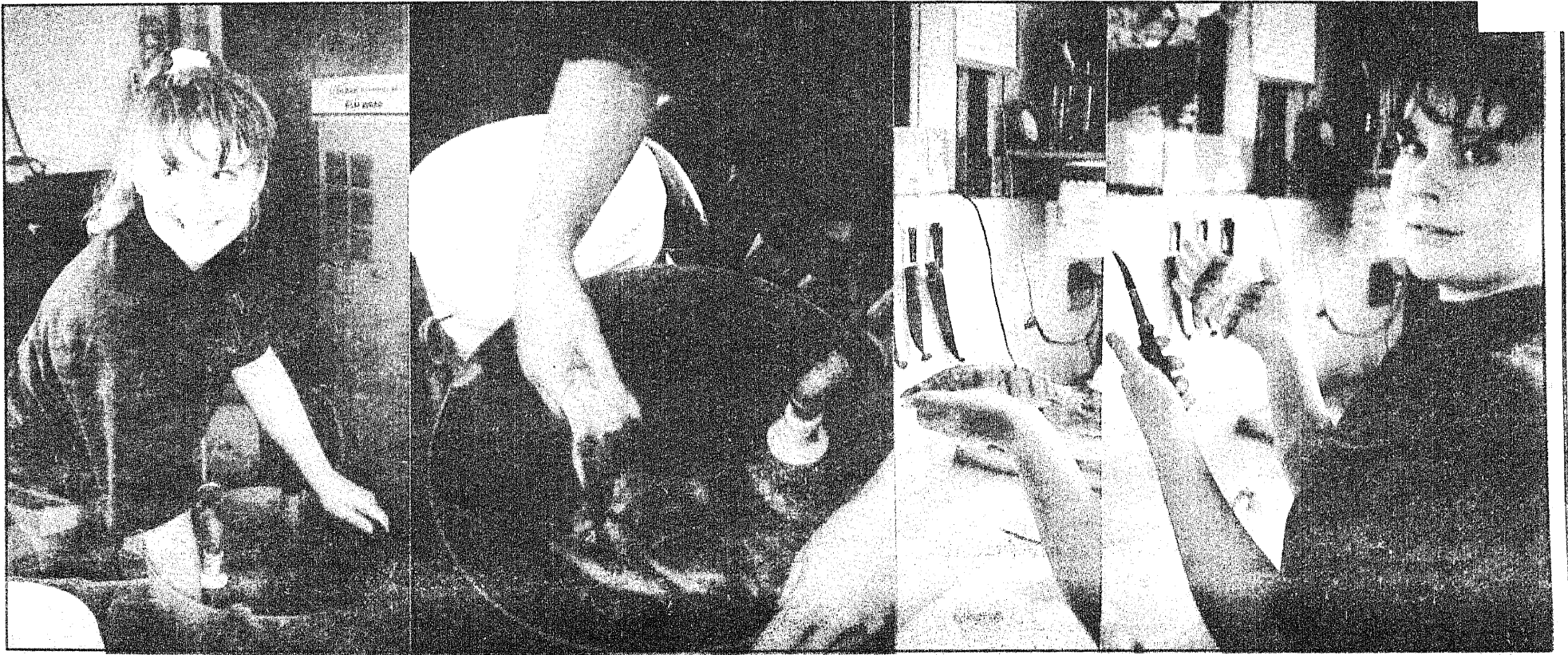

Is this the fastest fish filleter in the Thumb

When you conjure up an image of a fish filleter, it's usually a barreled-chested man with a two-day growth and a pinch of snuff inside his bottom lip.

That's why a few uninformed visitors to the Thumb Fish Company just south of Sebewaing only ask for scaling when they drop off their day's catch to be cleaned.

Their decision may come from the fact that instead of some expected macho fish cleaner, the company's filleter is a perky 22-year-old named Jessica Schwartz.

