### \$2.9 MM estimate for Laker elementary renovations

More than \$2.9 million would be needed to renovate the four elementary school buildings in the Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port "Laker" School District — in the villages of Elkton, Pigeon and Bay Port.

That's the architects' estimate of the cost to bring the buildings up to current code requirements, make the buildings barrier-free and do major repairs on the buildings.

Dan LePan of the architectural firm of Toshach, Sobszak, Spence and Forsythe told the Laker Board of Education that the cost doesn't include making structural changes in classrooms, such as removing walls to make rooms bigger. Parking lot improvements are not included in that list of renovations, either.

In renovating the buildings, all windows would be replaced, all tile would be replaced with linoleum, adding carpet to kindergarten and first-grade classrooms, replacing all bathroom fixtures and water fountains, and removing all barriers to the handicapped in restrooms and classrooms. An elevator would be added to the multi-story building in Elkton to make it completely barrier-free.

State law says that any renovations done on old buildings must bring the building up to current code requirements.

Supt. Robert Drury said industry experts say that if renovation costs approach 50% of the cost of a new building, renovation would not make sense from a cost-effective standpoint.

"There are other factors here besides the dollars and cents factor," Drury said. "The Board is going to be sensitive to removing education from the villages. If it were strictly up to the board, they would probably choose a new building."

"But it's more than that. We're proceeding, but we're pro-

## She LOVES teaching line-dancing

Ever hear of the Traverse City Shuffle, Watermelon Crawl, Tush Push, or the Third Rock Hip-Hop?

Can you do a grapevine? A shuffle? A hook? A quarter turn? Or perhaps, a jazz square?

If you have and can, you are one of the thousands who are caught up in the largest dance craze since rock and roll.

If you haven't or don't know how — welcome to Line Dancing.

Its beginning is shrouded in mystery, according to unofficial dance historians.

It may have descended from clogging, the solo dancing style which is almost as old as the Appalachian valleys from whence it came.

Or maybe it was born out of the old soft shoe shuffles so prevalent in our country's southland.

But, it's most probably developed when some lonesome cowboy (or cowgirl) couldn't find a partner for the Texas Two-Step... and decided to go it alone.

Its birthplace may well have been Gilley's, the popular cowboy bar in Austin, Tex., made more famous after the 1980s movie "Urban Cowboy."

But since its inception, line dancing has spread across the country faster than the

chicken pox in a kindergarten class — leaving in its wake thousands of satisfied dancers.

The Western Thumb's connection to line dancing is best found in Chris Hoppe of Unionville. This dance instructor discovered the dance while recovering from a divorce.

"It was a way to get out and meet new people," she says, "and, more importantly, it was something that could be done as an individual."

Hoppe fell in love with line dancing and soon met a transplant Texan from Wurtsmith Air Force Base who became her teacher.

Within a short time she was ready to give lesson herself and found the perfect vehicle for her new talent in the USA Enrichment Classes taught at the local high school.

Her popularity spread and today she is in great demand, not only in the enrichment classes, but with other organizations who use her, and her dance classes, as fund raisers.

While Hoppe is not teaching dance classes she is busy as a full time Community Relations Coordinator of the Huron County Health Department. She's also a full-time mom for three children and a part time Coordinator of the USA Enrichment Classes.

"I won't be giving any classes this summers," she says, "Or at least, not until track and softball are over."

Her last class of the spring will be for the Sebawaing

Sportsman's Club on Friday, May 19.

