When he presented the note payment was refused and Mr. Chase having the defense argued that it was against public policy to enforce the collection of the note, but the court instructed the jury to render a verdict of \$200.25, the full amount of principal and interest. The case attracted much attention and will be taken as a test case to the supreme court.

The removal of the brakemen on the Monroe and Jackson branches of the Lake Shore railroad, has created considerable talk among employees of the corporation and others. People in the employ of the company say that this action is in direct violation of a law of this state, and that the Lake Shore can legally be compelled to provide the services of brakemen, or pay a severe penalty for this violation of the statutes of Michigan.

The shearing was very interesting and well attended by sleep growers throughout the county.
