This weekend is Bay Port's time to shine!

Only one festival in Michigan can lay claim to the largest sandwiches on earth — and organizers of the Bay Port Fish Sandwich Festival do just that, as often as they can.

And the fish sandwiches, made with Henry Englehard's special secret batter recipe, are big enough that it takes two hands to eat them.

They're famous all over Michigan, with visitors making plans a year in advance to come to Bay Port the first weekend in August for a sandwich or two and some great entertainment.

Sponsored by the Bay Port Chamber of Commerce in cooperation with hundreds of volunteers, the festival is the "biggest single eating event in the Upper Thumb."

Over 9,000 sandwiches have been served at recent festivals, and this year, organizers hope to top all records.

This year's festival is planned this Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-6, at B.C. McLeish Memorial Park in Bay Port, just off M-25.

In addition to the famous sandwiches, organizers have planned two days of fun for visitors.

The giant arts and crafts fair runs both days of the festival, with crafters coming from all over Michigan to sell and display their wares. And both days, fish sandwiches will be sold from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. under the big tent.

On Saturday, the day begins at 9 a.m. when the arts and crafts booths open, along with the Fair Haven Township Fire Department Auxiliary Refreshment Wagon. The Bay Port RLDS and Bay Port United Methodist Churches will have bake sales and the Huron County Sheriff's Drug Awareness Trailer opens.

The Grand Parade steps off at 10:30 a.m., immediately followed by the crowning of Miss Bay Port and the Prince and Princess.

Later, the Bay Port United Methodist Church will have

ice cream sundaes, while the Bay Port Historical Society and the Little League will sell raffle tickets.

At noon, the firemen will host bingo until 6 p.m. and the winners of the Beautiful Baby Contest will be announced.

And don't forget — singer, entertainer and impersonator Jonathan Stars is making a return appearance in Bay Port.

He's been voted the Comedian of the Year in the Las Vegas Comedy Competition and the Best One-Man Show in the World by the Las Vegas Sun. He's also made appearances in festivals and events all over the country.

The Lip Sync contest gets underway at 1 p.m., along with the Little League Dunk Tank and the Children's Games. They'll be followed by a performance by dancers from Sherry's Dance Studio.

Stars will again entertain the crowd at 3 p.m., followed an hour later by the Lake Huron Chorus of Sweet Adelines International.

Local singer Brian Alexander will round out the afternoon at 5 p.m., offering several types of unique song

stylings.

On Sunday, the fish sandwich sales continue, along with the arts and crafts fair and the bingo. At 12:30 p.m., Chautauqua Express with singer Guy Sferiazza will entertain and at 1:30, the group

Kristen will take the stage.

The winners of the Historical Society raffle will be announced before Karaoke by C & D Entertainment begins at 4 p.m., and following the karaoke, the Little League raffle winners will be announced.

Post Office offers special cancellation

The Bay Port Post Office will hold a temporary Postal Station at the Fish Sandwich Festival this Saturday and

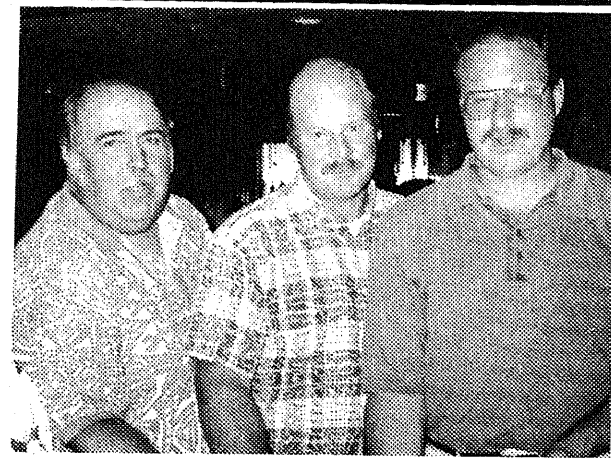
Sunday, Aug. 5 and 6 - with an official stamp cancellation available to commemorate the event.

The station will be open on Saturday from 12:30 to 5 p.m. and on Sunday from 12 noon to 5 p.m.