## B-K kids learning 'truck geography'

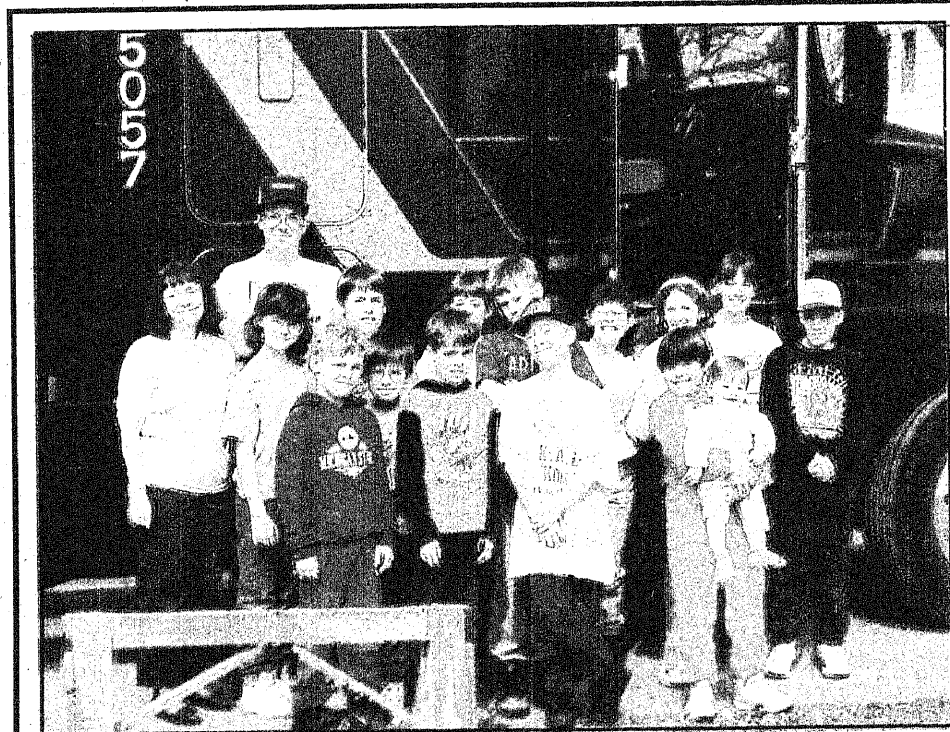

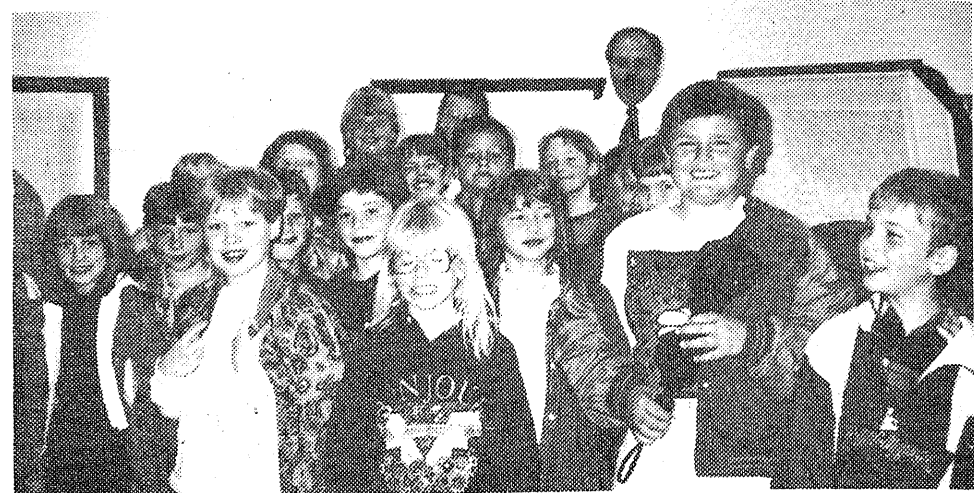
John Henry and Paul Bunyan in words and song.

involved two six-week sessions.

"The first one had 100 dancers in it," she says, shaking her head in disbelief, "and the second, more than 80."

Every other Sunday, this winter, she also taught a class at the Unionville Moravian Church.

The one-night affairs, like that coming to Sebewaing, are unique. The dance class is held from 7 to 8 p.m. for a small fee. Then, for another small fee, you can dance from 8 p.m. to midnight.

"Line dancers are the friendliest people you'll ever meet," Hoppe says. "If you see someone who looks sad, it's just because they are concentrating on the steps."

Hoppe continually stresses smiling during her dance classes.

"Dancing is fun," she says, "People shouldn't worry about making a mistake, or forgetting a step."

"If you make a mistake, start over and catch up," she adds.

Hoppe also promotes line dancing as being easy, with everyone able to do it.

"I don't care if they have two left feet," she says, "If they want to, they can do it."

Several years ago, a roller rink in Bridgeport was one of

the few line dancing spots in the area that wasn't in a bar.

