Michigan Crop Report October 1. The returns from threshings up to September 27, show an average of 16 and 82-hundredths bushels of wheat per acre in the southern four tiers of counties, and of 11 and 87-hundredths bushels per acre in the northern counties. These figures indicate a total yield in the state of 25,591,512 bushels. This is 19,172 bushels less than the September estimate.

The opportunities for social intercourse and aid are multiplied by just so much, and so great is the advantage of this that some political economists have suggested that the rural population should bring their residences together into small villages, claiming that the advantages gained would more than compensate for the lost time, labor and inconvenience of going a long way to work.