However, if they happen to be around when one of her repeat customers tosses his bucket of perch on the floor, they are in for a show which usually changes their mind.

It wasn't always this way.

Five years ago, when Jessica's parents Jim and Joyce Schwartz of Sebewaing bought the Thumb Fish Company, she would not go beyond the front door.

"I couldn't stand the smell," she says, flashing a big smile. "When I delivered my dad's lunch, he would have to meet me outside."

Schwartz's affliction for the fish smell did not last long, for as the business grew she was pressed into cash register duty.

"I finally got over the fish smell," she says, "and when business was slow I would watch my dad and Terry Jahr fillet fish for customers."

She remembers that it didn't look all that difficult and then one day, she found a stray perch someone had left in the scaler.

With the curiosity of the young girl she was, she headed for the fillet board and grab a knife from the rack on the wall.

"I really butchered that first fish," she says with a laugh. "But then, as I practiced on a few more, I got better and faster."

That was four years ago, and now Schwartz — with her flashing smile and flashing knife — will reduce a pile of perch into delightful fillets in a matter of minutes.

She credits her father for her first filleting lessons.

"I would watch every move he made," she says, "And then try to imitate what he did."

She also got lots of tips from the fishermen who didn't want to get their hands dirty.

Using tidbits from her dad and the anglers, Schwartz developed a style of her own which staggers the imagination with both the speed of her filleting and the finished product.

Instead of the blunt-end,

banana-shaped knife often associated with filleting perch, Schwartz uses a short, thin Normark fillet knife.

Her first move with the instrument is two quick cuts behind each set of gills, then a long, deep cut along the

backbone, a short flick to release the meat from the tail and then one side is sliced to the belly skin.

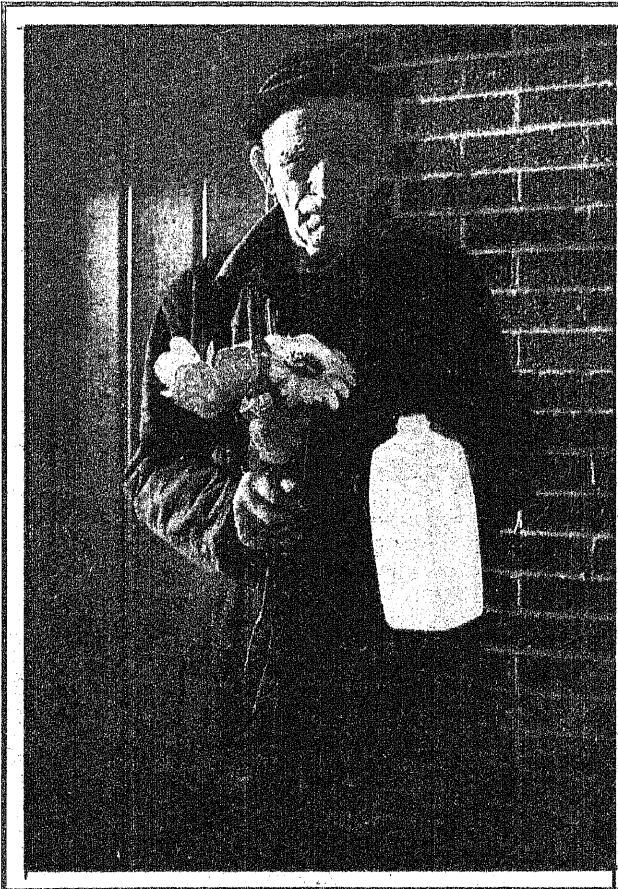
The perch is flipped and the same procedure is applied to the opposite side.

The entire process is measured in seconds as she nonchalantly tosses a perfect butterfly fillet in the pan and reaches for another fish.

She minds the Thumb Fish Company during the day, her dad helps out after supper

and on weekends, and she generally fillets fish from November through May.

After work, she heads to Delta College to work on a degree leading to a career as a physical therapist's assistant.