"These kind of dances are really family affairs," Hoppe says. "There are people of all ages, no smoking, and usually no alcohol served."

"People can't drink and line dance," Hoppe says smiling, "It's sort of like driving and drinking."

Hoppe is quick to point out that line dancing has become a good escape for people who are alone, or for a couple where one partner does not like to dance.

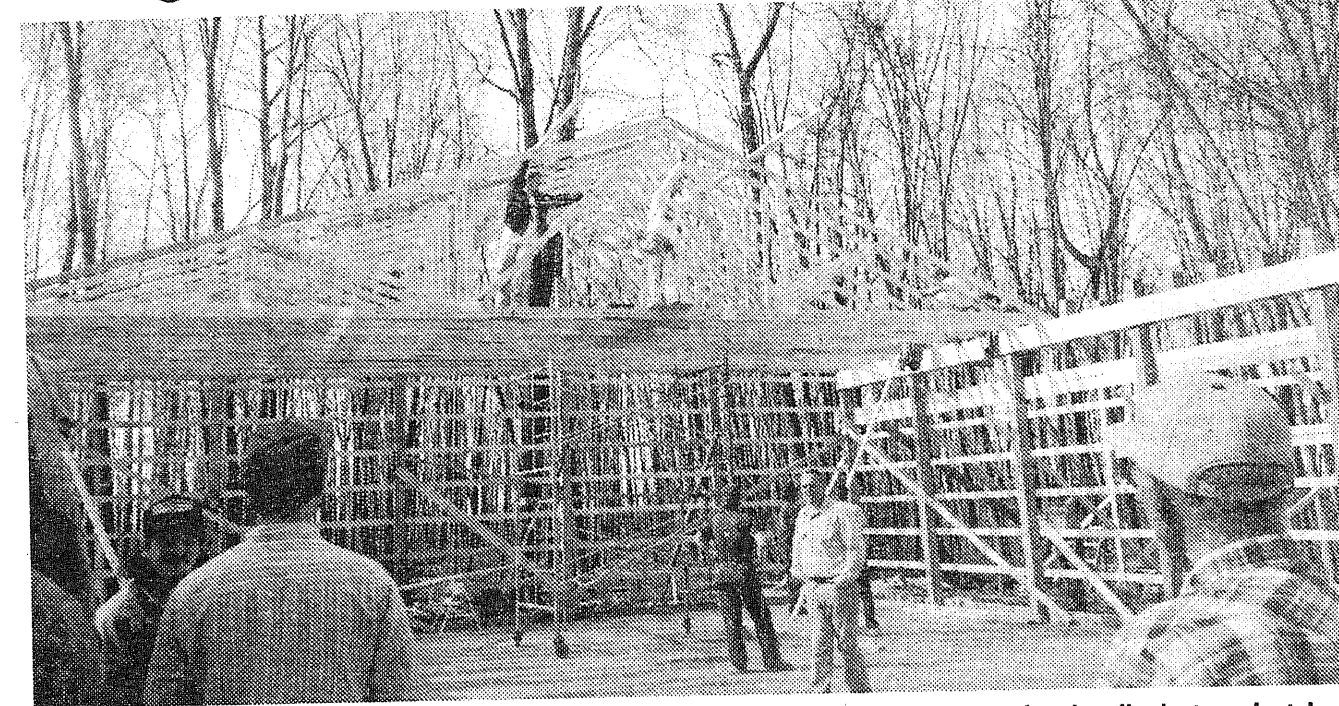
"There are loads of married women who fit this category," she says, "And line dancing provides an activity which does not place them in a compromising situation which may put a strain on their marriage."

Hoppe hopes the Sebewaing Sportsman's Club Dance will catch on — and members may consider having one every month.

"It would be great not having to drive so far," she says, "And I'm sure they would have little trouble filling the place up."

"I, along with countless other kids in the area, remember the Sportsman's Club as being 'the dance hall,'" she adds.

# Neighbors pitch in after McCain fire

A Bay Port business was destroyed by fire on Sunday, May 7, but is fast rising again.

Buildings used by Jack McCain Plumbing and Heating on Weale Road were engulfed in flames when fire fighters arrived at 4:45 p.m. Sunday evening, according to Fire Chief Ralph Forman of the Fairhaven Township Fire Department.

