

Washington. The plan proposed is that all publications claiming to be rated as second class matter shall be submitted to the department by samples quarterly or semi-annually for examination, and if found to be matter exclusively in print, issued from a regular publication office, designed for public use and devoted to the publication and discussion of current news and topics of general interest or specific, shall be admitted to that classification at the rate of one dollar for each publication to the privileged rates of two or three cents per pound, according to frequency of issue, the same as are now charged for regular newspapers, magazines, etc.

United States Marshal Toussaint, of Arkansas, has made a successful raid on the gang of illicit distillers operating along the Missouri line. Deputy Marshal Woodard, in charge of a posse, captured two stills, destroyed a large amount of mash, beer, and raw whisky, and arrested six persons, while on the way to Opposition, in sharp prisoners under guard, preparatory to making other arrests.
