Elliott, of Grand Rapids, and Mr. Wilcox, of Genesee county, Mich., highly commended it, and it was introduced into this State by Prof. Cook of Lansing. In texture, juiciness, flavor, beauty, and whiteness of flesh, it exceeds the well known Snow (Fameuse). The tree is a strong, upright grower; fruit matures in October and keeps till February. Although this can hardly be called a new variety, yet the flattering reports we have from a number of local growers, strongly indicate it to our minds to be the coming apple.