The fire started in a 40 ft. by 60 ft. metal building used by McCain for his business, destroying his office, materials and equipment. Damage estimates exceeded \$200,000.

Dawn McCain said insurance would cover the costs of replacing the building, but that the contents of the building may not be fully covered.

The building site has already been cleaned up and a new one is being erected and should be ready to move into this week.

The business was still operating immediately after the fire, as owners of other local plumbing and heating businesses offered the use of their tools and storage space, she said. McCain's fleet of trucks was not damaged in the fire.

"We've had so much help from our church and our neighbors and the people we do business with," Dawn McCain said. "Numerous people have offered to help."

"After the insurance adjuster was here, we felt so downtrodden, but we had so

much help that we decided to rebuild it as it was and go on with the business."

Friends and members of Pigeon River Mennonite Church, which the McCains attend, were on the scene to help with cleanup and started the rebuilding project as soon as the insurance adjusters gave the word.

Many are self-employed who were able to spare some time to help, while others were farmers who couldn't do field work because of wet fields. Perry Collins, who was the project manager of the Country Bay Village project, is overseeing the work of rebuilding McCain's shed.

ceeding cautiously. The public said show us some figures, some cost comparisons and that's what we're doing."

The Board will meet with the architects on Thursday, May 25 to get a better picture of the costs of a new building. The cost of a new building near the secondary complex on Pigeon Road would include parking lot improvements, land acquisition and improvements that would enhance education, Drury said.

"If we want to renovate the buildings, we want to look darn close to what a new building would be," Drury said.

After school officials have a chance to compare renovation to new construction, district residents will be surveyed.

Three choices await school officials and taxpayers, Drury said:

- The schools can be renovated, which would be less disruptive to the tradition of the villages, and there would be no worry about finding alternate uses for the buildings.
- In contrast, a new building would be maintenance-free for about 20 years, and would offer some significant educational advantages.
- But if neither of those options is chosen, then the district would still have to spend money to repair the four buildings.

"Doing nothing is the least costly option, but it's not cost-free," Drury said. "We've still got to do roof work and parking lots and we still have to address handicapped accessibility."

"If we do renovate, it will be a complete renovation. It will be more than just paint on the walls."

The Laker Board also agreed to take part in the regional Thumb Area Television network to be broadcast from the Regional Educational Media Center in Cass City. The network would provide two channels of programming to all schools in Huron, Tuscola and Sanilac counties. Local residents served by cable would also be able to receive the programming.

Orville Snider will be the speaker at commencement exercises on May 28. Snider served in the Laker District for many years, and was most recently the principal of Laker High School.

In other business, the Laker Board:

- Appointed Hulda Baur, Olga Penn, Orville Snider and Phyllis Tamblin as inspectors in the school election on June 6.
- Approved a request from Pigeon kindergarten teacher Jeanne Swartzendruber to move to a half-time position. Because of that request, Annette Salsburey, who was pink-slipped last month because of staffing needs, will be called back to a half-time position. Swartzendruber was instrumental in setting up the developmental kindergarten program last year, and now wants to spend more time with her family.

## Caseville fees to rise

Fees for building permits are going to go up in Caseville, after the Village Council acted on the recommendation of building inspector and zoning administrator Joseph Cilc to raise those fees.

Permits for sheds, decks and porches will primarily be affected, according to Village Controller Pam Damore, and they will be more in line with the costs of permits in surrounding communities.

## USA School Board discusses ag class

Members of the USA Ag Council attended Monday night's USA School Board meeting to have some questions answered.

Council members had been circulating a petition to protect the school's ag program from suffering budgetary cuts.

"Basically, they came to the meeting with bad information," Board President Ray Bauer said.

"They had heard the day program may be cut out, and the teacher would have to move from room to room rather than have his own agriculture room."

The Board listened to the Council's concerns, and later passed a resolution to limit the Summer Ag Program to 20 days, as opposed to the 40-day program which is now in existence. At a previous board meeting, the day program had been cut from five to three classes.

The Board also accepted Early Retirement Incentive applications from custodian Jerry Edler, teachers Marshall Lupp and Martha Schmidt.

In the agreement, each teacher is entitled to a buy-out of \$10,000 for the first year, and \$8,000 for the next two years, while support personnel will receive \$5,000 the first year and \$4,000 for the next two years.

