The board of election canvassers finished the re-count of an An Arbor city election Tuesday. Schab gained six votes. A large number of ballots were counted under protest. In the sixteenth or seventeenth 34 ballots were recounted, a number more than sufficient to change the result in favor of the protesters. They have decided to abide by the previous count.
The board of election canvassers completed at noon a recount of the third ward, Ann Arbor city, vote on county clerk. Mr. Schab retained the name. Sheriff Judson and Mr. Lighthall came together this morning, agreed to abide by the previous count. Mr. Lighthall took dinner with Mr. Judson and returned to Clinton leaving the office of sheriff to "Billy" Judson undisturbed. Jackson runs by local time but an effort is being made to adopt standard time.

After two days of argument before the county canvassing board, that body decided in favor of Elmer Kirby as the only register of deeds. On application they will be furnished, and when a deposit is made to cover the expense, the postmaster will telegraph to the postmaster at the letter's destination asking that it be promptly returned.