"I'm taking my time," the 1990 USA graduate says, "I'll probably fillet for another four years before I get finished with my education."

"I really like working here," she says. "I especially like the fishermen. They're easy to talk with, and I think they're impressed with my ability to fillet fish so fast."

She remembers one fisherman commenting that he thought the knife she used had to be the secret to her success.

However, when she saw him later, he confessed that even though he had bought his wife the same type of knife, she

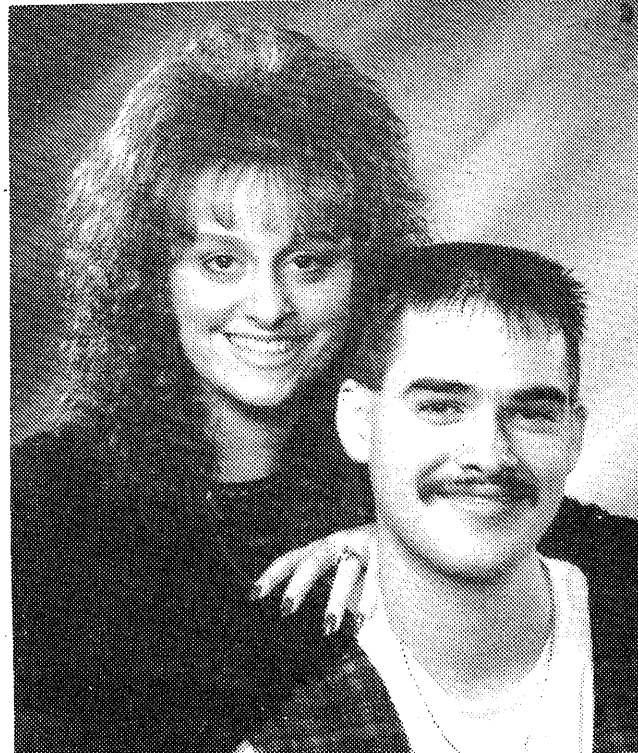

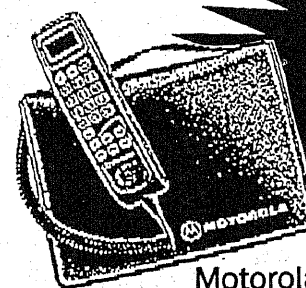

USA School gets computer network

Armed with \$400,000 in technology improvement funds from a recent millage, members of the newly-formed USA Technology Committee took a bold step when they ignored recommendations from the school's architectural firm — and decided to solve their problems with local resources.

Faced with numerous problems and without appropriate answers, committee members turned to past USA High School graduates, now working in technology fields, for direction.

In the end — and to their benefit — they got more than they bargained for. The first contact, made last spring, was directed to Scott Thede, USA class of '82, who is presently employed by Ferris State University as their CAD Systems Integrator for the College of Technology.

As committee members chatted about the future project Thede sought input from a friend, Kris Tessin, who is the Library Systems Integrator at Ferris — and deals daily with the media-centered ideas sought by the school system.

Soon, school personnel toured the Ferris facilities, and got a first-hand view of what an updated network could do for the USA School District. Committee members were so impressed that they offered Thede the job of Project Manager on the spot.

After meeting with FSU officials, Thede and Tessin were given a series of consulting options to work on the project.

A project of this magnitude was simply too much for two people to handle, so it wasn't long before Fred

Sharpsteen, a Walbro employe and local computer whiz, and J.D. McBrayer, an accountant with St. Mary's Hospital in Saginaw, both '82 USA graduates, were brought on the team.

A division of duties placed Thede in charge of the computer hardware and installation, Tessin managed the software and media information and assisted with the installation, McBrayer dealt with financial matters, while Sharpsteen became the local support person.

The project team soon found the school's expectations were higher than the budget allowed so the committee set priorities and cut where cuts had to be made.

