Now, for the benefit of those who believe they may have been deceived by a well, let me suggest a very simple and effective remedy, learned by long experience as a miner. Three into the hole three or four bucketsful of fresh water, after which a lighted candle is lowered, and if the candle continues to burn your well is free from carbonic acid gas; but if the candle becomes extinguished, stay out of the well. The water thrown in will get out in 100, force out the poisonous gas. This is the process universally adopted by miners, and I suggest it to you in hopes that it may do somebody good, and possibly be the cause of saving human life.

When the Jackson, Lansing & Saginaw R. Co. was granted a charter, it was held by so many alternate states of mind and there was at that time not enough confidence in the company to satisfy the Michigan legislature, which allowed to select such lands as they desired south of Jackson. Among that selected was one tract of land on the line between East River and Devil's Lakes, and an attorney has been employed to look up the claims and see what can be secured on them. It is claimed as in the hands of one or more parties, it is a valuable opportunity for securing land which will water the stock.

Farming is made easy by machinery, but on account of the neglect of machinery and consequent waste, it is expensive. It is claimed that farm machineries are used up three times as fast by neglect as by use. For example an agent for silk reaper sold one to a neighbor, and from the same lot a drive into his own use. The agent's was carefully housed and cared for. His neighbor was neglected, allowed to stand out in the storms and sunbaked. At the end of four years the neighbor's had become an empty shell as to practically useless, and he came to agent to buy a new one. The latter had no more on hand, but said to the man that he would sell him one as good as his, at a price below the regular price, that it was as good as new, had been carefully cared for, and his own bought it.

We think it was Ernst Wagner who, in his 'General Pathology,' dwelt particularly on the preservation of the sense of hearing in many cases long after the apparent occurrence of unconsciousness, and who tenderly cautioned his readers that this possibility should be borne in mind.

TRYING TO CAPTURE CARLOTTA.

A Mexican General's Story of His Attempt to Take the Empress Prisoner. In 1857 I was coming from the City of Mexico to El Paso, Tex., and by chance met Gen. Anallaza, who is now a member of the national congress in the City of Mexico. We began to talk of the movements of the country and on other topics. When we passed the City of Queretaro, where Maximilian was made prisoner, I mentioned the incident about the Empress Carlotta in 1866, and he said: 'Yes, it was I who made the attempt to capture her.'

'You may remember,' he said, 'the decree of Oct. 3, 1865, issued by Maximilian and his ministers, and which read: 'Every Mexican caught with any weapon in his hands shall be considered a bandit and shall be executed immediately.' It is said that Maximilian himself was opposed to this decree, but, influenced by Bazaine and the Empress, it was promulgated. I was not one of our soldiers and the best of our generals. In May of 1866 the well known and perhaps the best of our guerrillas, Nicolas Romero, was taken prisoner in Jalisco and brought to the City of Mexico, where, together with others, he was to be shot on the 6th of June. I had a great regard for this man, brave in battle and merciful with his prisoners, and I resolved at the risk of my life, to save him. I was commanding 1,000 men, my headquarters were the Mount of San Juan, which you know is not far from the capital; I chose sixty of my bravest men, and, favored by the darkness of the night of the 5th of June, I led them through the forests of the road connecting the castle of Chapultepec with the capital. I had my men and myself in a small river along the road. I know the empire, had I gone between the hours of 6 and 7 in the morning, as she was accustomed to take a ride every morning at that hour from the city to the castle. My intention was to capture her, and by doing that I was sure to rescue my great friend, and I also knew she had with her ten or twelve men, but I had six times that number, and what gave me confidence was they did not expect such an attack.

I was about to catch the tail of her horse, but by that time I was at the gate of the city, and before 200 or more French soldiers, who were dumfstruck at the sight of their empress passing like lightning between them. The captain commanding this body of soldiers was Boulanger? I took advantage of their surprise and returned to my men. The empress owed her life to the beautiful mare. Indeed, that mare led my horse and saved her mistress. When I reached the place where my men were, all the French soldiers, with the exception of one, the captain, were lying on the road, some killed, others wounded, and a woman was lying also on a zerape of one of my soldiers. I told the captain to take care of his companions and the woman, and ordered my soldiers to retreat to the Mount of San Juan. I was unsuccessful, but even now I feel considerable of having done all in my power to rescue a dear friend.

The general was so affected that I did not pass the subject any further.—C. Olivares in Cincinnati Commercial Gazette.