The incentive is a cost-saving program for the Board of Education, as they will have the option to either fill the position with someone at the bottom of the pay scale, or not fill the position at all.

In other action, the USA Board:

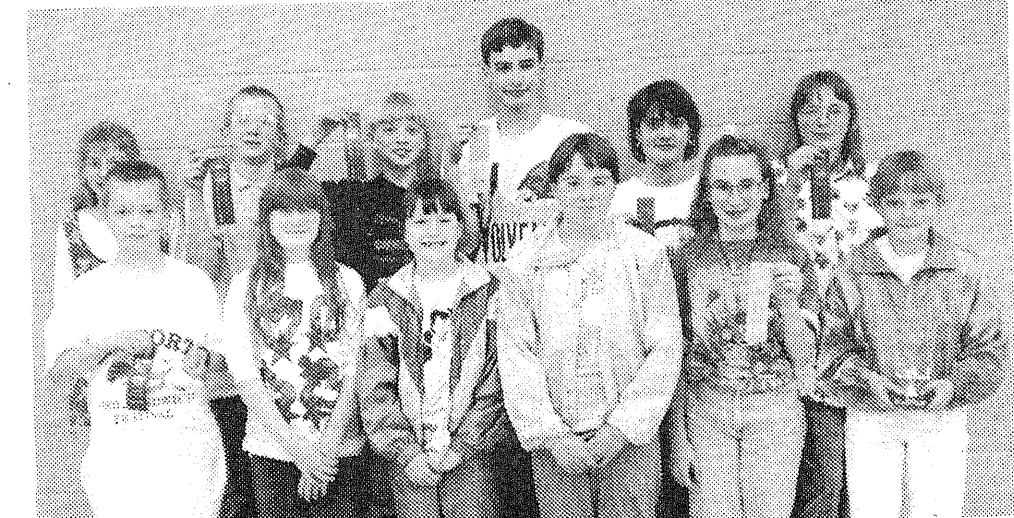
- granted Libby Treiber a maternity leave of absence.
- granted Dave McCoy a one year leave of absence to teach at Saginaw Valley State University.
- ratified a two-year contract with the Unionville-Sebewaing Teacher's Association.
- endorsed the Thumb Area TV to operate through REMC.
- passed a resolution to allow out of district students to ride USA buses to parochial schools in the district at no cost.
- decided not to pick up any students in the village limits except at the designated pick up points.
- decided to extend the present insurance package for one year due to the new construction.

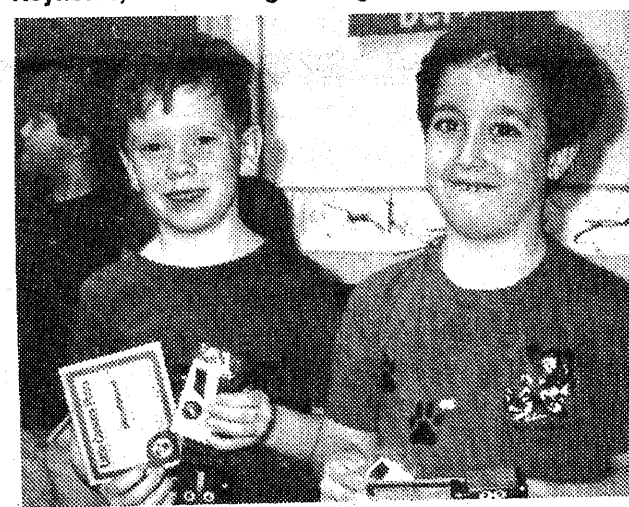

I tossed my hat in the vicinity, strolled across the power line clearing and whistled to Sweetwife.

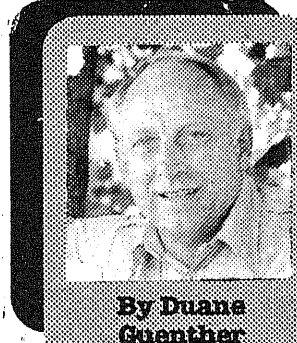
"Did you find one?" she questioned tentatively.

It was black in color, they're the early variety and we both squatted to drink in the comparison of the color to the nearby debris so we could imbibe the sight on our mushroom-hunting minds. It was the first specimen of the morning and we hoped it wouldn't be the last.

