## A REQUEST.

Will the Common Council of the village of Manchester please answer the following questions for the benefit of the tax payers of said village, and oblige?  
First. Why did you go to the expense of printing the Charter and By-Laws in pamphlet form, when none of its by-laws had been enforced, and have not since?  
Second. Why is it that cattle, other than milk cows, are permitted to run at large in the streets of said village, contrary to Section 3 of By-Laws VI, and milk cows to run at large during the night, and in the tax-payers' gardens?  
Third. Why is not By-Law III enforced?  
Fourth. Why are not our streets kept clean?  
Fifth. Why does not the Marshal enforce the By-Laws of said village, as he is required by By-Law XV?  
Sixth. For what purpose is the Marshal paid his bills whenever presented, without an explanation for what the money is paid?  
Seventh. Why is it that the people are compelled to pay taxes and receive no benefit or protection from the authorities to whom they pay their taxes; and so on to and including almost every provision of the Charter and By-Laws?  
It is a notorious fact that the people have no protection from the corporation: cows are permitted to run at large night and in gardens, and the Marshal gives no notice when so informed; men get drunk and run the streets without interference, and if by chance he be arrested, he is allowed to go when he gets sober without being brought before the court and fined, and the fine collected to help pay expenses, and still the Marshal gets his pay for making such arrests. Our streets are not kept clean; the saloons are not kept closed after 10 o'clock P. M., or on Sunday, etc.  
It really seems from the monthly report of the meetings of said Council, that all they do is to audit the Marshal's account, and vote an order on the Treasurer for the same. Is it to be a second Tammany?

## COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

Manchester, Aug. 27th, 1872.  
Common Council met in regular session. The President being absent the meeting was called to order by David G. Rose, chosen chairman pro tem.  
Roll called, members present Case, Carr, Ottmar and Rose.  
The proceedings of last meeting read and approved as amended.  
The Street committee report on the petition to open Jefferson street, they report favorable to the request of the petitioners, thereupon it is resolved and ordered by the Common Council of the village of Manchester that the Detroit, Hillsdale and Indiana Railroad company be notified and ordered to put in a suitable crossing where the said railroad crosses Jefferson street in the Village of Manchester.  
A bill was presented and allowed in favor of J. L. Mitchell for taking the grades of streets and side-walks, bill, twenty-two dollars and sixty cents, an order drawn.  
The resolution passed May 7th, to have two hundred copies of the Charter and By-Laws printed, was rescinded and a resolution passed to have one hundred copies printed.  
No further business the meeting adjourned.
