THE MERINO SHEEP.

A paper read before the Farmers' Institute, at Grand Rapids, on May 15th, 1878, by Chas. M. Feltner.

Flocks and herds have been a source of revenue from time immemorial. The sheep, however, is a creature that is still indebted to those at the East, who began from there, importing, retaining their pure blood, and always being supplied by the noted flock of the purchase of one of Col. Humphrey, in 1818. By careful breeding he developed one of the finest flocks, if not the finest flock of the world. This flock was nearly supplied by the term "Awood," by which name they are at present known. During his life he sold what proved to be the foundation of several valuable flocks, among which we might mention the "Hammond flock" and the "Sanford flock." In one of Mr. Atwood's last writings, speaking of his importations in sheep, he says, "I have sought to accomplish that important object, namely, to obtain a good constitution, with quantity and quality of wool." He states that his success has at last been satisfactory to himself.

While Atwood bred and disseminated the Infanta, Robison, Kirk, and others bred and disseminated the Fawn, from the Jarvis importations; other successful breeders have combined the two, keeping the breed (Merino) distinct but using the two classes.

The improvement of sheep of this kind, by crossing with the Infanta, is due to the introduction of the pure-bred. This is the standard, and the nearer we approach it the better. Some of our own members when the sheep of this State were not on average four per head, but now they are about eight per head, and seven pounds washed wool is hardly worth the raising.

A few years ago pure Merino sheep were sold at fabulous prices. \$1000, \$2000 and \$3000 being paid for three different sheep brought to this State, yet we do not know what the owners made of them, nor how they were disposed of. But now they can be purchased with the means of most any farmer; and the sheep who neglect to make good selections for the improvement of his stock, neglect his own best interests.

Hood, constitution, form and fleece are the principal requisites. Wool and must be the chief source of profit to the farmer, hence a large sheep will succeed where a small one will fail. Some of our own members when the sheep of this State were not on average four per head, but now they are about eight per head, and seven pounds washed wool is hardly worth the raising.

Our New England Yankees were not behind in this matter. The first sheep imported from Spain to this country were clandestinely obtained or smuggled through the port of Cadiz, by William Foster, of Boston, Mass. He imported three Merino sheep (two ewes and a ram) in 1783; these he gave to Mr. Craig, of Conn., who, not knowing their value, killed and roasted them.

Mr. Craig afterwards sold them to Mr. Jarvis, who imported in 1801 a pair of Merino sheep, which were taken to his farm in Zanesville, Ohio. Mr. Dupont, of Delaware, secured one the same year.
