The following embodies the main features of Sec. 7 of the liquor law passed by the Legislature.

Section one provides that in all towns, cities and villages of this State there shall be annually levied and collected the following tax upon the business of manufacturing, selling or keeping for sale distilled or malt liquors, as follows:
