Herman Gieske was born in Schale, Germany December 27, 1829. Came to America and located in Illinois in 1853, when he married Catharine Schlicht and came to Michigan the following year, stopping in Freedom one year when they moved upon the farm in this township on which he has since lived. He joined the M. E. church in Freedom in 1854. In 1870 his wife died and in 1871 he was married to Miss Anna Oldenlaga, of Sylvan, who survives him. He had six children by his first wife, five boys and one girl, and one son by his second wife. He was one of the foremost in building the brick church at Row's Corners, in Sharon, and was always a prominent member of the society. He has been in poor health for many years with neuralgia, but last winter he was taken with the disease which caused his death.
