SYRUP

THE SPIDER.

The intelligence and power evinced by the spider in securing its prey has often attracted attention; but we have seldom heard of so remarkable a display of these faculties as we witnessed a short time since. A small-sized spider had made his web on the under side of a table. Early one morning, a cockrosch was noticed on the floor, directly under the web, and, on approaching to take it away, it was found that the spider had site leg of the cockrosch. The spider then went up to his web, but instantly came down and fastened a line to another leg, and continued for several minutes darting down and fastening lines to different parts of the body of his victim. The struggles of the cockroach (though full-grown one) were unavailing to effect his escape—he could not break his bonds, and his efforts seemed only to entangle him the more. As his struggles became more and more feeble, the nearly exhausted the spider proceeded to raise him from the floor. He at first

raised the head and forward part of the body nearly half an inch; then raised the other end; and so continued to work, till the cockroach was elevated five or six inches from the floor. Thus, "hong n chains," the victim was left to die. The spider was, as before remarked, a small one, and could not have been more than a tenth of the weight of his prey. 
