Subscribe for the ENTERPRISE. The grand hunt comes off to-morrow. Some fine black bass are being caught in the river now. Gus Middlebrook, of Clinton, was visiting friends in town this week. The pumpkin crop was a light one this year, and a pumpkin pie is a rarity. The juvenile temperance school met at the universalist church last Sunday afternoon. The Boston Ideal Uncle Tom's Cabin Co., will appear at Goodyear Hall Friday evening. The Presbyterian ladies' society will meet at the church parlors next Thursday afternoon. The I. O. G. T. will give a social at the residence of Mrs. W. H. Clark on Tuesday evening, Oct. 11. A number of Manchester masons went to Clinton on Tuesday to attend the funeral of George Lazell. Harvey Anthony, who has been living in the M. E. parsonage, will occupy the baptist parsonage hereafter. We were visited by a whopping big frost on Saturday morning. Ice formed to a thickness of a quarter of an inch. Mr. Arthur Case continues to improve in health and strength and there is considerable hope of his getting up again. The boys are gathering all the nuts they can, for they know what pleasure there will be in eating them next winter. Our coal dealers are not able to supply all their customers at once, so they give each a quantity—enough to keep them warm. The excursion to Detroit last Saturday to see the ball game between New York and Detroit, was not very well patronized by our people. There was a good congregation out on Sunday morning to hear Rev. Mr. Pope, the new Methodist preacher. He delivered a fine sermon. "I never rains but it pours, is a true saying regarding amusements. To-night we hear the Whitney Family and to-morrow night Uncle Tom's Cabin. A number of masons from Tecumseh, including the master of the lodge there, came here on Monday to visit Manchester lodge and witness work in the 3rd degree. Apples are coming into the evaporator faster than they can dry them. On Saturday afternoon they had to lay off the parpers in order to let the evaporator catch up. The damp weather retarded the work considerably. The Clark Brothers are building additions on to the front and rear of the Milo Gage house on Ann Arbor street, which has lately been purchased by Goodrich Conklin, who will occupy it as soon as completed. A WORD TO THE PATRONS OF THE Enterprise Office.

My own observations, which are necessarily limited, indicate that average man prefers red first and blue next; and as the shorter wave lengths are approached his interest and power of distinguishing differences become less, and only among the most highly cultivated are the softer shades of color preferred or enjoyed.

Conception as to Colors.

Experiments made by scientific men prove that much dullness of conception as to colors of shorter wave lengths, such as green and blue, exists among rude nations. Some aboriginal tribes of India have the color sense developed only as far as red, their knowledge of yellow, green, blue, being most limited and rudimentary; the unutilized Deities cannot give names to blue and green, and such colors need no names; while the Nubians are very indifferent to colors of middle and shorter wave lengths. The dullness in regard to shorter wave lengths is in sharp contrast to their ease in distinguishing red.
