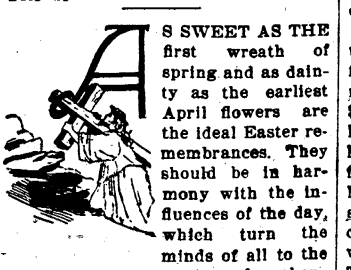

AS SWEET AS THE first wreath of spring and as dainty as the earliest April flowers are the ideal Easter remembrances. They should be in harmony with the influences of the day, which turn the minds of all to the mystery of awakening of life, and at the same time be what charming woman loves to receive, says a New York religious weekly.

Among such things are found exquisitely bound books, small etchings or water colors in ivory frames—also especially appropriate gifts for this season. Collections of poems, whose covers are in delicate shades, with designs which hint at more than they express, are offered at very reasonable prices. One book of verses was clothed in white enamel and silver, with a design in the form of a Greek lamp, whose flame was contorted by the wind of destiny.

For the woman who is fond of dreaming the rare small volumes of essays in quiet grays and unadorned greens, with an ideal head in the form of a cameo on one side.

She who loves to sit at nature's feet and learn wondrous tales from a book which treats of orchids, lilies, or simple wild flowers. One of the books on orchids designed for an Easter gift has a cover of white linen, embroidered with silks in the natural colors of orchids. There are also delightful stories of birds and woods which come in artistic bindings.

The latter come in nearly all shades to match or contrast with the Easter gowns. Some of the most popular this year are in bright red.

Much less expensive and entirely pleasing are the diaries. One is in white and gold cover, with a white pencil, and bearing the inscription "For Happy Thoughts." Small white silk banners, with suitable quotations, are trifles intended to be hung near the bedside, so that proper food for reflection may be furnished for the mind to go to sleep over.

If one has artistic talent she may draw her own designs and make a book of flowers, putting her favorite lines of poetry under each one. One ingenious

young woman has made studies in brown sepia of the child characters in Dickens. Endless opportunities for suitable selections are offered in china. A tiny candlestick to light the path to sweet dreams may be bought for 75 cents or \$1. A beautiful cup from which to sip tea and tell fortunes costs but \$2. A Royal Copenhagen in green and white can be had for \$2.50. Such a gift tied with a violet ribbon, with some violets scattered in the box in which it is sent, is always charming. The china frames for portraits are more expensive; one six inches high, with very delicate Dresden pattern, was marked \$8. Other articles in china are tiny clocks, trays for pens and pins, and ring stands. Some of the letter seals have Dresden handles. Seals finished in white pearl, with a box of wax in "the color she uses" are pleasing. Stationery may be added without causing offence.

Greek lamps in silver are among the novelties. Such a lamp exhibited in one of the prominent stores is said to

be an exact reproduction of the lamps used in Ephesus, one hundred years before Christ. It has the seal of Ephesus upon the top, in the shape of a bee, and in the handle there is a real Roman coin dating back to the time of Caligula, 200 A. D. The price of this lamp is \$8. Silver candlesticks cost \$3 and \$4.

HUNGER AND CANNIBALISM.

The Desire to Eat a 'Yellow-Man' Stronger at Sea Than on Land.

Then it comes to pass when the moment of keenest agony is reached, that the starving man begins to eye his companion with the wolf glare of a beast of prey, says Science for All. His pangs become paroxysmal. During their greatest intensity there springs up within him a fierce impulse to slay his neighbor that he may feed upon his flesh and slake his thirst with his blood. This terrible prompting to cannibalism, it may be noted, is, however, rare, save in cases of famine from shipwreck.

Although it is customary to regard it as a common feature of starvation and to make thrilling statements of the frequency with which even mothers will, under the goad of hunger, kill and eat their children and though startling assertions to this effect have been made by historians of great ages, yet it ought to be said that, as a general rule, well authenticated cases of cannibalism among civilized people will be found to occur only at sea. They are very rarely found on land. And what is more curious still, whenever famished, shipwrecked men set foot on shore, no matter how desolate and barren may be their rock of refuge, they seem as if by magic at once to banish from their minds the very idea of anthropophagy or man-eating and that, too, though they might have been resignedly contemplating it as an imperative necessity a few hours before.

In the case of Ensign Prentiss of the 8th regiment and his companions, who were wrecked on the barren island of Cape Breton in 1780, the difference between famine on shore and on sea is curiously exemplified. Prentiss records that they were able to endure the most fearful pangs of hunger without ever so much as a thought of resorting to cannibalism for relief—so long, however, and only so long as they kept on land. But when they took to their boats—and it was not once merely that they experienced this—in order to escape from their rock-bound prison, though they were not a white word of food that they put to sea, with one accord they began to think of killing and eating one of their number. On the other hand, when they found their attempt to escape futile and put back to shore, whenever they landed the horrible idea of cannibalism seemed to vanish.

STORY OF A CHECK.

Scorched to a Char but Proved to Be Good.

One of the greatest curiosities in the check line has just come to light in this city, says the San Francisco Bulletin. A lady brought it to the Bank of California to be cashed. It was in a paper box, and had to be handled very carefully, for it was two pieces and both were burned to a crisp. There was not a decipherable word on either piece. The lady said that the bits of crisp paper represented a check for \$125, which had been received in a letter. The check, she said, was drawn by the national bank of D. O. Mills of Sacramento. She had removed the letter from the envelope and had thrown the envelope on some live coal in the grate. Upon reading the letter she had found a reference to an inclosure of a check for the sum named and turned to the fire in the grate with some disappointment. The fire had done its work. The crisp paper lay on the coals. She carefully removed the same, placed it in a box and hurried to the Bank of California to get the money before the pieces were further crumpled.

After listening to the story the officers of the bank made a careful examination of the pieces of burnt paper and by the aid of powerful glasses they were able to make out portions of words from the pen impressions made on the paper. There were enough of these lines left to show that "Ella" had been written and part of the word "hundred" was also made out, with two or three letters of the name of the bank. These discoveries corresponded with the story of the lady, and the bank officers then communicated the circumstances to the national bank of D. O. Mills & Co., of Sacramento, and asked for a duplicate check in favor of the lady. This was forwarded and the money was paid. The circumstance disproves the charge about the curiosity of women. Had there been more curiosity about the inclosure of the envelope the trouble would have been avoided. The practical application of the story is to be careful that what you throw into the fire has no further value for you.