Morel hunting is a simple, inexpensive sport with a rich reward, providing you know what you're doing. It can also be a dangerous sport for the careless or foolhardy.

You don't need much equipment. Some comfort-

able clothes, a good pair of walking shoes or boots, and an old onion sack will do just fine.

The reason for the clothes and shoes are obvious, and the onion sack will carry your morels — if you find any. You could use a paper bag if you like, but never use a plastic sack. Morels packed in airtight plastic will spoil very rapidly.

Most knowledgeable morel hunters prefer the onion sack, or some other type of net bag. Morels have spores which tend to fall through the holes in the sack and make plenty of little morels for the next season.

If you have never hunted morels before, it would be a good choice to have an expert take you out for the first few times to make sure you are picking the right kind of mushroom.

Morels are one of the easiest of all the mushrooms to identify. All species of morchella (morels) found in Michigan have two characteristics in common — their

caps are pitted with little hollows and when you slice them in half, both the stem and the cap are hollow.

They flourish in a warm, wet spring, and sometimes will have a complete crop failure if the weather is too cold, and/or too dry.

As the title of this article suggests, you find them wherever they are. There really aren't any iron-clad time or spots, but if you follow some general rules you may have better luck.

**Morel hunting** time usually correlates with Mother's Day, or when lilac leaves are the size of a mouse ear. Have you ever been that close to a mouse lately?

You tend to find them at the base of aspen trees, dead elms, or other decayed hardwood stumps.

Since they are hard to spot, it helps if you bend over and scan the forest floor from a lower elevation. Brownish objects poking up from the scattered debris may well be a morel. However, it could, and usually is, a stick, stone, or root.

If you find some, don't pull them up but rather snip the stem close to the root. Experts say they propagate from the remains left in the ground as well as the spores dropped through the holes in the bag.

After getting them home, slice them in half and shake out any bugs which may have made the morel its home. Try not to wash them unless absolutely necessary. Morels are like a sponge and will soak up water spoiling the taste.

**Fry them** in butter, sautéed for a few minutes on a side and serve immediately.

The day before Sweetwife and I had headed up north on our first forage trip of the year, I chanced to play golf at a favorite course along Saginaw Bay.

Funds to rent the gym and purchase the senior gifts have been raised, she adds.

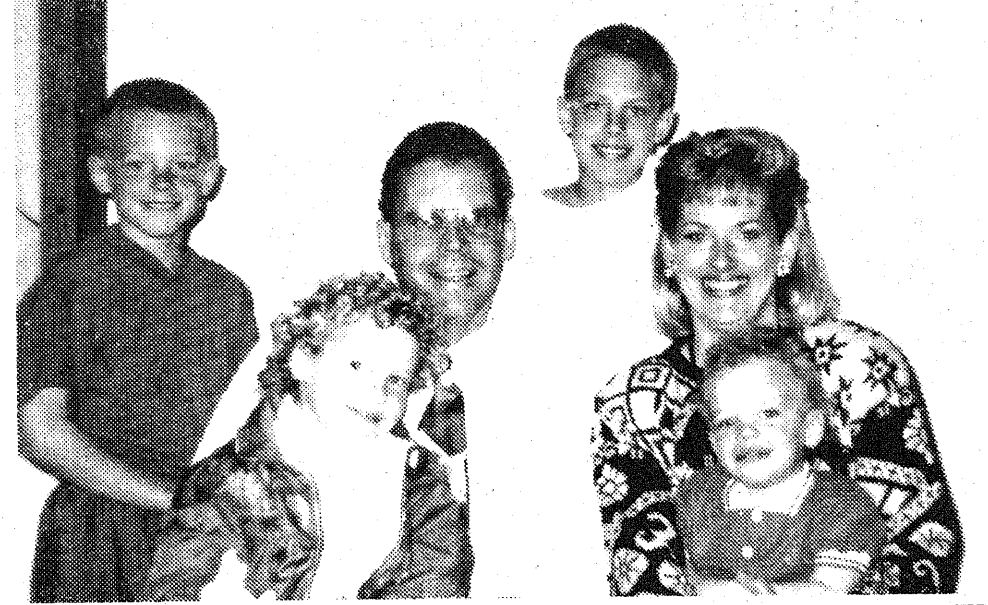
"This will help us focus on our future, to help encourage the Class of '95 and to pray for each of us, as we embark on this new chapter of our lives," Gascho adds.