The one-of-a-kind rubber stamp is specially ordered with the festival date and logo, according to Bay Port Postmaster Laura Scharich. The imprint is available for first class postage, envelopes and post cards.

Other postal services available at the Festival will include general stamp sales and coloring books.

Collectors may send for these imprints for up to 60 days after the event, by sending uncancelled stamped envelopes or post cards along with a self-addressed envelope for their return after the imprint is applied.

Notice of Public Hearing on Increasing Property Taxes

The Township Board of the Fair Haven Township will hold a public hearing on a proposed increase of 0.5206 mills in the operating tax millage rate to be levied in 1995.

The hearing will be held on Thursday, August 10, 1995 at 8:00 p.m. at Fair Haven Township Hall, 764 Hall St., Bay Port, MI.

The date and location of the meeting to take action on the proposed additional millage will be announced at this public meeting.

If adopted, the proposed additional millage will increase operating revenues from ad valorem property taxes 7.95% over such revenues generated by levies permitted without holding a hearing. If the proposed additional millage rate is not approved the operating revenue will increase by 0.93% over the preceding year's operating revenue.

The taxing unit publishing this notice, and identified below, has complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied from within its authorized millage rate.

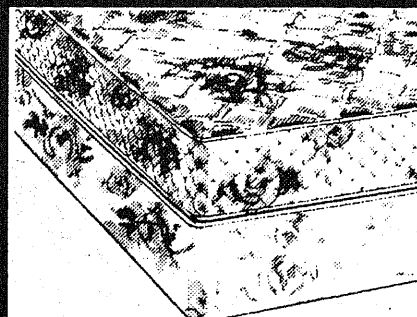

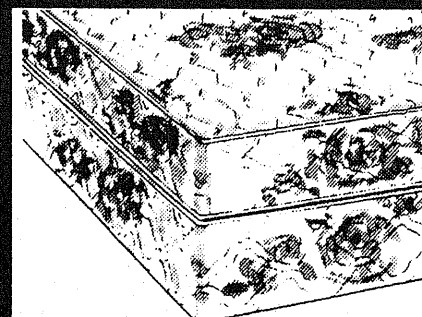

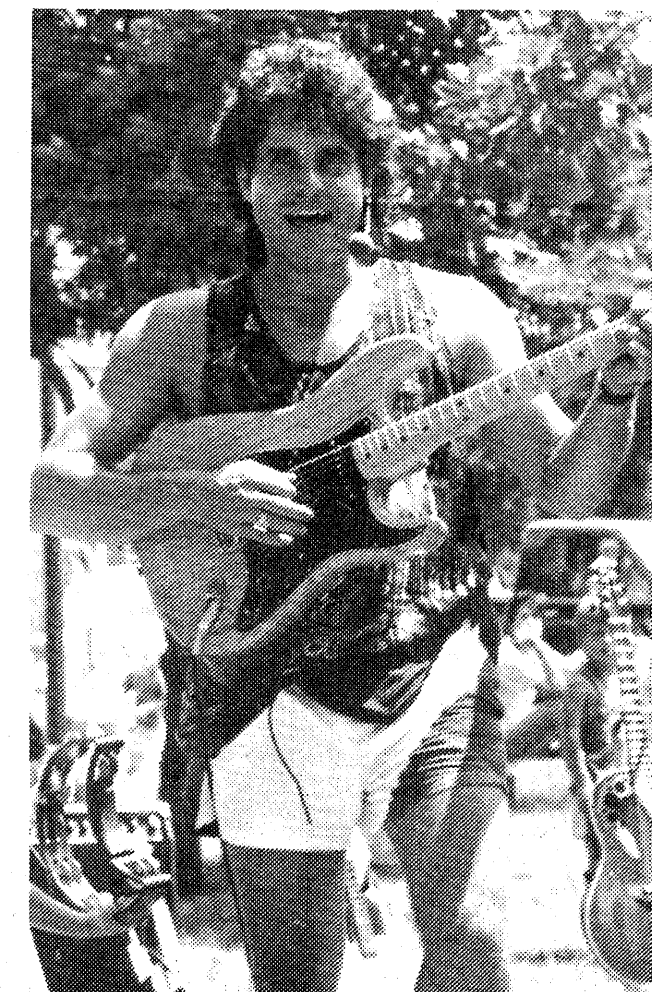

BT-YFC has great auction

How would you like to pay about \$45 for a slice of pie? That was the "going rate" when Dave McCormick's whole Peanut Butter Pie — baked in the "Katie Albrecht Tradition" — went for \$350 at last Saturday's Bluewater Thumb Youth for Christ Auction.

