The roach has been the faithful attendant of humanity ever since written history began. But the abominable extent of this faithful attendant in civilized communities chiefly within recent times.

The roach is, ontologically speaking, an Orthoptera. In plain English he belongs to the grasshopper family. Scientifically he is a blatta orientalis, and has four wings that he doesn't use, and that are absent entirely in the females of most species.

The roach is not as rapid a breeder as many other insects, but it seems to have remarkable success in raising families. The eggs are laid in a little bean-shaped capsule, three-eighths of an inch long and half as wide.

Another kind of roach is officially known as the ectobia Germanica, and is peculiarly fond of Boston, where it is known as the "Boston bug." This insect has got over the nocturnal habits of the ordinary roach.

There are in all some 900 different roaches that have been caught and catalogued. A large section of the world is still to hear from.
