Frail Prospects. About the first of August Secretary Garfield of the state horticultural society forwarded 100 postal cards to prominent fruit growers of our state, requesting them to return the percentage of the average crop produced by orchards and vineyards, for this season.

Only one correspondent in his reply gave the apple crop at full average; 84 placed it at less than one-quarter of a crop, while 50 reported it at one-half, and 75 at three-fourths of an average yield.

Peas will do better and promise a fair yield, there being less blight-sickness than in previous years. Peaches, although in some localities a complete failure, will yield over one-half a crop.

It is said that the plum crop will be very good, where present effort has been made to fight the curculio. Grapes will be the most prolific fruit this year if the season is prolonged sufficiently to ripen them.

The condition of farms through May caused almost a complete failure of apples. The varieties that seem to have withstood the cold the best, are the Baldwin and Golden Russet. While many of the favorites for winter selling will scarcely be in market at all, and the few that are left will be reduced to a minimum.

Sheep Notes. E. O. Weinst of Adrian bought 1,000 sheep in the vicinity of Trenchmouth last week, which he shipped to Texas. J. G. English of Manchester sold to Burling & Freeman on Monday a flock of 100 ewes which averaged over 120 pounds per head. He received \$8 per head for them.

A correspondent in the Scientific American in speaking of the general belief that bees destroy grapes and other fruit says that he has been testing the truth of the statement, and finds that although they will certainly feed on some fruit, they will not molest it unless it has been injured sufficiently to show an exudation of juice. He says that "the splitting of the grapes, injury by insects and birds, are the causes that render grapes liable to attack by bees. And when we reflect that the berries soon injured would decay, it will be seen that the bee actually saves us, by what would otherwise be lost, by stopping it up as booty."