Work began with the re-wiring of the middle and high schools and the installation of a voice data network. This concept uses the same wire for phone and computers and is able to tie the entire school together using phones, computers and intercom systems.

This enhancement allowed infrastructure flexibility and 25% of the budget was used to add computers and/or phones to offices and classrooms.

The team then installed a new phone system, using the new five-line system which gives the capabilities of having 96 phones within the schools. An added feature was to connect the phone set-up to the intercom system.

Further work included the completion of a computer lab, the installation of a file server, and the attachment of a CD ROM tower to the file server. All of these promote the concept of shared resources. The library was equipped with an on-line catalog system, making the old card catalog method of finding books obsolete.

Main software for the school system is Microsoft Word for Windows while E-Mail and Internet are accessible for employes and students alike.

"What we created was a mini Ferris," Thede says.

Although most of the system is up and running, team members will hold additional in-service days for teachers and administrators at the end of September. That way, personnel in the new middle school will be in place and have had a chance to experiment with the system.

However, the real proof of the new system lies in the preparation of USA students for the technology of today's society.

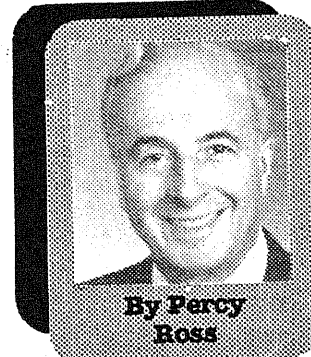

If you accomplish nothing else today, buying your son a new bed with the check I'm sending will definitely be a

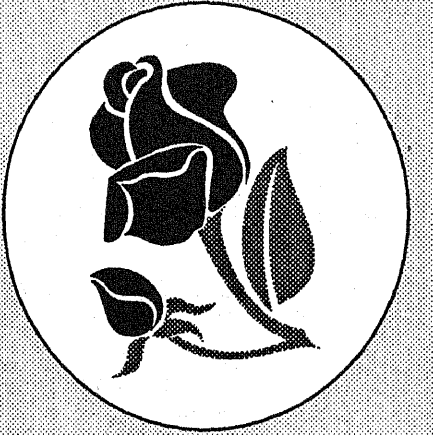

My View From Here:

Acquiring assistance dog - part 4

We got up before 4 a.m. on Oct. 6, 1993 so we could get ready to go, having breakfast before boarding the ferry at 6:15 a.m., on the way to getting my guide dog Yasha. After packing, we went to a restaurant near the docks to eat. Then, we boarded the ferry, getting settled in our stateroom for the four-hour trip to Manitowac, Wisc. As the ferry floated across Lake Michigan, we read,

rested and snacked — when we weren't outside watching the skyline and water. It was cloudy with rain periodically, so there wasn't much to see.

We were dressed for the cold and windy weather, since I had been told to wear warm clothing when I made our reservations. So we enjoyed the fresh air and conversing with other passengers who were outside.

When the ferry docked at Manitowac, we were glad to get back in the van and on the road again. Even though we

had cut off many miles and much driving time by taking the ferry, there was still a long way to go, to Jud, N.D.

While continuing on the road, we admired the beautiful scenery and fall colors. We decided to stay at a motel on the other side of the Twin Cities in Minnesota, since we were tired and it was getting dark.

We found a motel that was handicapped-accessible, rented a room, unpacked and plugged in my Amigo to charge for the night. By the time we got there, both of us

were exhausted, even though we had stopped to stretch, get gas and have coffee or eat several times that day.

On Oct. 7, 1993, I awoke full of anticipation — knowing we would arrive at Great Plains Assistance Dogs soon. I was anxious to meet Yasha and get settled in our new home for the next three weeks of training.

After having a continental breakfast, we made sure we had our mugs full of coffee... and got back on the road.

The scenery became more and more barren, but the weather was sunny and clear, although cool. When we stopped for lunch, there were a lot of people in the restaurant, but the area looked desolate.