The generosity of bidders who attended this popular event contributed to the record bottom line of this year's auction — which netted well over \$40,000, according to BT-YFC Director Ken Smeader.

"Everything was up," he says. "People were tremendously generous."

A number of large-ticket items donated also helped contribute to this year's success. Out of 20-plus donated quilts, four of them brought in over \$1,000 apiece.

The largest donation of \$2,900 came in for a 1986 Oldsmobile donated by Marty and Chris Caverly of Sand Point, painted by Keith Stalter.

Bringing up a close second was a piece of playground

equipment, whose construction was directed by Tom Beachy. His church, Pigeon River Mennonite, went the extra mile, donating over \$2,000, to take that equipment home for use by their congregation's children.

Other large donations came in for the L.J. Gascho Furniture dining room set, a number of sports packages — including six Detroit Lions tickets on the 35-yard line that went for a whopping \$900 and the traditional auction shed built by Dwight Gascho and crew in a record eight hours.

"Quilt fever" ran high all day, especially when a coverlet made by Lucinda Eichler, a resident of Country Bay Village before her death, went up on the auction block and her daughter and another lady who had sentimental reasons for wanting that quilt bid "neck and neck" and kept the bids high.

Eichler's daughter did end up with the quilt and there wasn't a dry eye in the house when Barbie Brooks of Country Bay Village explained the

meaning that quilt had for Eichler's children and grandchildren.

Handling all the auction details for the 350-plus bidders were R. Dale Wertz of Great Lakes Auction and Herb Albrecht of Albrecht Auction Service.

"Some people save all year around for this auction," explains Smeader. "Many of the people who make large bids are of no greater financial means than you or I, but they make the auction a priority and save for it all year."

He also credits the large number of volunteers for the success of this auction.

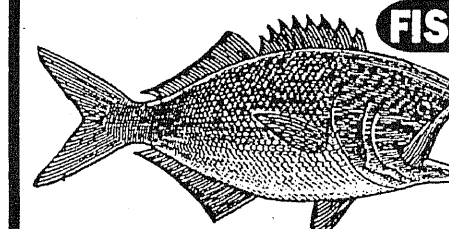
New this year were Friday night events that kicked off Saturday's auction fever a day ahead. Local Christian musical group "One Accord" played to a full house at the Pigeon Band Shell after over 300 enjoyed a meal of homegrown bean soup and homemade fruit pies.

"People stayed around 'til 10:30 in the evening just visiting and enjoying themselves," says Smeader. "It's a tradition we started this year we hope to continue."

Bay Port is new home for Scheurer's Dr. Scott Reiter

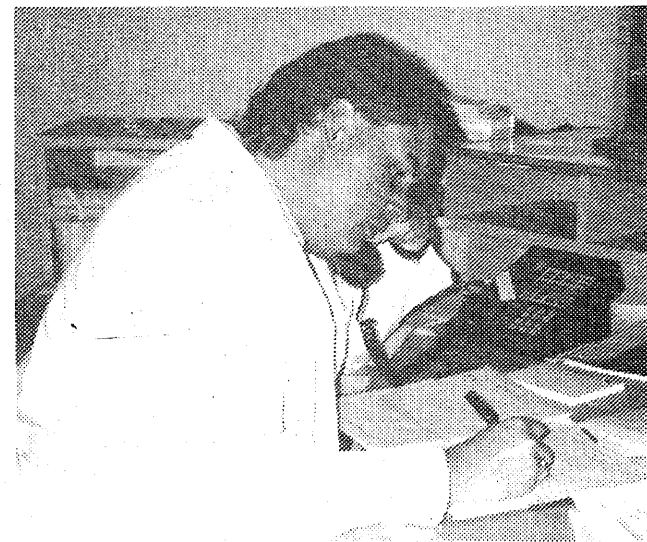