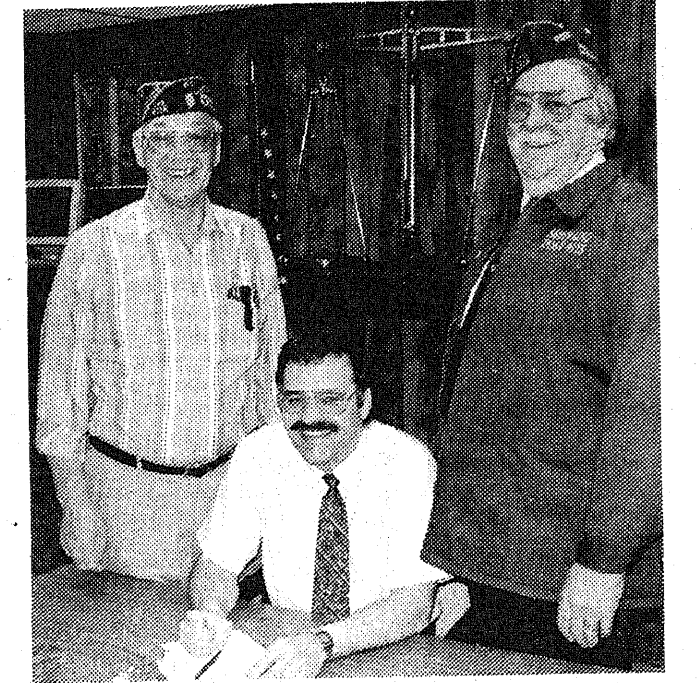

According to Riverside Office Manager Eunice Thorp, Hill is offering a \$50 savings bond to the student whose

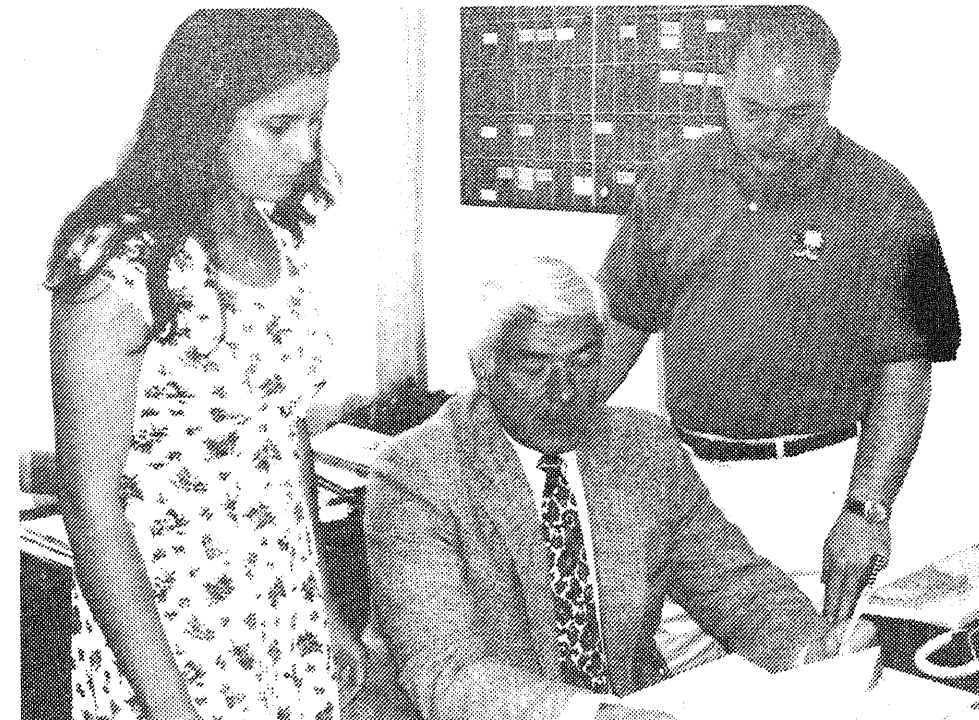
